
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

Your letter pertaining to the remains of your son, the late Corporal John W. Clark, has come to my attention.

All expenses of exhumation, preparation of remains, casketing and transportation to the city or town designated by the next of kin will be borne by the Government. When remains are returned to the United States for final burial in a private cemetery or are sent to a foreign country for burial in a private cemetery, the Government will contribute a sum not to exceed \$50 toward the cost of actual burial expenses. When final interment is in a permanent American Military Cemetery overseas or in a National Cemetery in the United States, the entire cost of burial will be borne by the Government.

In all cases, the Government will provide a flag of the United States to be used for proper draping of the casket during burial services. After the services, this flag will be presented or sent to the next of kin as a memorial. The Government will also provide an approved type inscribed headstone or marker for all private cemetery graves. A military escort, provided at the expense of the Government, will accompany the remains to the place of delivery designated by the next of kin.
