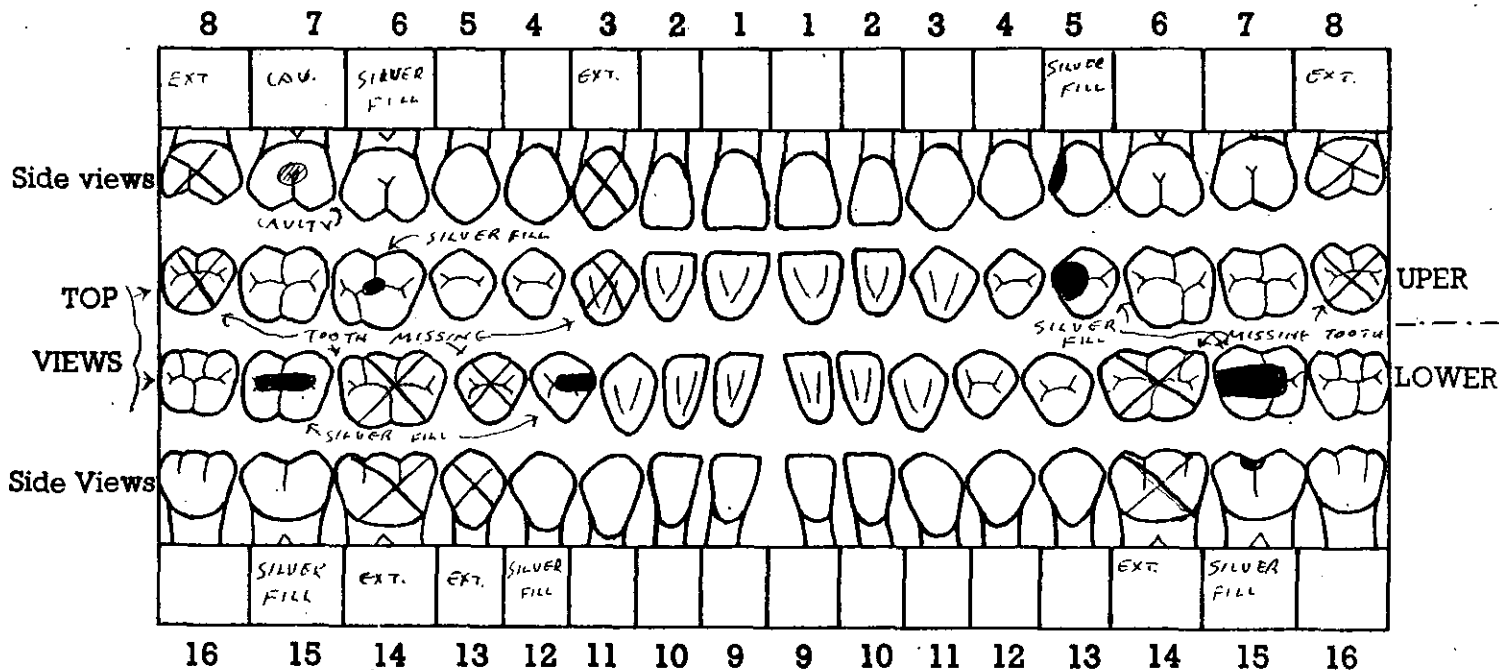

Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. He also said that; A) the first dead American buried in the camp cemetery was Gene Hecht, a Flyer found in a four motored bomber that crashed near the Lager. The information and burial records was forwarded to the International Red Cross, in Geneva, Switzerland. B) He also stated that he ordered a funeral for one American Flyer who was found after the plane crashed near Langendorf, Germany. (I 51-N57 - 1/250,000) The body was badly burned and decomposed. The remains were found by Christian Friedrich, living in Langendorf, Germany in Oct. of 1943. Information on the exact time and place of death of these men is impossible to obtain because all the records were burned at the time the camp was liberated. We estimated several dates of death and burial by the bodies at the cemetery in rotation by dates of death or burial in the plots from what we can piece together by the date on some of the crosses.

Through the disinterment of these men we were able to gather a little information. One man was a corporal in the 11th Armored Division, this was verified by the presence of his stripes and his shoulder insignia on his shirt.

From the information that we could gather we found that some of these men were members of the Fourth Armored Division. They were part of the task force that was ordered to liberate this labor in the last part of March, 1945. This corresponds with the date of burial on some of the men. It is impossible to determine exactly which men were members of this task force but it is certain that part of them were from the task force.

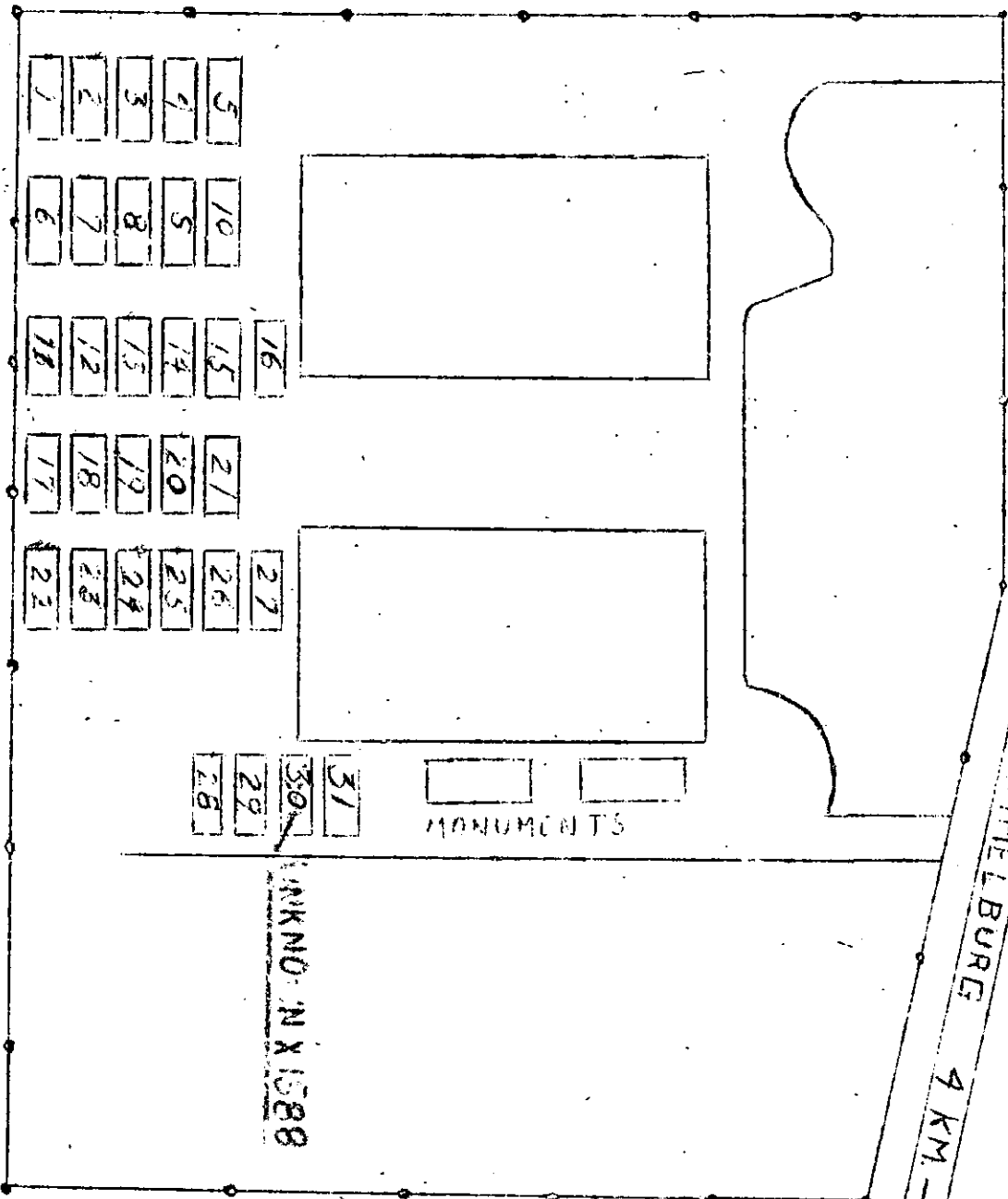

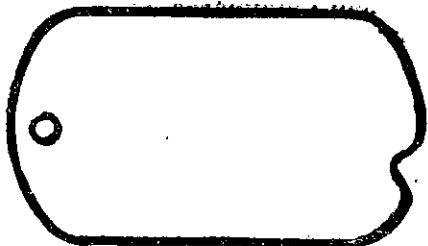

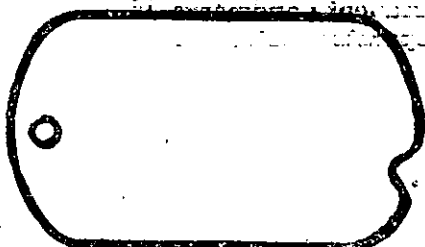
