With sincere regret, I must inform you that it is not possible to fulfill your understandable desire to have the remains of your son buried in either the Flanders Field American Military Cemetery, or the Aisne Marne American Military Cemetery.

These European cemeteries were established as "Fields of Honor" permanent shrines to the memory of those Americans who died in Europe during World War I, and are dedicated in grateful remembrance of their sacrifice. They were planned as to size, design and construction for their burial, and when these were completed, they were closed to future interments and placed under the care of the American Battle Monuments Commission.

World War II Dead will be similarly honored with equally beautiful, stately cemeteries in Europe.

The American Military Cemetery at Henri-Chapelle, Belgium, has been dedicated as a permanent memorial to the heroic dead of World War II now temporarily resting at Henri-Chapelle, Belgium. May I suggest, if that cemetery has your approval, you line out the cemetery you have designated.






