The remains of X-552 were recovered on the east bank of Lake Starnberg (Wurm See) directly across from the Starnberg Red Cross, Germany. The deceased had probably drowned in Lake Starnberg.

The deceased was clad in swim trunks. Fingerprints taken from deceased were twice submitted to OCMG for comparison with negative results.

Tooth chart for X-552 has been compared with all casualties associated with Starnberg Lake with negative results.
