1. In compliance with 1st Ind, basic communication, investigation has been completed. T/3 Ray K. Stevens, now with the QM Section, Seine Section, TSFET stated that remains of Unknown X-67 were originally found at the 365th Station Hospital at 63 Blvd Victor Hugo. He was working with Capt Thomas W. Edwards at the time the body was first located. T/3 Stevens cannot definitely certify that the remains came from the above named hospital, but he feels fairly certain that this was the case. Investigating personnel who visited the 365th Station Hospital and the American Hospital of Paris, (both of these hospitals are at the same location, 63 Blvd Victor Hugo) contacted Madame Victorin of the American Hospital of Paris. She could furnish no information as to the place of death or by what means the body reached the hospital. She added that a state of confusion existed due to the fact that death occurred only a few days after the liberation of Paris and that there was still scattered German resistance in the area at that time. A check of the records fail to show the admission of either a Kurt Burns or a Burns Kurt. Certificate stating this fact is inclosed herewith.

2. Seine Section Grave Registration personnel under the supervision of Capt Thomas W. Edwards, QMC, took the body, believed to have been Kurt Burns (Unknown X-67) from the 365th Station Hospital to the Morgue of the IO8th General Hospital at Clichy, France. Remains were embalmed under the supervision of a French mortician, Mr. Louis Darbier. His office is located at 2 Rue des Dardanelles (Porte des Ternes) Paris XVIIe. Records in Mr. Darbier's office were checked and it was found that the following named men were embalmed the same day that he prepared the remains of Unknown X-67 for burial:

Richard E. George, Pvt 31515176
Summer M. Webber, Cpl 32064526
Glover L. Williams, T/5 20409690

Mr. Darbier was unable to furnish any clues that would aid in establishing identity. Remains were taken from the IO8th Gen Hospital morgue to Suresnes Cemetery for burial by Seine Section Grave Registration personnel. A morgue tag with the name Kurt Burns evidently attached to the body at the time of death provided the only means of identification when G.R. Form No I was initiated.

3. No other information is available. Records in this headquarters have been thoroughly checked, but nothing can be found to clarify identity.

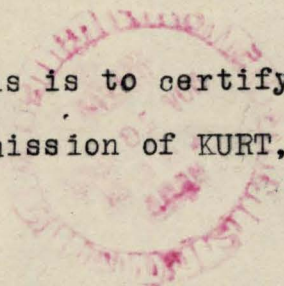

1. Reference is made to Reports of Burial, received at this headquarters for Burns KURF, rank and serial number unknown, previously buried at Suresnes American Military Cemetery, but now interred at Solers American Military Cemetery, Plot E, Row 3, Grave 60.

2. Both reports state that identification was established by a paper tag attached to the body.

3. Information is furnished that the records of A G Casualty Branch and the Central Machine Records Unit have been searched for a Kurt BURTS or a Burns KURF, without success. There is no record of any individual by such name in this theater.

4. It is requested that the remains be disinterred and very carefully checked for any means of identification that may be found. It is noted that the Report of Burial for the internment at Suresnes states the remains had been embalmed. Every effort should be made to secure clear and complete fingerprints. The enclosed check lists and tooth charts will be completed in every detail, and forwarded to this headquarters in quadruplicate.

5. A complete description will be made of the manner in which the grave had been marked and what means of identification was found buried with the remains.

6. In the event positive identity cannot be established, request an Unknown X number be assigned to the remains, all records at your headquarters, the marking of the grave and the information buried with the remains adjusted accordingly and this headquarters notified when this has been accomplished. Corrected copies of the Report of Burial will be submitted in quadruplicate.

7. Request reply by indorsement to reach this headquarters not later than 2 May 1945.
