
I have before me your letters of February 18, 1949, and November 12, 1948. You will recall that in the letter dated February 18, 1949, you stated that the remains of one Unknown X-127 interred in the United States Military Cemetery Foy, Belgium, Plot J, Row 9, Grave 212, are those of my son, Pfc. Paul H. Espig. SN 33830727; and also requested that I indicate my desires as to the disposition of the body.

Before returning to you the form "Request for Disposition of Remains", I should like to have one point clarified. In summarizing the evidence of identification in your letter of Fubruary 18, 1949 part d stated that the upper jaw was missing, but that the partial chart compared favorably with Paul's Army dental record and the civilian records. However, in your letter of November 12, 1948, you stated that a dental chart indicating bridgework was included in the burial report. I am certain that Paul's bridgework was on the upper jaw only. It does not seem possible that a bridgework chart could have been made after death if the upper jaw was missing. The two statements therefore seem rather contradictory. I shall be grateful if you will clarify this point.

I do not wish to prolong this matter any longer than necessary. I am sure you will understand that I wish to be certain beyond a doubt that the remains of Unknown X-127 are those of my son before I request final disposition.

They are at present interred as Unknown X-127, in the United States Military Cemetery Foy, Belgium, Plot J, Row 9, Grave 212.

According to Army records and investigation, on 23 December 1944, Paul's organization was engaged in heavy combat with the enemy from Grombac to Beho, in Belgium. It was during this engagement that Paul was reported killed in action on the above date in the vicinity of Beho.

The remains of Unknown X-127 were recovered by personnel of the American Graves Registration Service from an isolated grave near a tank destroyer at Commanster, Belgium, which is approximately 12 miles from Beho. As no means of immediate identification were present, the Unknown designation was assigned pending further investigation, and interment was made in the present location in Foy.

In the absence of identification tags, bracelet or other satisfactory identifying media, a careful examination was made at a later date by qualified technicians in a laboratory of the American Graves Registration Service with the view to effecting identification by other means, if possible, such as comparison of physical and dental characteristics with Army records. It is upon the favorable results of these comparisons, together with other evidence obtained through investigation, that the identification of these remains as those of your son was based. I will summarize the evidence:

- a. Unknown X-127 was recovered from the vicinity in which Paul was reported a casualty.
- b. Paul was the only casualty from the tank to which he was assigned.
- c. A search of the records of this office reveal Unknown X-127 to be the only deceased recovered from the vicinities of Beho or Commanster, still to be identified.

"C" occupying high ground to the SW overlooking Grombac, and the balance of this Combat Command "B" withdrawing through its position. When Combat Command "B" cleared the ridge, the Third Platoon fell in as rear guard and fought its way through Braumlaus in spite of heavy small arms and bazooka fire towards Maidingen, and then upon reaching Beho, it was attached to task force "Jones" and acted as rear guard for that Unit.

Dear Mrs. Espig:

This office has been advised by the Service Officer, American Legion Gregg Post Number 12, Reading, Pennsylvania, of your desire for additional information regarding the death of your son.

I can well understand your desire for complete details regarding the death of your son, Private First Class Paul H. Espig. Army serial number 33 830 727, Field Artillery, but I regret that no information other than that previously furnished has been received. The records show only that on 23 December 1944 in the vicinity of Beho, Belgium the tank in which he was serving was hit during a severe attack by the enemy. Due to the nature of the fighting it was impossible at the time to find out what happened to the crew members of the tank. Subsequently he was reported missing in action and later a cuasalty message was received from the Commanding General of the European Theater of Operations which stated only that he was killed in action 23 December 1944 in Belgium, the same day he was previously reported missing. Additional information received confirmed this report of death but unfortunately no further details were given.

The Quartermaster General of the Army, Washington 25, D. C., has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to the burial and personal effects of our military personnel who die overseas. A copy of the Service Officer's letter has accordingly been forwarded to that official for necessary action.

Permit me to extend my sympathy.





A thorough investigation was conducted in the Hinderhausen area in order to find the remains of Pfc. Paul H. Espig.

The Burgomaster of Hinderhausen, community of Rodt, declared that there are no Americans buried in his community, including the villages of Crombach,
Neundorf, Hinderhausen, Nieder and Ober Emmels and
Hunningen. All these villages are situated in the area
indicated as place of death of Pfc. Espig.

Mr. Laberger, representative of the Burgomaster
of Rodt in Hinderhausen also declared that there are
no American deceased in the Hinderhausen area.

This investigator made a physical search of the area within a 3 miles radius of Hinderhausen in order to find a tank, that might contain American remains, but found that all tanks in this particular area had been dismantled and taken away by a Belgian firm. Conclusion: According to attached OQMG Form 371, Pfc.

Espig was the only causalty of his tank crew.

Pfc. Espig burned to death in his tank in Hinderhausen area. As there are no more tanks in this area it is requested that remains of Pfc. Espig be declared non-recoverable.





I regret that I must inform you that information concerning the burial of the remains of your son has not yet been received in this office. However, our Graves Registration Forces in the field are making a complete and thorough search of all areas over which our men fought.
