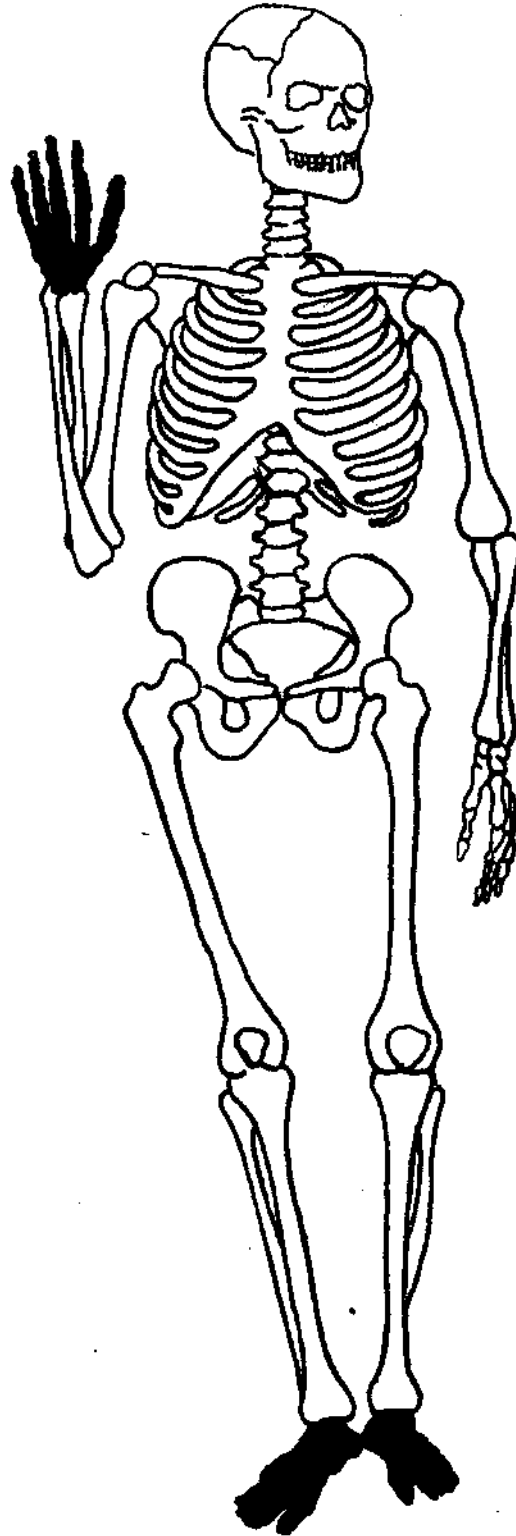

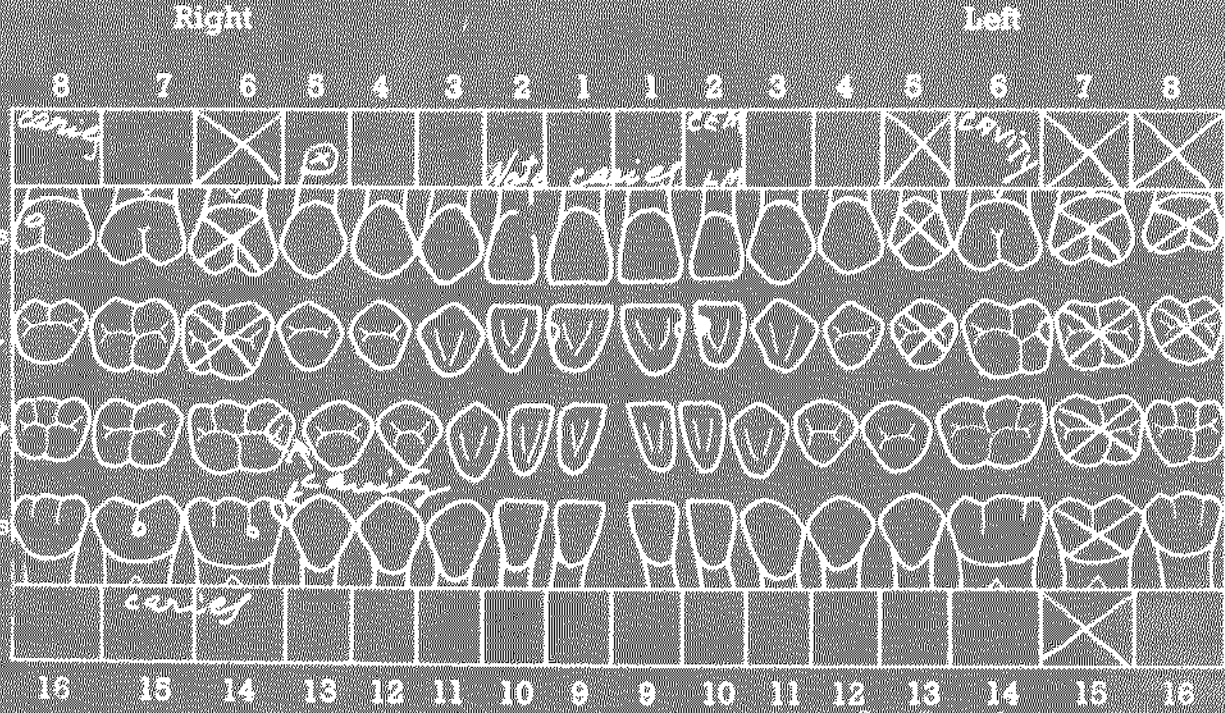

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. See reverse side for illustrations.

L 2 has a soft cement filling and the cavity in P 14 has remains of the same material.

The crown of P 2 is completely decayed away, there is a pocket in the alveolar bone surrounding the root indicating an abscess.

Heavy calculus. Heavy recession of bone surrounding roots of upper molars.

Medium sized brown stained crowded and very poorly aligned teeth.

SUBJECT: Unidentified Dead Man

TO : Commanding Officer, 180th General Hospital, APO 513, U.S. Army.
(Attention: Pathology)

1. The body of an unknown man was found at approximately 0700 hours on 18 July 1945 in the Lahn River, about one half mile south of Marburg, Germany. The only clothing that the man had on was a pair of khaki Army underwear shorts and a U. S. Army web belt. Questioning of people in the immediate vicinity of our unit and other units was made, but failed to reveal the identity of this man. There are two rings present on one hand. These have been left in place because swelling was such that it prevented their removal. It was impossible to determine whether any inscription was present on the inside of the rings. Further investigation is being made, including the search of the river bank to find any clothing or dog tags.

2. Examination of the body upon recovery showed that rigor mortis was present to a moderate degree. The skin was quite wrinkled. There is a moderate amount of odor from the body, with some bloody fluid oozing from the nose and mouth. I was estimate that the man had died approximately thirty-six (36) hours prior to the recovery of the body.

3. Due to possible questionable circumstances and the lack of identification it is felt that a complete post mortem examination is necessary, including the taking of fingerprints and, if possible, as photograph of the body. Any further information obtained will be sent to you without delay. Request that five (5) copies of the post mortem report be sent to this office at the earliest possible time.
