



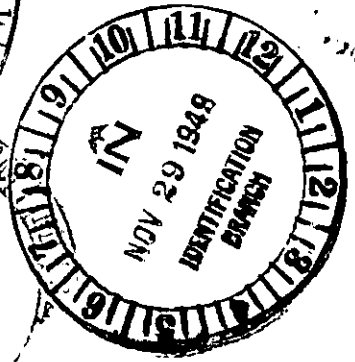
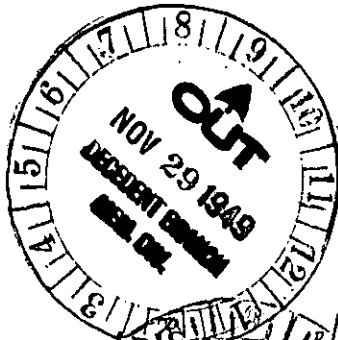

<p>1. Reference is made to your Comment No. 2 (dtd 25 Oct 49) in which it was requested that in view of the receipt of toothchart for Unknown X-1149, a recheck be made with unrecovered personnel whose deaths occurred in Europe between the date of inauguration of the Current Death Program and the date of recovery of remains designated as X-1149 and to reply from this Branch by Comment No. 3 dated 2 Nov 49.</p> <p>2. Five enlisted men were missing in Europe during the period in question and in view of the fact that one of these had been eliminated by fingerprint comparison, dental charts and physical description of four were needed in order to comply with your request. The dental charts and physical descriptions requested have not been received and no comparisons have been made on this basis; however, in view of the attached report of fingerprint comparison which states that the fingerprints on WD QMC Form 1042 for X-1149 are not identical with fingerprints of any of the four enlisted men who had not been previously definitely eliminated, all papers pertaining to X-1149 which you forwarded with your Comment No. 2 are returned herewith.</p> <p>3. In view of the fact that all unrecovered personnel whose deaths occurred in Europe subsequent to the inauguration of the Current Death Program and prior to recovery of the remains designated as Unknown X-1149, have now been definitely eliminated by means of fingerprint comparison, it is recommended that Identification Branch take any further action in connection with identification of X-1149 and that, in the event the remains are not identified, disposition be effected under the World War II Dead Program. In this connection reference is also made to Comment No. 1 from this Branch dated 23 Nov 49 forwarding to your Branch a copy of radio MC IN 76274 dated 21 Nov 49.</p>

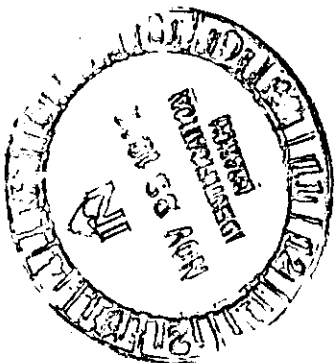

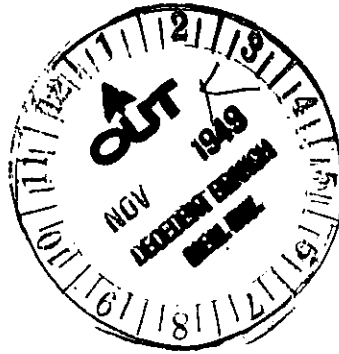
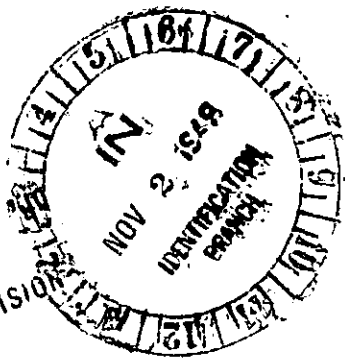

1. Reference is made to the case of Unknown X-1149, file attached. It will be noted that first actions pertaining to identification of X-1149 were taken by R&R Branch; however, in view of the fact that Report of Interment (WD QMC Form 1042) showed date of death as "Est July 1946", the case was turned over to Cemeterial Branch for further action.

2. Cemeterial Branch took up with Army Identification Section, FBI, by telephone and by letter, dated 10 July 1947, the matter of identification from fingerprints shown on Form 1042. Under date of 29 July 1947, a negative reply was received.

3. In the meantime Cemeterial Branch dispatched a cable (WCL 34598), dated 15 July 1947, to Eucom. This cable advised that information had been received from FBI that fingerprints on Form 1042 for X-1149 were not identical with those of Louis T. Young, Pvt, 43 006 311, who was reported missing near Mannheim Germany on 4 July 1946, (This information had been obtained by R&R Branch prior to the time the case was turned over to Cemeterial Branch), and requested this office be advised as follows:

- a. whether question as to possibility of X-1149 being remains of Louis T. Young originated in European Command.
- b. On what basis death of X-1149 was estimated to have occurred in July 46.
- c. whether information available to theater was sufficient to indicate the possibility of X-1149 being remains of a specific individual.
- d. whether check of records of personnel missing in European Command could lead to clue which might assist in identifying X-1149.

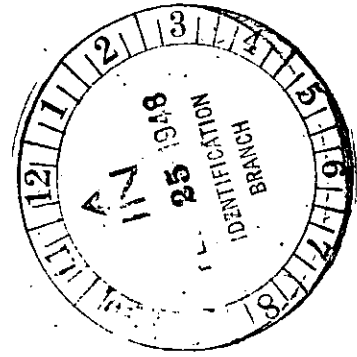
4. Reply was received by cable from CO, AGRC, Paris, under date of 23 July 1947, and stated that:

- a. Officer who recovered X-1149 stated that Louis T. Young was reported to have drowned in the area from which X-1149 was recovered; therefore, EUCOM had requested that fingerprints of X-1149 be compared with fingerprints of Louis T. Young.
- b. Remains X-1149 were recovered 7 Aug 46 from Rhine River near Speyer, Germany, and it was the opinion of the medical officer who examined the remains that death occurred approximately two (2) weeks prior to recovery.
- c. No specific information was available as to identity of X-1149.
- d. List of personnel which might be associated with casualty had been compiled and would be forwarded at the earliest practicable date.

5. This branch received a letter from EUCOM, dated 18 Dec 47, with inclosures giving specific data re all unrecovered personnel in that command during the period

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found.
