CASE HISTORY

UNKNOWN X-6033

USMC NEUVILLE

X-6033 was recovered above ground in woods at Gey, District #3, Germany. Remains consisted of five small pieces of charred bones, two of which were recognized as being a part of the spinal column, one a finger joint, and two unclassifiable.

By EO # 1990, X-6033 was designated CIL # 4506. Remains were described as consisting of small fragments of charred unidentifiable bones, one finger bone, and a portion of one thoracic vertebra.

CIL # 4506 has been redesignated as Unknown X-6033 in accordance with instructions from OQMG.

Due to the small amount of remains and complete lack of identifying media, it has been impossible to associate subject remains with any unresolved casualty in this theater or with any resolved casualty in the area of Gey, Germany.

In view of the above, it is concluded that X-6033 must be considered UNIDENTIFIABLE.

NARRATIVE
ON GEY, GERMANY CASE

On the 30 June 1947 a disinterring team proceeded to the woods near Gey, Germany (WF-0540), District # 3, to disinter the remains of an unknown American soldier. The information was obtained from Jakob Adels, Gey, Germany, Oberstr. # 50, who found the remains while walking through the woods in the above mentioned area (see exhibit "A").

This disinterring team recovered the remains lying on the surface of the ground. The whole district, where we found the remains, were completely burned by forest fire. For that reason we could find only a few burned bones. But it is possible that the remains were evacuated before by another disinterring team, and that we found the rest of the bones there, because the ground was cleared off from grass and bushes by the forest fire. Some metal parts of American G. I. equipment which were found with the remains, proved that these bones belong to a deceased American soldier.

The vicinity around the place of death had not been hit by artillery fire. Therefore, it is believed that the soldier had been killed by small arm's fire. The date of death is established to be around November 1944, when the heaviest fighting took place in this district.

No identification tags were found at the time of disinterment and further information pertaining to the deceased is not available.

I showed the place to an investigation team of the American Graves Registration Command and they evacuated the remains shortly after.

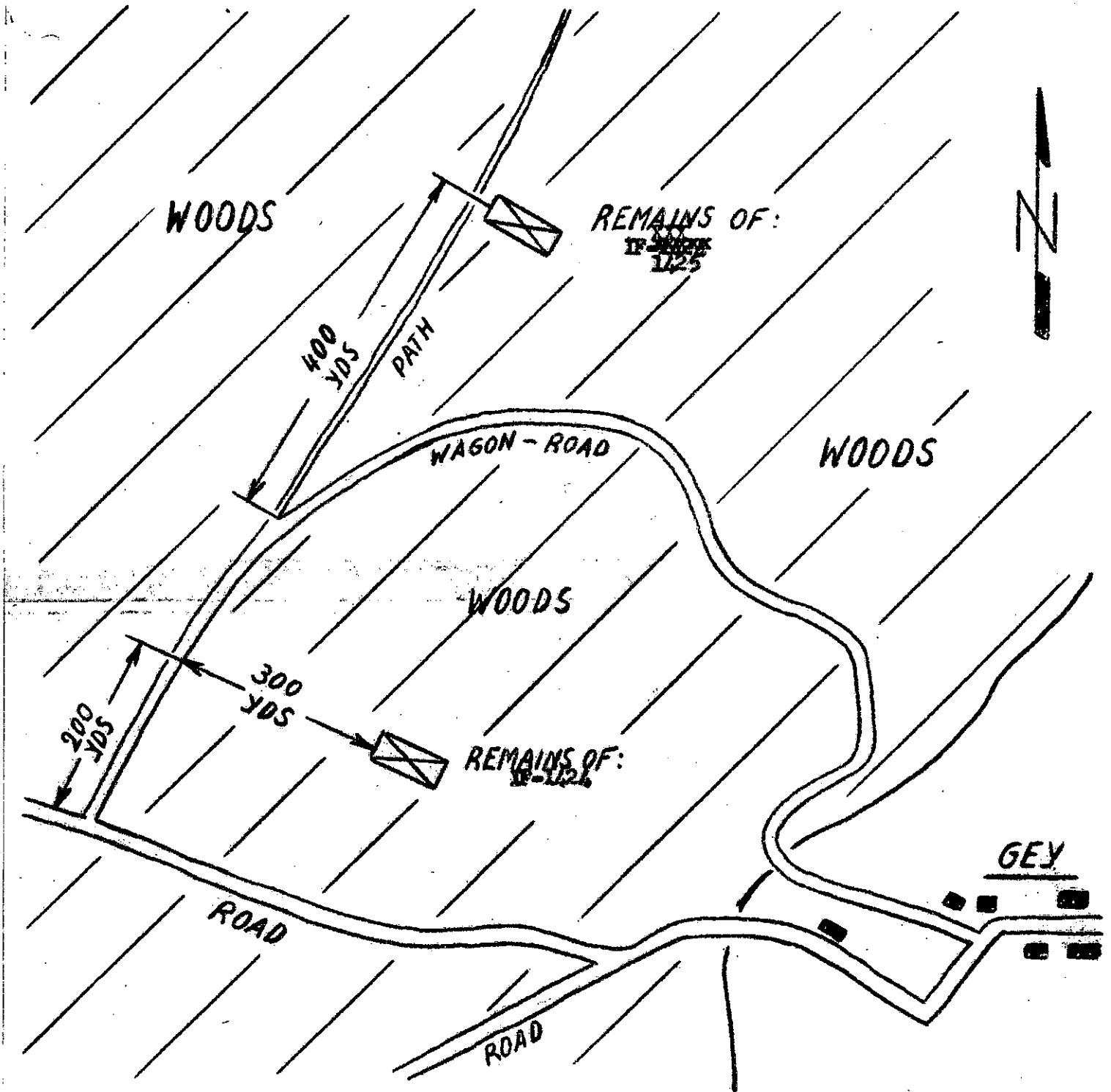


