GENERAL PROVISIONS APPLYING TO THIS ORDER

- 1. PAYMENTS.—The Contractor shall be paid, upon the submission of properly certified invoices or vouchers, the prices stipulated herein for articles delivered and accepted or services rendered, less deductions, if any, as herein provided.
- 2. INSPECTION.—Whether or not an inspection point is specified herein, all material and workmanship shall be subject to inspection and test at all times and places, (including inspection and test after arrival at destination) and, when practicable, during manufacture.
- 3. VARIATION IN QUANTITIES.—Unless otherwise specified, any variation in the quantities herein called for, not exceeding 10%, will be accepted as a compliance with the contract, when caused by conditions of loading, shipping, packing, or allowances in manufacturing processes, and payments shall be adjusted accordingly.
- 4. NOTICE OF SHIPMENTS.—At the time of delivery of a shipment to a carrier for transportation, the Contractor shall give such prepaid notice of shipment to the consignee establishment, and to such other persons or installations designated by the Contracting Officer, as the Contracting Officer may require.
- 5. TAXES.—Unless otherwise indicated in this contract (a) the prices herein do not include any State or local sales, use or other tax from which the Contractor or this transaction of the procurement of these supplies is exempt, and (b) the prices herein include all applicable Federal taxes and other applicable State and local taxes in effect at the date of this contract.
- 6. WALSH-HEALEY ACT.—If this contract is for an amount in excess of \$10,000, the representations and stipulations required by Section 1 of the Act of June 30, 1936 (Walsh-Healey Act, Public No. 846, 74th Cong.), to be included in all contracts therein specified, are hereby incorporated and made a part of this contract with the same force and effect as if fully set forth in the contract.
- 7. EIGHT-HOUR LAW.—This General Provision 7 shall apply if General Provision 6 is not applicable. No laborer or mechanic doing any part of the work contemplated by this contract, in the employ of the contractor or any subcontractor contracting for any part of said work contemplated, shall be required or permitted to work more than 8 hours in any one calendar day upon such work at the site thereof, except upon the condition that compensation is paid to such laborer or mechanic in accordance with the provisions of this article.
- 8. ANTI-DISCRIMINATION.—(a) The Contractor, in performing the work required by this contract, shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color, or national origin.
- 9. CONVICT LABOR.—The Contractor shall not employ any person undergoing sentence of imprisonment at hard labor.
- 10. CHANGES.—Where the supplies to be furnished are to be specially manufactured in accordance with drawings and specifications, the Contracting Officer may at any time, by a written order, and without notice to the sureties, if any, make changes in the drawings or specifications. Changes as to shipment and packing of all supplies may also be made as above provided.
- 11. DELAYS—DAMAGES.—If the Contractor refuses or fails to perform this contract within the time specified, or any extension thereof, the Government may, by written notice, terminate the right of the Contractor to proceed with deliveries or with such part or parts thereof as to which there has been delay, and may hold the Contractor liable for any damage caused the Government by reason of such termination.
- 12. DISPUTES.—Except as otherwise specifically provided in this contract, all disputes concerning questions of fact which may arise under this contract, and which are not disposed of by mutual agreement, shall be decided by the Contracting Officer, who shall reduce his decision to writing and mail a copy thereof to the Contractor.
- 13. ASSIGNMENT OF RIGHTS HEREUNDER.—This General Provision 13 shall apply if this contract is for \$1,000 or more, unless this contract is marked secret, confidential, or restricted.
- 14. OFFICIALS NOT TO BENEFIT.—No member of or delegate to Congress or resident commissioner shall be admitted to any share or part of this contract or to any benefit that may arise therefrom, but this provision shall not be construed to extend to this contract if made with a corporation for its general benefit.
- 15. COVENANT AGAINST CONTINGENT FEES.—The Contractor warrants that he has not employed any person to solicit or secure this contract upon any agreement for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee.
- 16. TERMINATION AT THE OPTION OF THE GOVERNMENT.—The performance of work under this contract may be terminated by the Government whenever the Contracting Officer shall determine that such action is for the best interests of the Government.
- 17. DEFINITIONS.—Except for the original signing of this contract, and except as otherwise stated herein, the term "Contracting Officer" as used herein shall include his duly appointed successor or his authorized representative.

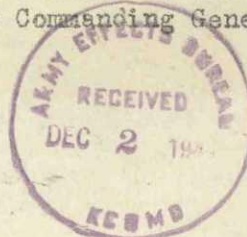
