1. Reference is made to letter this office dated 20 September 1944, copy enclosed. It is noted that deceased's serial number is incorrect as shown in subject of basic communication. Correct number is 37,529,128.

2.a. Deceased was killed by artillery shell which struck at the juncture of the turret and hull of the tank, the round penetrating the armor and decapitating soldier. No burial of any kind was made by this organization due to the necessity for immediate departure of the unit from the area in order not to jeopardize the lives of others.

b. The location of the body was six (6) kilometers Southeast of Luneville, France; Map coordinates: V 140955, French Lambert (1/100,000), section 15 G.

c. War Department Serial No. of the tank in which deceased met his death was W 4062890.

1. Reference paragraph 2, 8th indorsement, original letter, copy attached as inclosure, was forwarded through APO channels.

2. Reference paragraph 3, 7th indorsement the following information is furnished.

a. Squadron S-4 returned to the scene of action during the period 24 - 28 September 1944 with the intention of checking for any equipment that might be salvaged. Tank in question had been burned to such an extent that it was of no value whatever.

b. Crew members surviving are as follows and are still on duty with Troop E, this Squadron:

- (1) Sgt Marion S. Rogers, 34665132
- (2) Tec 4 Ernest L. Nelson, 37551837
- (3) Pfc Harry C. Morse, 34664453


c. If the tank was evacuated, the name of the Ordnance unit is unknown.

d. (1) Enlisted men tank crew survivors listed in sub-paragraph b above are unable to furnish any further information.

(2) At the time our S-4 was in the area, there were soldiers from a Graves Registration Unit to whom he spoke in regard to the remains of a body that was still in the tank. The body had been burned so thoroughly that the only portion left was the torso which was also badly burned. Our S-4 stated to the Graves Registration man that this portion could be what was left of Campbell as he was the only member of the crew to be killed although the position of the remains was not what it should have been. Since there was absolutely no identification at hand, the Graves Registration men said they would have to bury the remains as unknown.

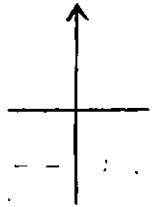
