a. The tooth charts of Unknowns I-6917 and I-6926, whose place of death in the case of subject Unknown I-6961, are also associated with Pfc. Hillert.

b. Additional dental data for Pfc. Hillert is not available.

3. In view of the above, it is recommended that case be re-investigated, and if additional identifying data is not available, case be redesignated as Unknown.

1. Reference is made to unidentified remains disinterred from the Quenz Cemetery, Brandenburg, Germany.

2. A review of records for unidentified casualties reported killed in the Augusta School bombing and buried in the Quenz Cemetery, as indicated on Inclosure 1, has resulted in a favorable association for three (3) remains, namely:

- X-6393: Tooth chart and height are favorable with Pfc Joseph SAVIA, 11020 992.
- X-6961: Tooth chart and physical characteristics are favorable with Cpl Donald M. HOLEMO, 36 586 067.
- X-7629: Maxilla of Unk X-7629 and mandible of X-6921 compare
- X-6921: favorable with dental record of Pvt Joseph J. THERIAULT.
- X-6385: Estimated height recorded for Torso with THERIAULT'S POW Number agrees with his height.

3. In view of the above, it is requested that remains of the five (5) referenced Unknowns be simultaneously reprocessed by a qualified anthropologist and findings submitted to the office of The Quartermaster General.

NARRATIVE OF DISINTERMENT

BRANDENBURG, GERMANY (N 53/Z 23; 1/250,000)

On the 9th July 1947 disinterring team # 2 disinterred from the Foreigners and Military Cemetery "QUENZ", Brandenburg, Germany the remains of thirteen (13) American deceased.

Upon disinterment we found the remains in coffins with no tops on them. The deceased were in fair condition with O D Clothing.

All the graves had crosses with metal plates on which names were inscribed. Four of the remains had identification tags on them two of which did not agree with the names on the metal plates on the crosses.

The remains were disinterred as follows:

- Grave # 7 Name on metal plate "Thiebiatti"



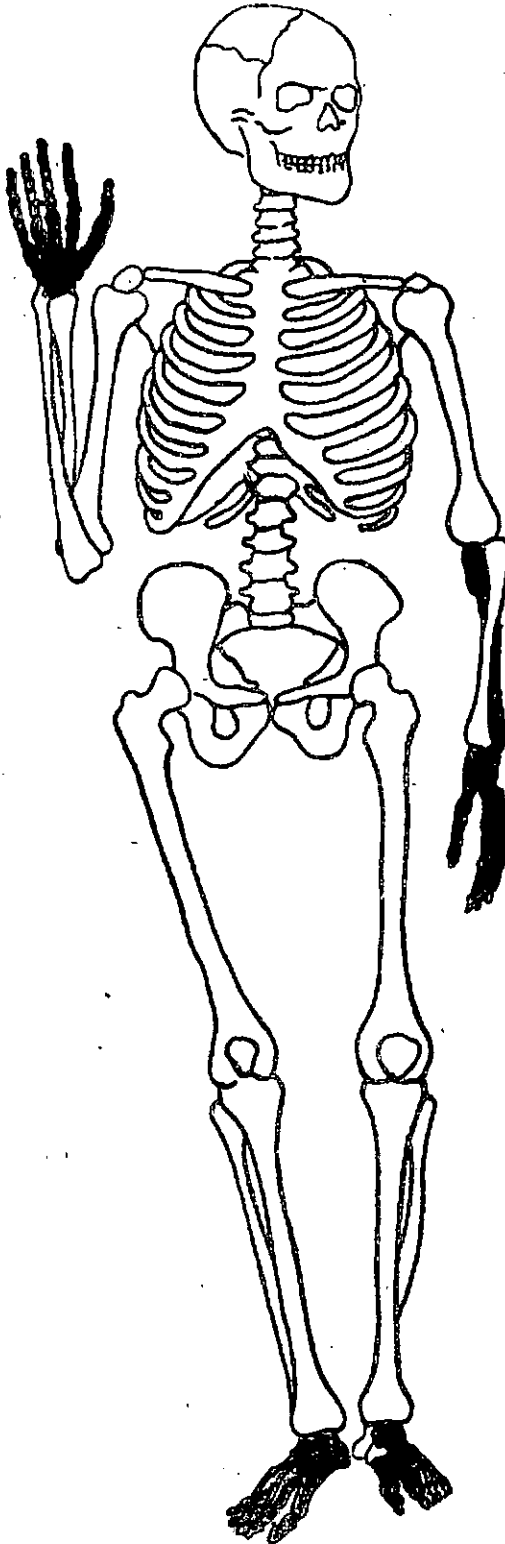

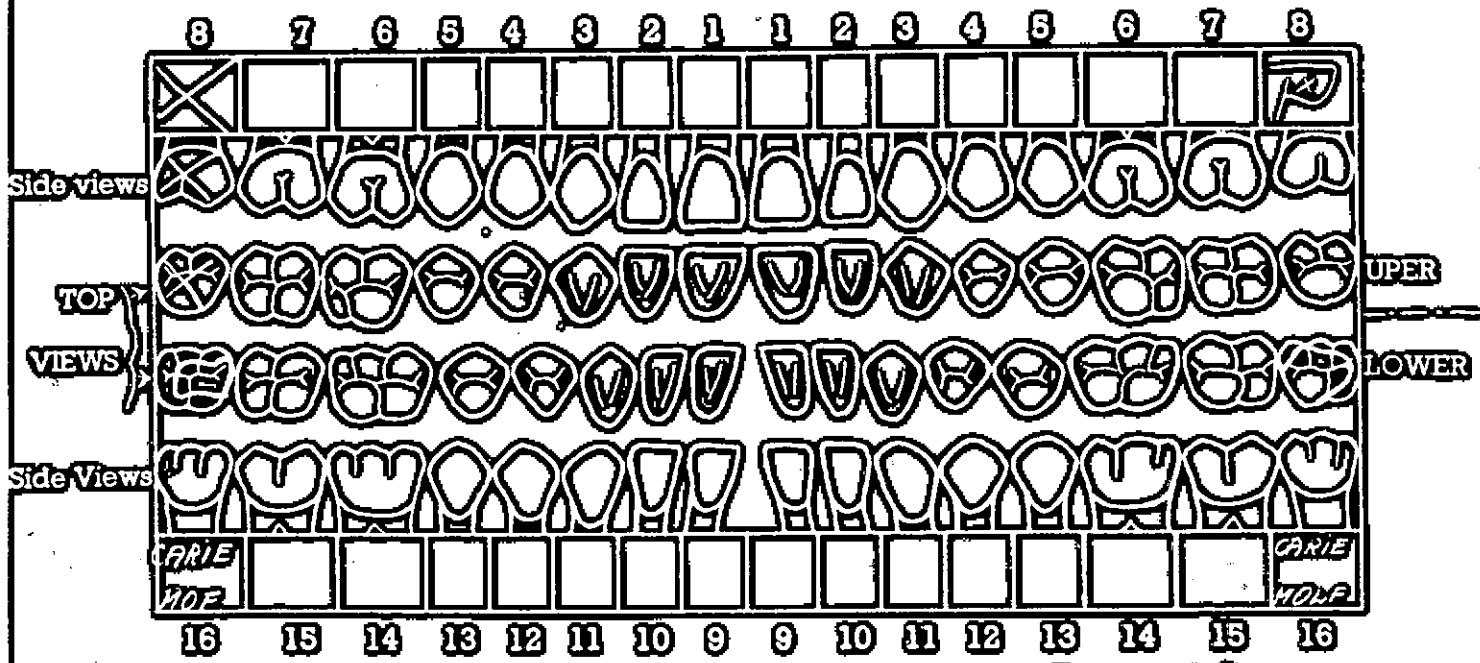

 This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 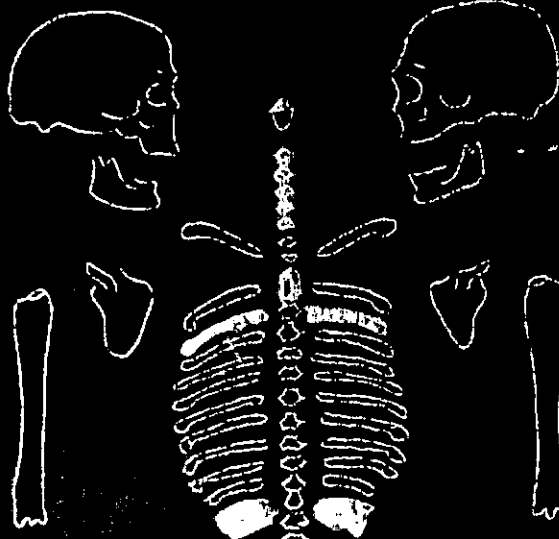
SKELETAL CHART
