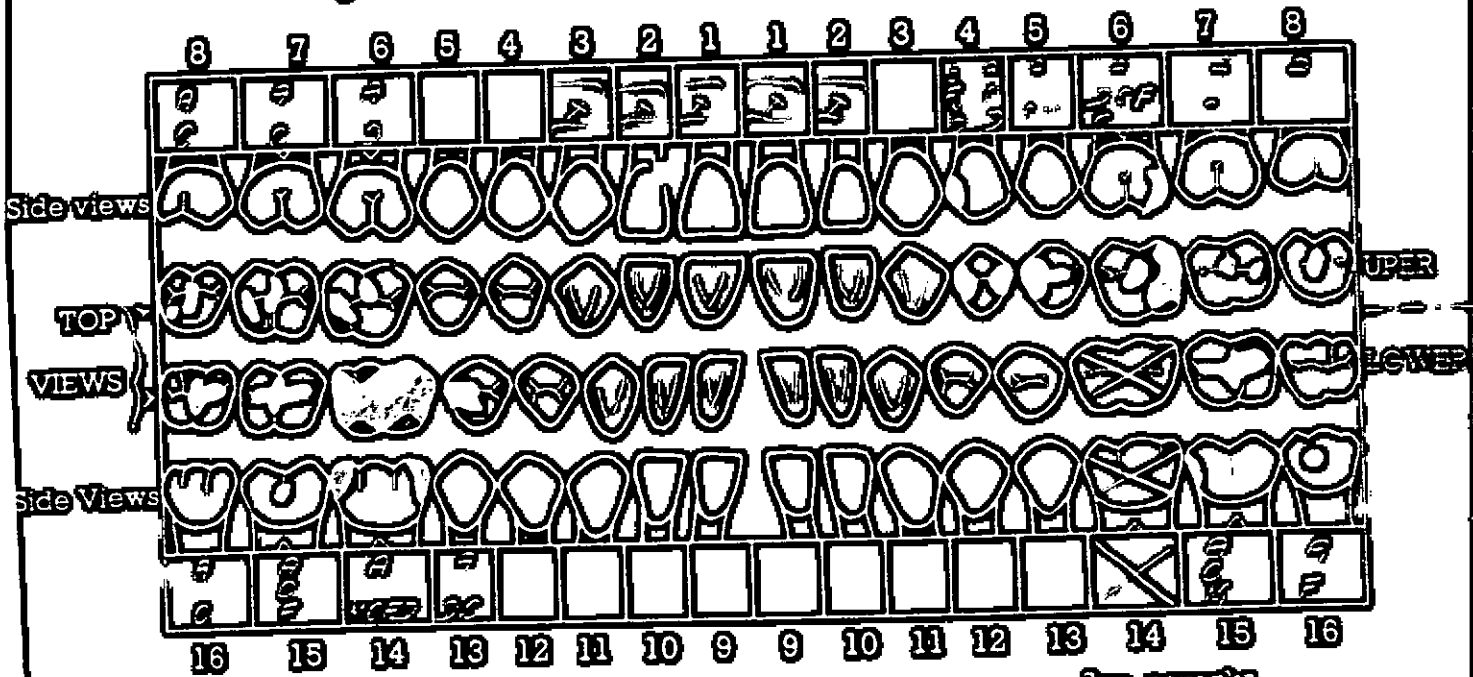

The dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 

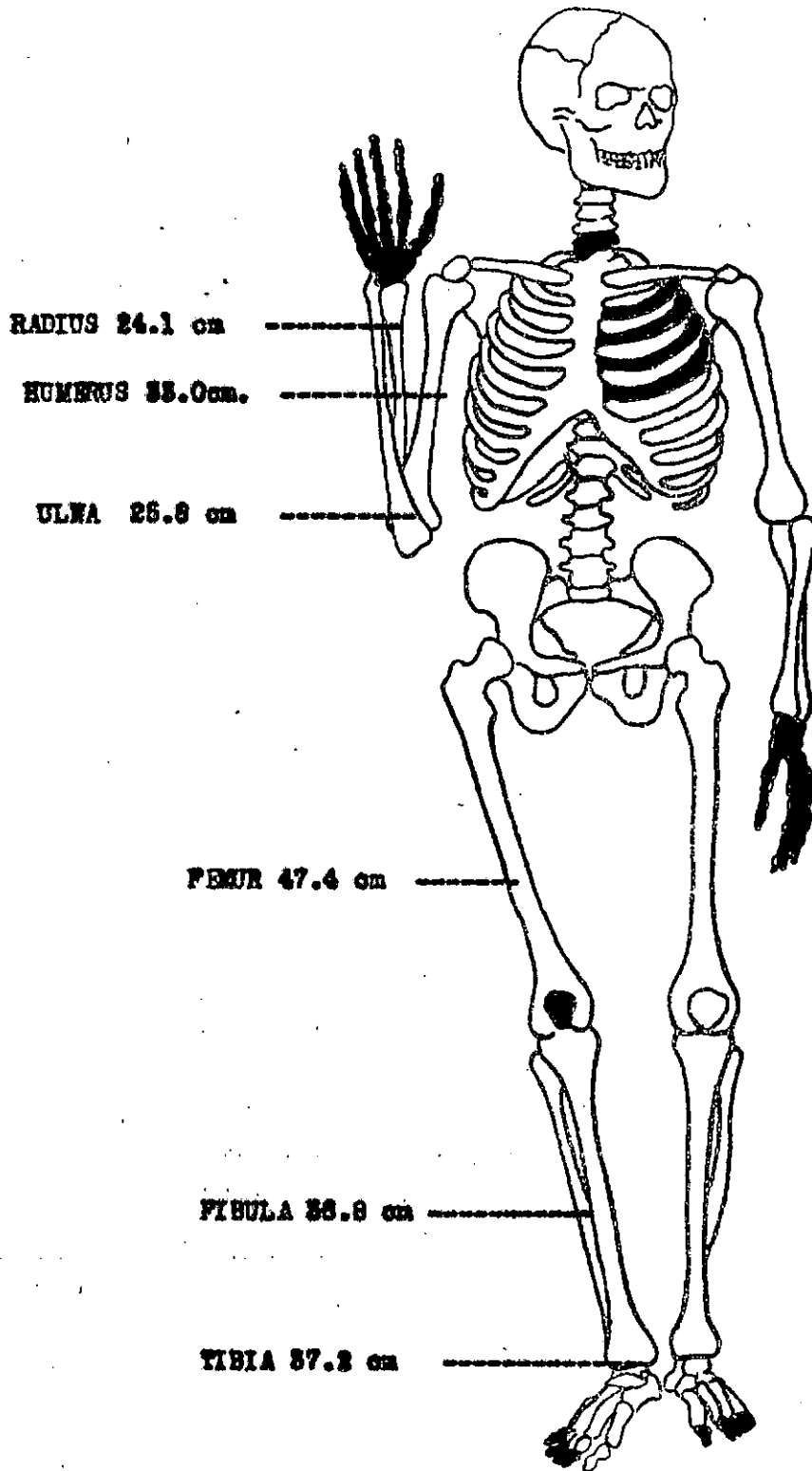

NARRATIVE
ON HURTGEN, GERMANY CASE

On the 22 July 1947 this disinterring team proceeded to the Hurtgen Forest, district # 91 to disinter the remains of a deceased American soldier. The information was received from Christian Berners whose lumber-firm is cutting wood in the above mentioned district (see Exhibit "A").

We recovered the remains which were lying on the surface of the ground. They consisted of dry bones and G.I. equipment. The woods around the place of death of the deceased were destroyed by artillery fire. Several shrapnel-pieces were discovered in the undershirt of the deceased.

The deceased is believed to have been killed by shrapnel of artillery fire. The date of death is established to be around November 1944, while the heaviest fighting took place in the Hurtgen Forest.

No means of identification could be found with the remains.

Further information pertaining to the deceased is not available.

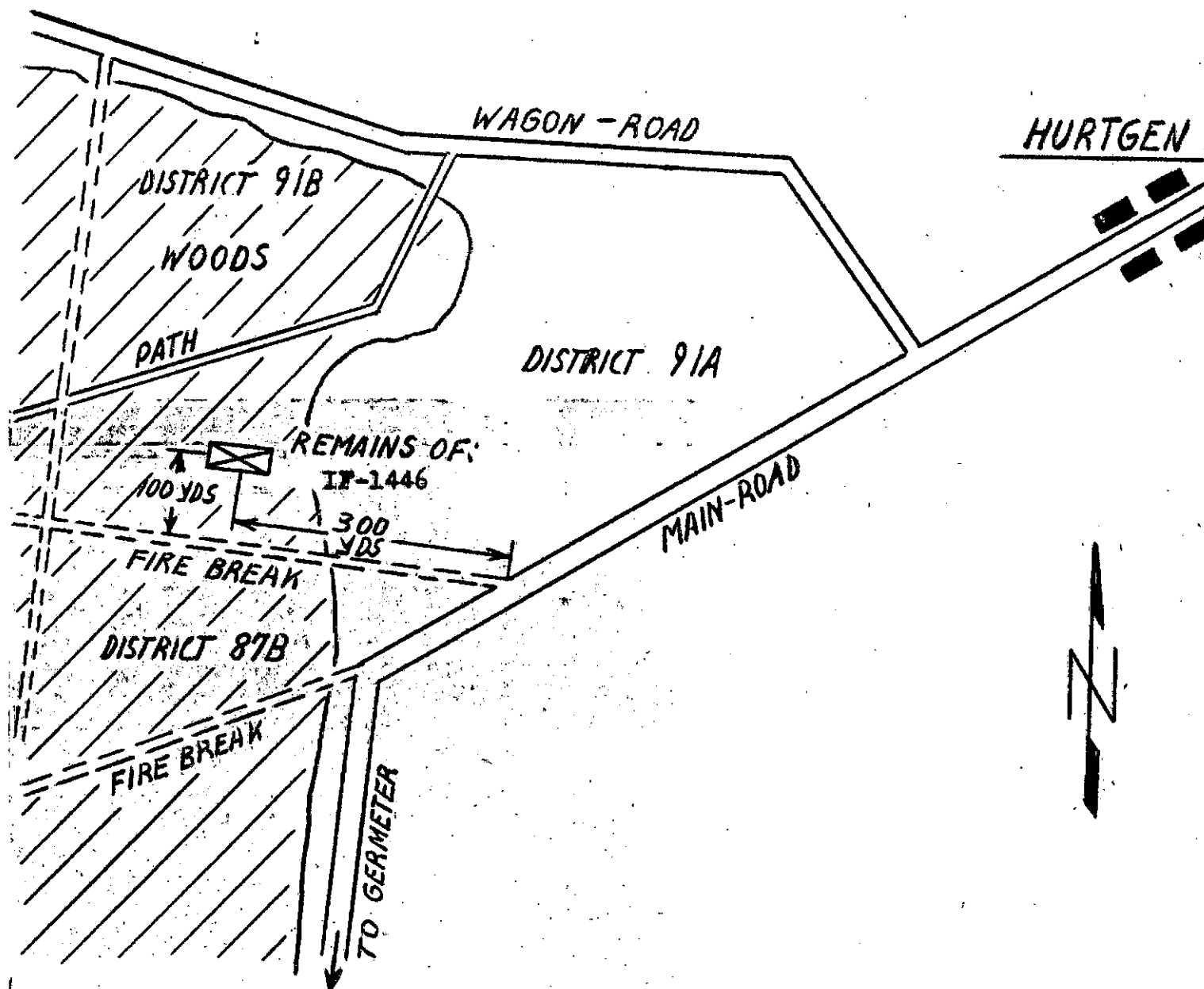

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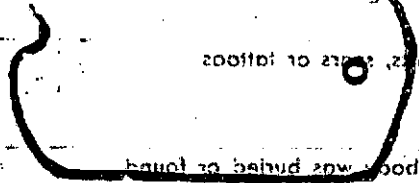
