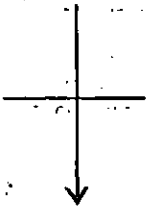

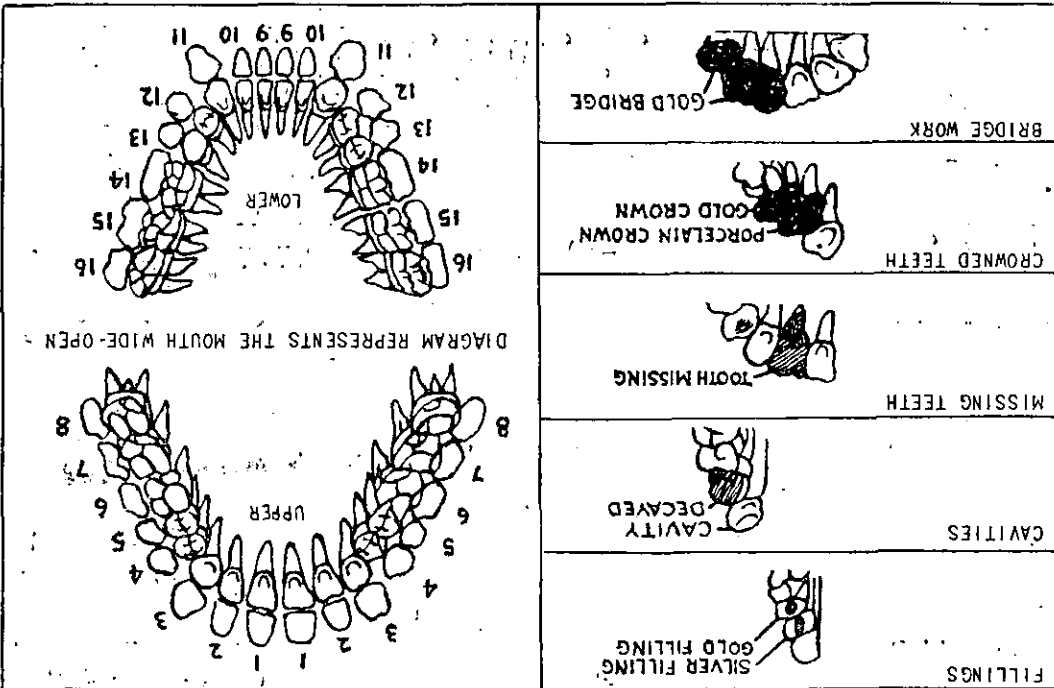


DIAGRAM REPRESENTS THE MOUTH WIDE-OPEN
