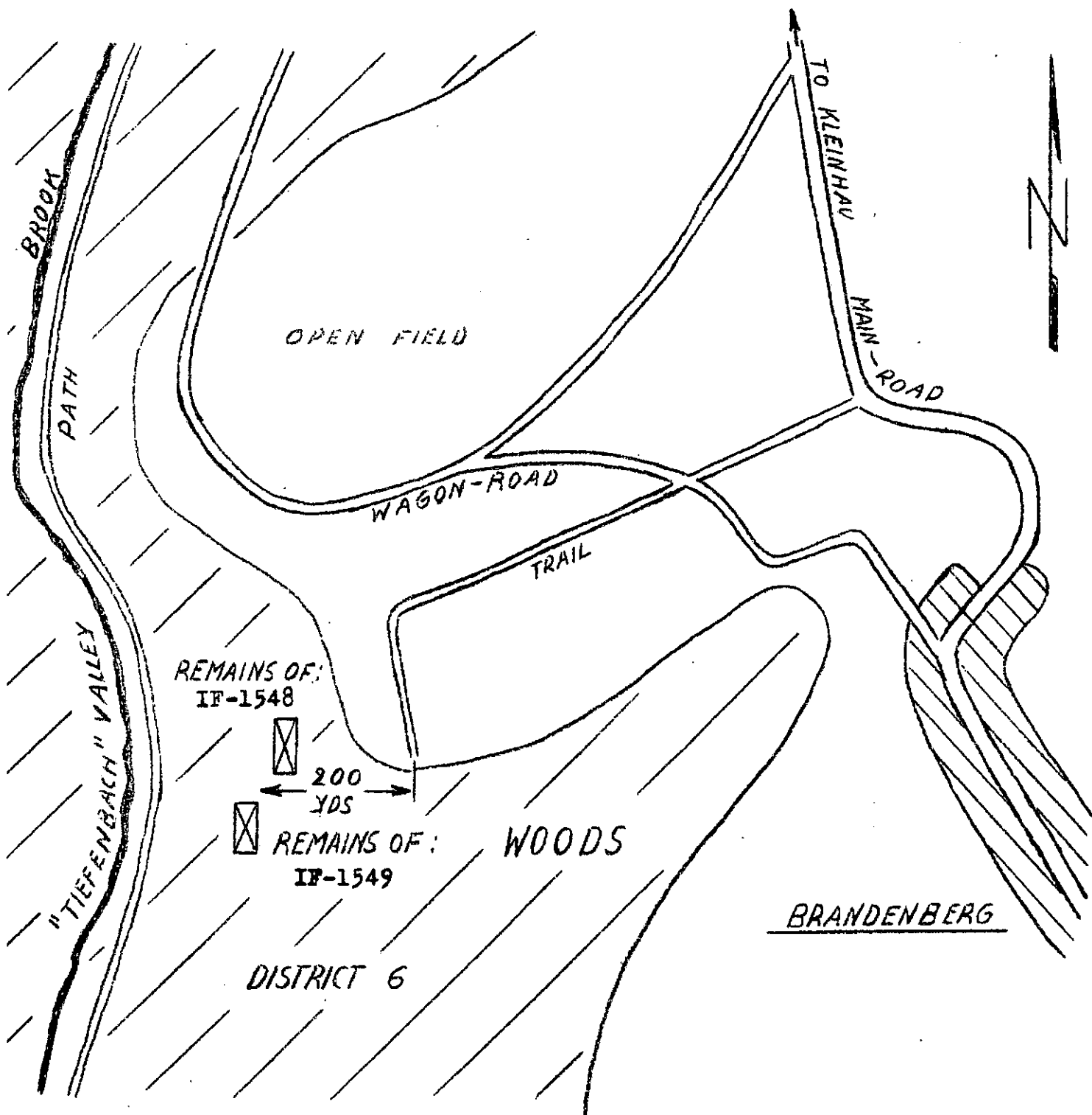

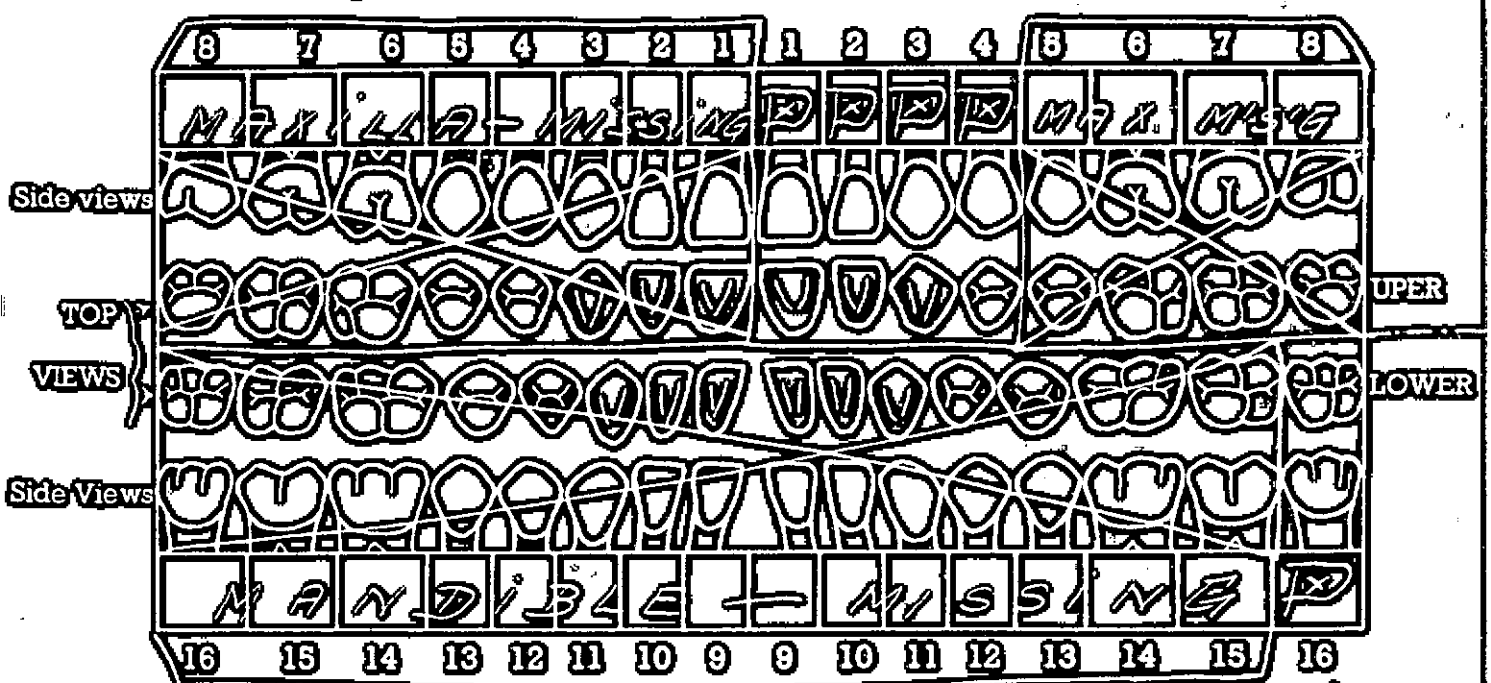

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. NARRATIVE OF DISINTERMENT
AT BRANDENBERG, GERMANY
COORDINATES 3/F-03
ON 20 AUGUST 1947

On the 20 August 1947 this disinterring team proceeded to the woods near Brandenburg, Germany, district # 6, to recover the remains of an unknown American soldier.

This information was forwarded to this team on the 19 August 1947 by Mr. Hermann Joerres, farmer in Brandenburg, Germany, Main Street # 63. He found the remains while trying to extinguish a forest fire in the above mentioned district (see Exhibit "A").

The remains were found lying on the surface of the ground, and approximately 15 ft. from another unknown American deceased. The remains consisted of dry bones, which were partly burned, and G.I. equipment.

The deceased is believed to have been killed by artillery shrapnels or small arm's fire approximately in November 1944, when the heaviest fighting took place in the Hurtgen Area.

No means of identification could be found.

Further information pertaining to the deceased is not available.
