Result of examination:

An examination of specimen Q78 disclosed that it is a man's yellow gold 1942 high school class ring. In the center of the face of the ring appears the letter "M" which undoubtedly is the initial of the high school. The engraved initials of the purchaser of the ring, "IGJ", appear on the inside of the band of the ring. It is to be noted that these initials have been engraved into the exhibit. The ring band on the inside also contains the notation "Green Croftertone" which was probably placed there by the manufacturer of Q78.

The manufacturer of the class ring could not be determined with certainty. It appears that it may be a product of the Green Company, 1016 Walnut Street, Kansas City, Missouri who specialize in making school and
