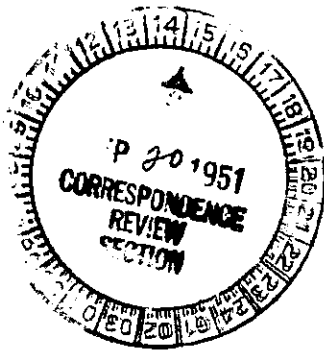
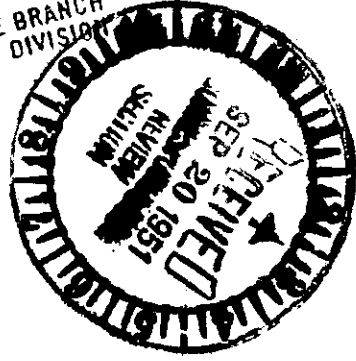

SKELETAL CHART

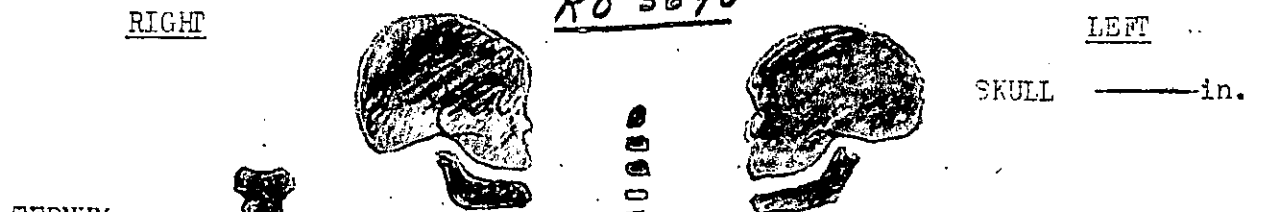

PROCESSING NARRATIVE

1. All available cases recovered from LEONADING CEMETERY have been reprocessed simultaneously to determine the following:

- a. Proper segregation of remains.
- b. Proper placement of teeth.
- c. Evidence of bone fracture or breaks.
- d. Age and height estimates.
- e. Possible association with unresolved casualties.
- f. Possible consolidation of the four extra remains involved.

2. Excellent association has been established on the following cases and individual identity should be established as shown:

Teeth for STUEVE articulate with portions of skull. Separate portions of skull articulate with the complete vertebral column but definite articulation can not be established between teeth and vertebral column. No contradictory evidence.

Complete articulation of teeth for COMPTON with remains. No contradictory evidence.

Teeth for LOWRY are in complete articulation with this remains. All factors are favorable for association with LOWRY but definitely non-favorable for present identification as LUBINSKI. No contradictory evidence noted in association with LOWRY.

Teeth are intact in skull portion, but missing first cervical vertebra prevents definite articulation with this remains. Age, height, and weight factors prevent the association of this remains with any other unidentified casualty. No contradictory evidence.

Teeth for KRAMER originally found with mass burial X-6802 A, B, C, and D, are now placed with this case. No articulation between teeth and remains due to missing portions. Age, height, and weight factors of this case prevent an association of this case with any other casualty of this group. No contradictory evidence.

Teeth for RILEY are intact in skull portion. Missing base of skull and first cervical vertebra prevent the definite articulation between teeth and this remains. This remains has the youngest, shortest, and lightest characteristics of any remains in this group thus preventing an association with any casualty except RILEY. No contradictory evidence.

3. The next cases are associated with casualties for definite reasons as indicated, but proof of identities are not as conclusive as in the foregoing group. Associations are as follows:

Teeth for RAUEN originally found with KING (X-6810), a crew member with RAUEN, are now placed with this case. Articulation between teeth and remains is not possible due to missing skull base and the first five cervical vertebrae. The height estimate appears short for RAUEN but is based only on the humerus and femur, thus giving a height estimate less than actual height.

Teeth for BROWN originally found with mass burial X-6802 A, B, C, and D, are now placed with this remains. No articulation can be established due to missing portions.

Teeth for STURGEON were recovered with BROWN (X-6596), a crew member with STURGEON. No articulation can be established between teeth and remains due to missing skull portions and vertebrae.

Teeth for LUBINSKI were originally found with this remains and do articulate with the skull and first cervical vertebra. Further articulation can not be established as the next three cervical vertebrae are missing. During the original processing, portions of teeth for OSBORNE and SIMPSON were also found with this remains, thus indicating that this case is a crew member of OSBORNE and SIMPSON. All crew members of that plane are accounted for except LUBINSKI, thus corroborating this association. Given height of 5'6" was at age of 17 years and 7 months, but date of death was two years later, allowing for additional growth.

4. Case X-6661 cannot be associated with any casualty not already accounted for during previous and current processing.

5. Case X-6802-B, appears to be one of the two skeletons originally recovered in excess of the twenty U S World War II casualties buried in Leonding. A survey made of the enlisted personnel of MBU No. 3, who disinterred this cemetery, disclosed that twenty-two bodies were recovered from that single plot in various positions criss-crossed on top of one another. Twenty remains were recovered with either underwear or outer clothing, but two skeletons were recovered without clothing. Subsequent investigation revealed that one of the skeletons was actually the remains of a woman and was returned to Leonding for reburial. None of the U S casualties could have been reduced to a skeletal state in the period between dates of interment (16 October 1944 and 25 February 1945), and date of disinterment (16 July 1946). With one additional skeleton to be accounted for there is only one case "X-6802-B" which consists of dry and eroded skeletal parts which can be associated with a "skeleton". In addition, X-6802-B represents a deceased having an age of 27-30 years, which can not be associated with any casualty in this group. ~~All~~ All facts indicate that case X-6802-B represents a remains of other than U S deceased.

6. Case X-6802-C, was represented only by the distal half of left tibia and middle shaft of left fibula, which could not be consolidated with any remains present during this reprocessing. This case has now been designated CIL Remains # 4789.

7. Case X-6802-D, was represented only by the proximal halves of right ulna and right radius, which could not be consolidated with any remains present during this reprocessing. This case has now been designated CIL Remains # 4790.

8. A portion of shaft of left tibia found with case X-6802-B, was not consistent with that case and could not be associated with any of the other cases present. This portion has now been designated CIL Remains # 4791.

9. Current processing of case William W. LEE, revealed an additional portion of teeth for LEE (right mandible), which completes that set of teeth. In addition, a middle portion of mandible for another deceased was recovered from case LEE, which could not be associated with any of the cases now available. Possible associations were considered with cases TARINI, STURGEON, and RILEY, but comparison with those teeth revealed that association was impossible due to difference in size, shape, and coloring. This portion of mandible has now been designated CIL Remains # 4792.

10. CIL Remains # 3458, has been eliminated by complete consolidation with case TARINI.

11. CIL Remains # 3936, # 4780, and # 4782, are unchanged. No association could be made with any of the cases now available.

12. Roman Catholic Priest records (Tome VIII - page 170), at Leonding cemetery, indicate that one (1) U S plane crashed and seven (7) casualties were buried on 16 October 1944. Two (2) casualties, KRAMER and FARQUAR, were known to be in this group. It is noted that all available casualties from that plane are severely burned with the exception of LEE. As only two could be identified out of seven, at the time of the crash, it is an indication that all crew members, with the possible exception of LEE, crashed with the plane which then caught fire. In contrast, it is noted that on 25 February 1945, two (2) additional U S planes crashed, but members of these crews were parachuting. Of this group of casualties, twelve (12) of the thirteen (13) were identified at the time of the crash. All available casualties from these two planes show no evidence of burning, are less mangled, more complete, more intact and more easily identified during current processing. This is an indication that these two planes did not burn, and that casualties from these planes should not show evidence of burning.

1. Reference is made to paragraph 8, basic communication.
2. Although the information submitted indicates the possibility that remains recovered from Leoding Cemetery may be associated with deceased reported interred in St. Martin Cemetery, the available evidence is not sufficient to substantiate any identification without additional supporting data.
3. The remains of Unknown X-6658 St. Avold were recovered from St. Martin Cemetery, however, the teeth placed with the remains were recovered from Leoding Cemetery as a part of a mass burial designated Unknown X-6810 St. Avold. The tooth chart, with the exception of the portion of left mandible, is comparable with dental records for Sgt. Rauon. The processing report does not indicate that the mandibular portions articulate with the skull or that the portions occlude with the maxilla. There is no evidence to indicate that the remains were co-mingled during initial recovery and interment in the two civilian cemeteries.
4. The fragmentary condition of partial remains indicates that certain Unknown remains may be portions of the additional remains involved, not included in the simultaneous reprocessing. Processing reports are not available for associated remains identified as:

Should processing indicate that the remains may not be properly segregated or that a consolidation of certain portions of the additional remains involved is possible, it is requested
