Reference is made to your letter of 9 May 1945, File No. 418326 in which is stated that the property consisting of a ring belonging to my son Everett Frederick Bottema was being returned to me. The ring has been received, for which I thank you.

However, I am certain that there were many more things such as his wallet which I gave him last Christmas, his watch, a pearl handled jack-knife, and a camera, among other small items which I know he took with him overseas, and which I feel should be returned to me in addition to his ring. The last letter I received from him stated that the boys were staying with a Belgian family. Could it be then, assuming that his effects are not in the War office, that he could have left them in the home of this Belgian family while working his way to the front?

It is not for the value of the items itself that I wish them returned, of course, but for the sentiment now that he is gone forever. I would therefore greatly appreciate your attention to this matter, Lt. Koob, and would be very grateful indeed if the rest of my son's belongings could in the near future be returned to me.

Also, my son's buddies which he mentioned to me in his letters were Corporal Henderson and Sargeant Becknell who were also in the 1st. Machine Gun Squad, 291st. Infantry, 75th. Div., Company I. I would like very much to know if these boys are still alive and if so, where they may be reached.

My thanks to you for your cooperation and your consideration in this matter.
