
CASE HISTORY

Unknown X-6336 was disinterred from Quenz Cemetery, Brandenburg, Germany, Grave 12.

Tooth chart for this Unknown has been compared with all the available dental records of casualties killed in or near Brandenburg and in map sheet N-53 Germany, with negative results.

Cemetery records state that SMITH was interred in Grave 12, Quenz Cemetery, but the dental records for Pfc. Walter A. SMITH, 35295481, POW killed in Brandenburg on 31 March 1945 compare negatively with the tooth chart for this Unknown.

The case papers do not furnish any further information that could be used as a clue to identity and in view of the negative results mentioned above, it is recommended that this case be declared UNIDENTIFIABLE.

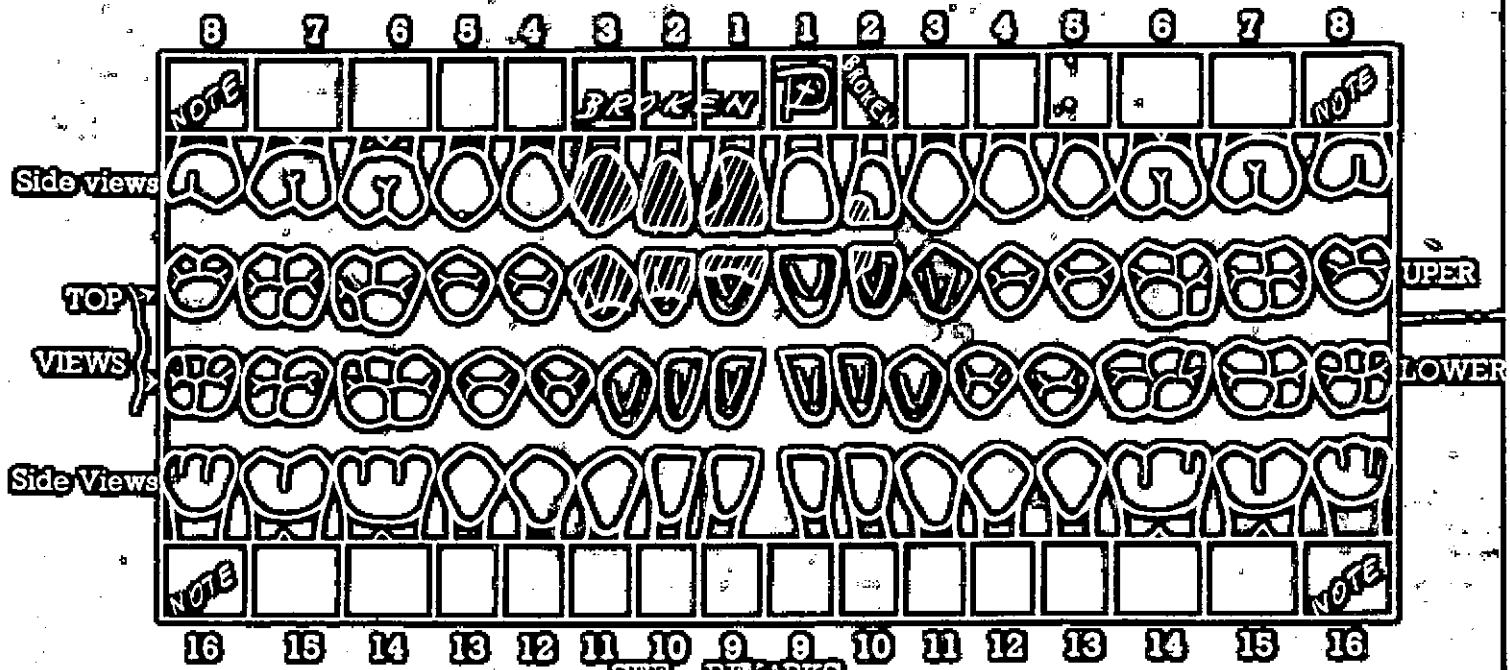

Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 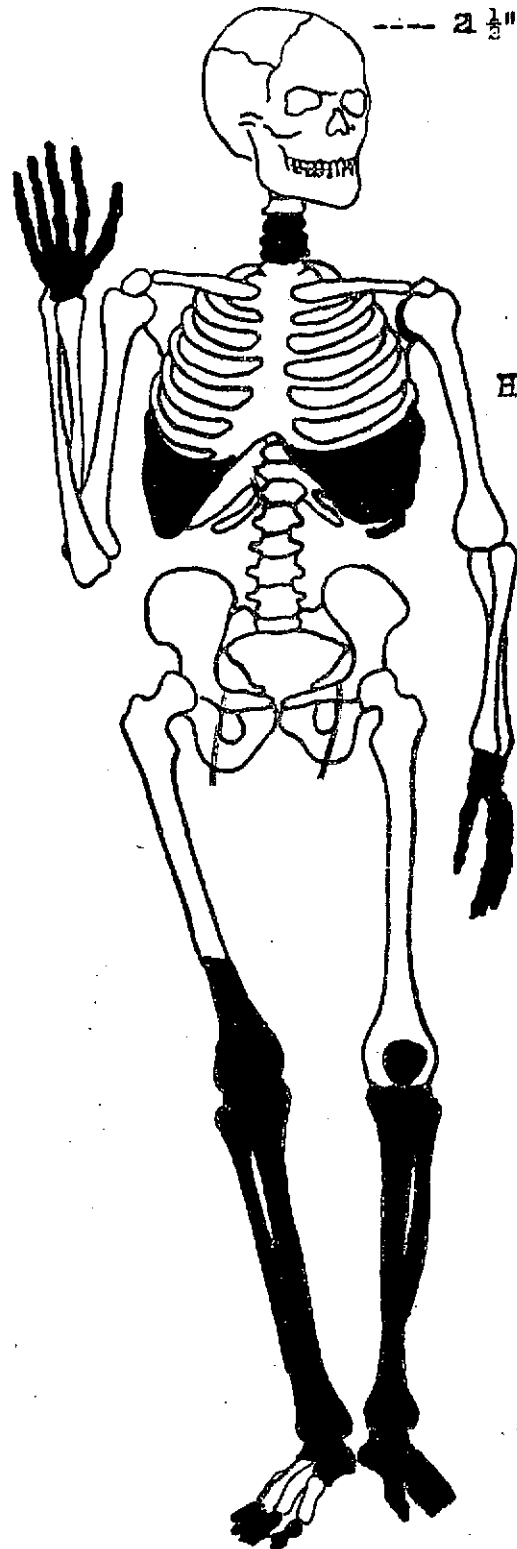

NARRATIVE OF DISINTERMENT

BRANDENBURG, GERMANY (N 53/Z 23; 1/250,000)

On the 9th July 1947 disinterring team # 2 disinterred from the Foreigners and Military Cemetery "QUENZ", Brandenburg, Germany the remains of thirteen (13) American deceased.

Upon disinterment we found the remains in coffins with no tops on them. The deceased were in fair condition with O D Clothing.

All the graves had crosses with metal plates on which names were inscribed. Four of the remains had identification tags on them two of which did not agree with the names on the metal plates on the crosses.

The remains were disinterred as follows:

- Grave # 7 Name on metal plate "Thiebiatti"

- Grave # 8 Name on metal plate "Dickson"

- Grave # 10 Name on metal plate "Ballard"

Narrative of Investigation

Brandenburg (Havel), Germany

Arrived Brandenburg with the wind and the rain. Reported to Province Kommandatura. No documents or papers in regard to Graves Registration to be found here. No billets or messing facilities available in Brandenburg. Went to Kreis Landrat and had the same answer. Town is full of OMGUS officials and every inch of available room has been taken. Nothing else to do but go to work. Started our duty with the city officials, located Register of graves for the city of Brandenburg and outskirts. Ran into a young lad who was perfect in his Russian-German language and knew his whereabouts in the part of the world. At the Rathaus Brandenburg I located information which I was seeking. The Stadt Friedhofsverwaltung, Krematorium, had records and information on 19 burials. One of the deceased was buried in the "Neuen Altstadt Friedhof". I had no B.D. on the deceased leading me to Brandenburg, but there is an MACR # 6372 listing Boyd William W. Jr. 2nd Lt. O-760720, PDD. I would believe that this is the deceased that is buried in Brandenburg (Sketch attached of cemetery and inscription on "PEG"). Left for other leads to find the remains of 18 deceased from the bombing of the "Augusta School". In the company of the interpreter, caretaker (present), we located the cemetery in which "18" known Americans are buried. The makeshift cemetery is known as the "Quenz" Friedhof... The property of which is part of the factory which is located 1 km south of the cemetery. During the air attack on this factory the building in which these deceased were taking shelter, was hit by our bombers and destroyed all occupants killed. Beside the "18" marked "American" graves, there are approx. 130 more graves, two rows of which seem to be a mass burial, and the third partially so. All "101" graves are those that are not specified as to the nationality of the deceased. I would recommend spot checking the remaining "101" unknowns. Sketch of cemetery in detail is attached. All statements from Friedhofsamt are included with Basic Documents. Left for the "New Friedhof" in Brandenburg Proper. No American or other Allied personnel were buried in this cemetery (statement attached). The Crematorium, which is also in Brandenburg proper was investigated, visually inspected, and statement of cemetery officials was negative, no American or Allied nationals buried in the cemetery. Basic Documents carried for 1st Lt. E. Isaacsen O-761817 and 2nd Lt. Filbert F. Dye, O-828122, are therefore returned as false reports, as their place of burial, or report of crash could not be determined.

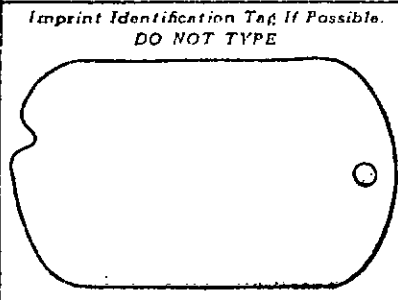

We were unable to locate the remaining five (5) deceased as the Russian officer would not permit us to open any of the other graves at this time. This row and the whole row behind listed as unknowns were French. We later disinterred one hundred eight (108) from these graves and found them to be all French through their clothing and identification tags.

In the New Alstadt cemetery in Brandenburg we found the remains of one (1) American deceased buried in a coffin. The remains were in fair condition clothed in OD uniform. No identification could be established.

- Grave # 19 Name on metal plate "Campbell"
No identification tags.
- Grave # 23 Name on metal plate "Holomo"
No identification tags.
- Grave # 25 Name on metal plate "Gaxtola"
Here again one identification tag was found around neck of remains, which read HENRY W. HUGHES, O-1114032.
- Grave # 26 Name on metal plate "Owens"
One identification tag around neck
PAUL E. OWENS, 35435206
- Grave # 55 Name on metal plate "Savia"
No identification tags!
- Grave # 56 through 60 the names on the metal plates were as follows "Hagen, Herron, Hughes, Willert and Stanley" but when we disinterred these graves we found them all to be French. The remains were dressed in French clothing and had identification tags around their necks. Though we had already taken Hughes from the grave marked for Gaxtola and Herron from the grave marked for Smith.
