It is now necessary that you complete the renewal request form below and return it, using the enclosed self-addressed postage-free envelope, in order that this Office will be informed of your wishes. It is important that you reply promptly, as failure to do so may result in the cancellation of your reservation. It is also important that you notify this Office of any change in your permanent address.

The remarriage of a non-service widow or widower of a deceased serviceman or woman automatically terminates the privilege of interment in a national cemetery. Cancellation of a reservation, except when due to remarriage, does not preclude the privilege of burial in the same grave with the deceased.

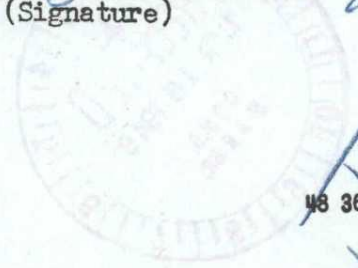

The records of this office show that the following listed grave site has been reserved for you:

Grave No. 14589, Block 26, Sec. C, Ft. Snelling National Cemetery, Minneapolis 9, Minnesota, reserved 22 Nov. 1947, adjoining Grave No. 14590 in which the remains of the late T/4 Donald R. Bradehoft are interred.

New National Cemetery Regulations approved September 1947 provide that written request to continue the reservation of a grave site in a National Cemetery must be submitted every two years from the date of the original reservation, and failure to so renew will result in cancellation of the reservation. Further, that when a widow or widower of a service man or woman remarries, the right to burial in a National Cemetery is forfeited.

Cancellation of an adjoining grave site reservation will not preclude burial of the unremarried spouse in the same grave with the deceased initially interred there.

In order to obtain the necessary information for the files of the National Cemetery, the inclosed form letter is forwarded for your completion.

In the event this information is not received within <sup>30</sup>~~60~~ days from the date of this letter, the grave site reservation will be automatically cancelled.

EXPLANATION OF PART A - CIVILIAN OR PRIVATE CEMETERY

1. When the remains are delivered for interment in a civilian or private cemetery, you are responsible for paying all interment expenses. In this connection, you are entitled to the allowance mentioned in paragraph 2 below.

2. An amount not to exceed \$75 is allowed by the government toward actual interment expenses when final interment of the remains is in a private or civilian cemetery. No allowance is authorized toward interment expenses when interment is in a national or post cemetery.

3. The \$75 maximum allowance by the government toward interment expenses includes but is not limited to the payment of one or more of the following items: hearse hire from the railroad station to your home, the funeral home, church, cemetery, or any other place designated by you; vault; church services; newspaper notices; transportation for friends and relatives to and from cemetery; and the services of a funeral director.

4. Reimbursement by the government is made only to the person who paid from his personal funds the expenses of or incident to interment in a private or civilian cemetery. Receipted bills are not required to accompany this form. Any expenses over and above the \$75 maximum must be borne by the person who incurred or paid the additional expenses.



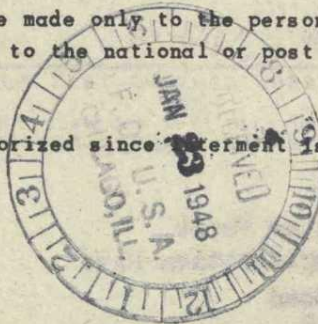
EXPLANATION OF PART B - NATIONAL OR POST CEMETERY

1. When the remains are delivered to you at government expense prior to burial in a national or post cemetery, you are responsible for all additional expenses necessary to deliver the remains from that point to the national or post cemetery grave site. However, you may be entitled to an allowance for the cost of transporting the remains from your home to the national or post cemetery grave site subject to the conditions outlined in paragraph 2. below.

2. Reimbursement of transportation expenses is allowed only when the cost to the government to deliver the remains to you is LESS than what it would have cost the government to deliver the remains direct to the national or post cemetery of final interment. However, the amount which you may be allowed (the difference between cost of delivery to you and cost of delivery by the government direct to the national or post cemetery) may not exceed the amount actually expended by you to deliver the remains to the cemetery grave site. WHETHER OR NOT YOU WILL BE GRANTED AN ALLOWANCE IS DEPENDENT UPON AN AUDIT OF THIS REQUEST. IN ANY EVENT YOU WILL BE NOTIFIED OF ANY ALLOWANCE DUE YOU BY THE OFFICE TO WHICH THIS FORM IS SENT.

3. Reimbursement by the government will be made only to the person who paid from his personal funds for transporting the remains to the national or post cemetery grave site.

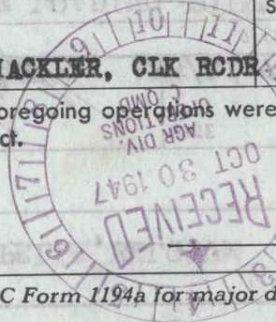
4. No interment expense allowance is authorized since interment is made ultimately in a national or post cemetery.
