Dear Mr. Clark:

The Army Effects Bureau has been informed by the Office of The Quartermaster General, Washington, D. C., regarding the disposal of one Purple Heart medal, identified as personal effects of your brother, Private First Class Riley E. Clark. This item was recovered by the overseas American Graves Registration officer at the time of the interment of your brother.

Due to the circumstances surrounding the recovery of such property, the item was received here in a damaged condition. The medal is chipped and slightly bent, the pin fastener is missing and the ribbon is torn, soiled and has a disagreeable odor. It is my desire to refrain from sending any item which would be distressing; at the same time, I do not feel justified in destroying this item without your consent. If you desire, the damaged medal will be replaced and a new medal sent to you by The Adjutant General's office, Washington 25, D. C. That official has jurisdiction over the award of medals and this Bureau will direct a request on your behalf for the re-issuance of a new medal.

Your reply in this matter may be made on the reverse of this letter and returned in the inclosed self-addressed envelope which requires no postage. Your cooperation will be most helpful.

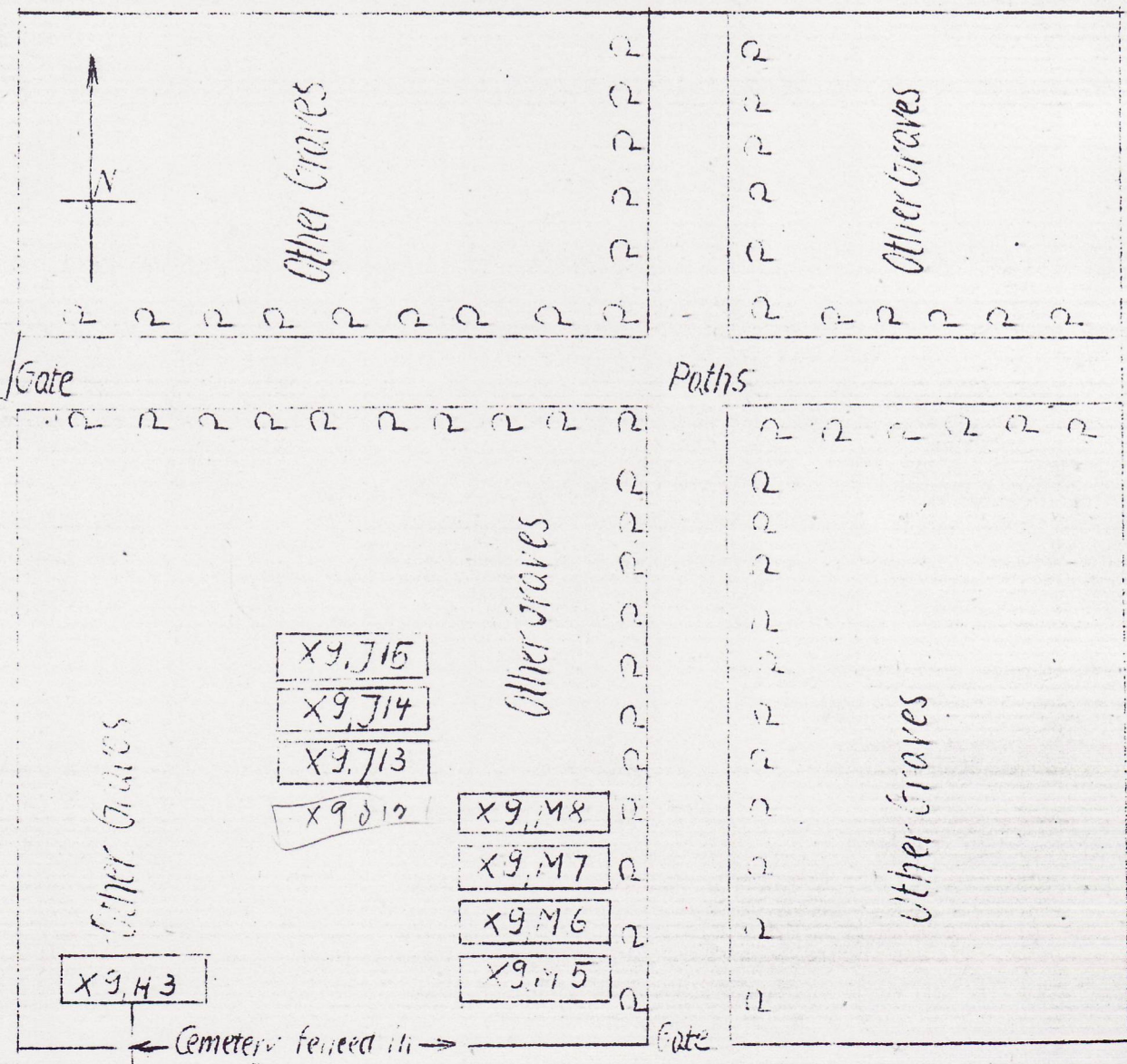

The remains of Pvt. Bernard D. Lorge, 35143329 had been previously evacuated from this cemetery, grave X.9.H.3. by a British TEAM, and when found to be an American was turned over to Hqs. We are evacuating this body as a separate case along with the seven remains from the Trinitatis Cemetery.

The town of Leipzig is also on File for a complete reinvestigation.

NARRATIVE OF DISINTERMENT

Trinitatis Cemetery, Leipzig, Germany

On the 12 August 1947 TEAM 31 disinterred the remains of seven (7) American deceased from the Trinitatis Cemetery of Leipzig, Germany.

Each of the deceased was in a separate single grave, and six of which were marked with crosses. The crosses were marked as follows:

Barlow, George	6.4.45	X 9.J.15

However these crosses must have been placed over the wrong grave for in grave X.9.M.7. which was marked for Carow, William, an identification tag was found on chest of remains. The tag reads Donald R. Ryan, 37533235

In grave X.9.M.6 marked for Archer, Charles, we found two (2) identification tags around the neck of remains. These identification tags read Edwin Akers 35296661.

In grave X.9.J.14. marked for Ryan, Donald, we found the remains with one identification tag which reads George A, Barlow 15335517.

In Grave X.9.J.15 marked for Barlow, we found two (2) identification tags on chest of the remains. On the tags was Charles A. Archer, 34832644.

There was no identification tag on the other three bodies, and due to the incorrect positions of the crosses they will be evacuated as UNKNOWNS. Each of these three unknowns will be given the same three evacuation numbers in hopes that the CIP can establish identification and assign definite numbers.

Personal effects were found with the remains from graves X.9.M.5 and X.9.J. From X.9.J.13 a Purple Heart and wallet was found on remains. From X.9.M.5 a wallet and some pictures were found on the remains.

In Grave X.9.J.12 we found the remains of some unknown deceased. This deceased was without clothing and had a very short body, also had a metal dental plate with gold teeth. It looked as though it might be a midget of some other nationality than American.

Report of Investigation.

LEIPZIG, N 52 / E 21.

3 June 1947 : 1500 hrs., arrive Leipzig central cemetery records office at the South Cemetery. Get extracts of records. Lindenthal and Wahren cemeteries are church-community cemeteries. No records about them here. East cemetery, also called "Trinitatis Friedhof" is the only local community cemetery that contains foreigners.

1545 hrs. Friedhof Lindenthal. Cemetery caretakers Roeder and Hamann told me that the Americans who were buried here already were disinterred by the Americans. No records here. Go to church office, where records are kept.

1600 hrs. Church official Oehme, was contacted at his home near the Lindenthal church. He has his records at his office, so we took him there. From his records I got the following information.

6 American fliers who crashed 24 August 1944, at 1210 hrs. near Lindenthal. Name as follows:

I. Daniel Glove, ASN 0-765649 - T - 42-44

II. Wilbur A. Wilteck, ASN 35872306

These two died through jumping.
