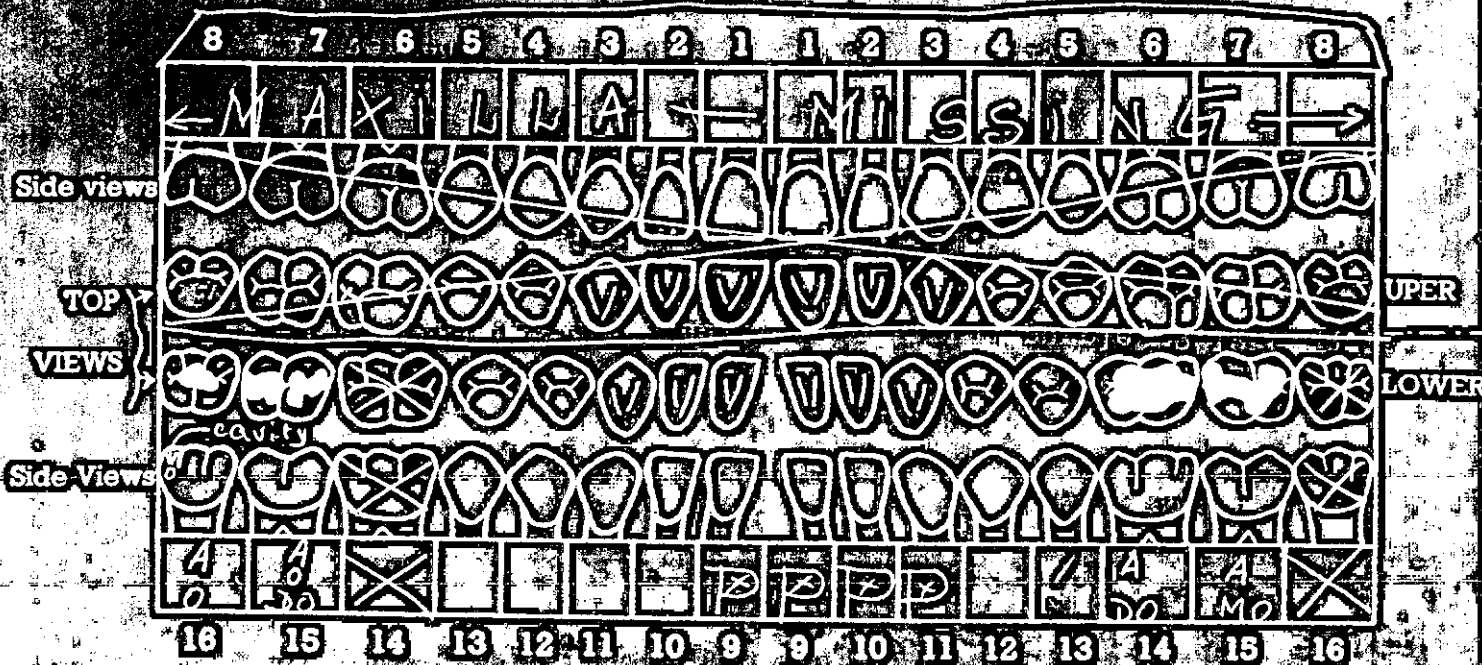

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 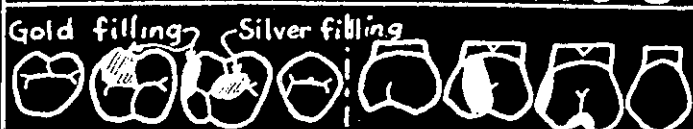

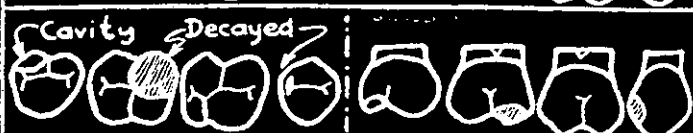

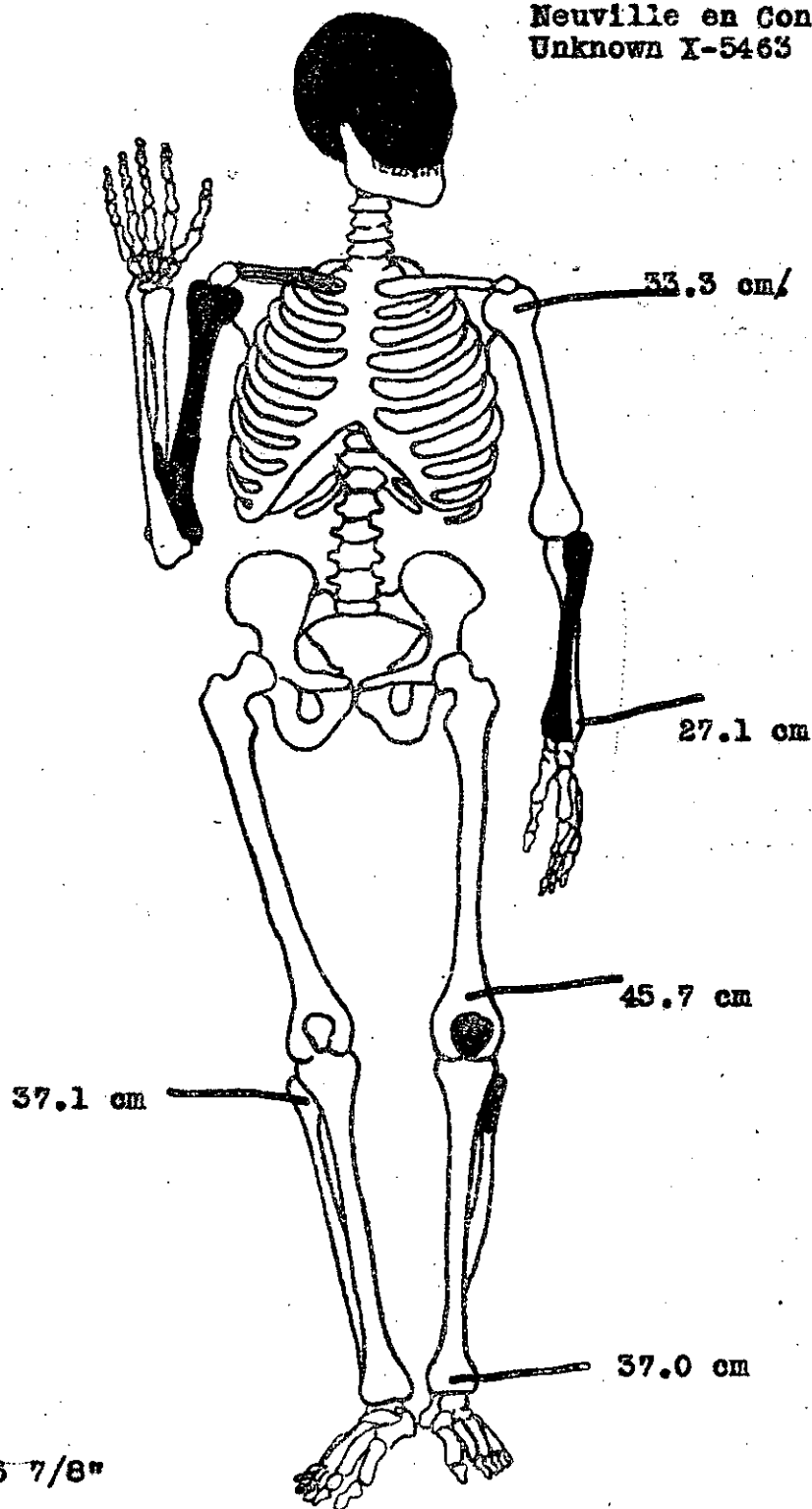

NARRATIVE
ON BRANDENBERG, GERMANY CASE

On the 6 May 1947 a disinterring team proceeded to a forest belonging to the community of Brandenburg to disinter the remains of an unburied American soldier. The information was received from Willy Bauer of Schmidt #97 who found the remains while walking through the above mentioned woods in summer 1946.

This disinterring team recovered the remains lying on the surface of the ground. The deceased is believed to be killed by small arms's fire, since no signs of Artillery or mines were seen around the place in this woods.

A steel helmet was found approximately 3 yards from the remains bearing the number "3407". Also an M-1 rifle was recovered near the remains bearing the following markings: "EMILY".

Further information pertaining to the deceased is not available.

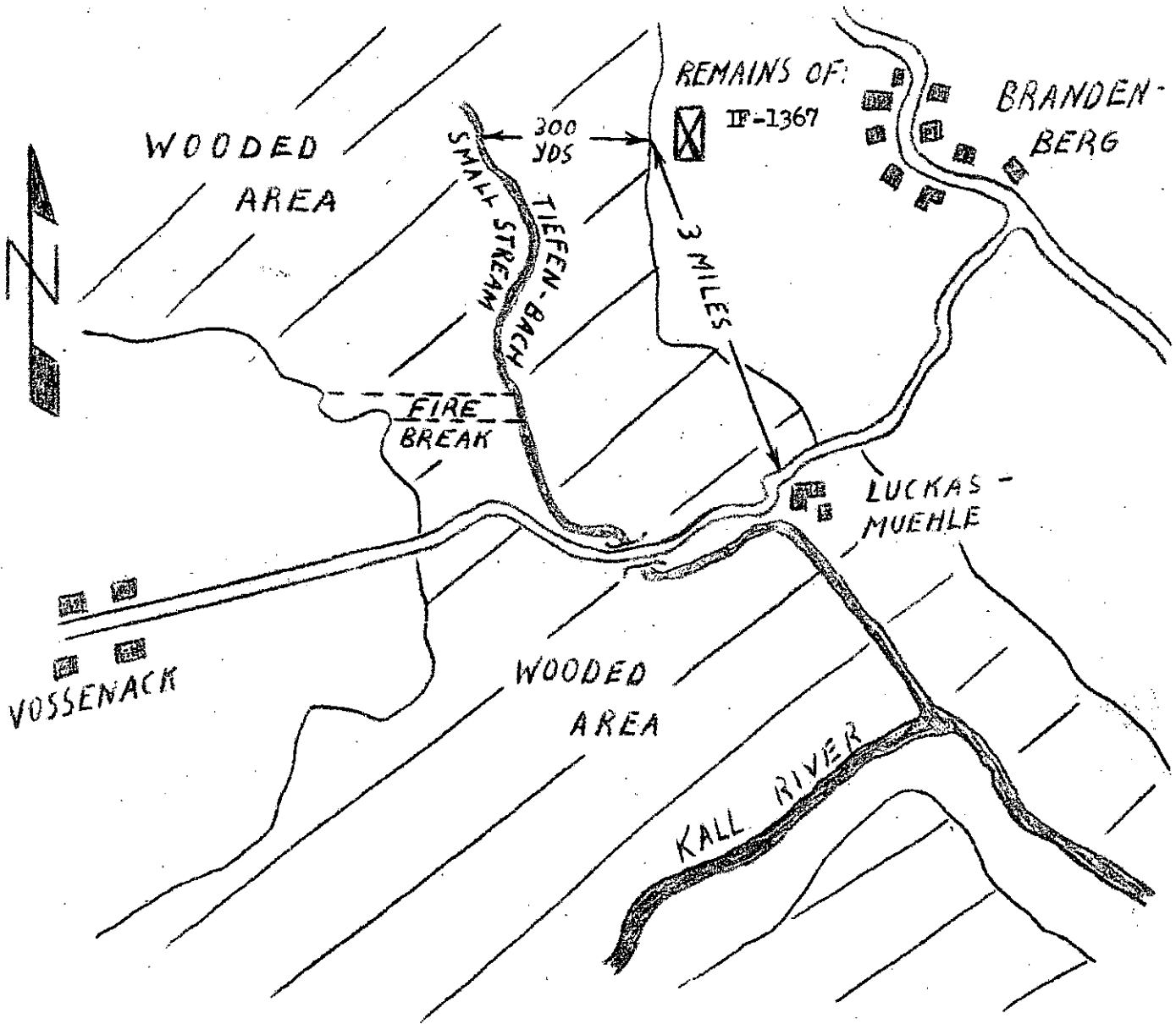

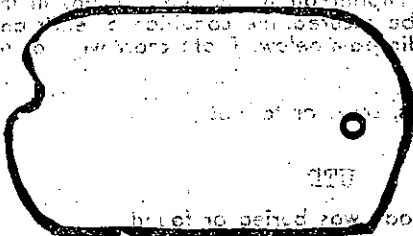

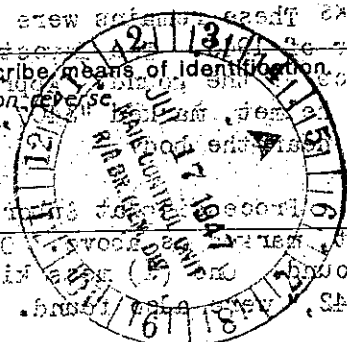
