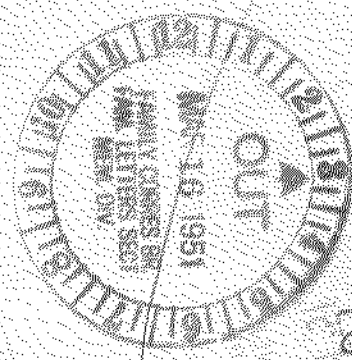

The records pertaining to Unknown X-6756, Plot HHHH, Row 10, Grave 116, USMC Saint Avold, France. have been reviewed in accordance with 159, SH 830-110-5, DA, dated 3 March 1949, and it is the opinion of the Board of Review, appointed by par 4, SO No. 139, this headquarters, dated 15 November 1950, that sufficient evidence is not available to establish the identity of the deceased concerned, and it is recommended these remains be classified as unidentifiable.

UNIDENTIFIABLE REMAINS

Unknown X-6756 St Avold (HHHH-10-116)  
(Prev ident as POPE, Ronald C., 11 097 437)

A/C # 42-102613 with nine (9) crewmembers manifested crashed 27 May 1944, in the community of Nonnenweier, Germany. Three (3) crewmembers were RMC; EVANS, DUFFY and PETERSON, and six (6) were listed as casualties.

The following crewmembers of subject aircraft have been identified:

NORTON, Joseph P.	0 809 698	(X-6750 St Avold)
KCPF, Donald G.	37 653 407	(X-6647 St Avold)
KOVACS, Stephen (NMI)	32 475 945	(ID Tags)

Cemetery records at Nonnenweier and statements of civilians indicate five (5) Americans from the crashed aircraft were buried in a mass grave in the local cemetery. Cemetery records indicate four (4) deceased were buried on 27-29 May 1944, while a few days later another body from the same crew was found in the Rhein river and buried with his four comrades in the local cemetery. German green burial cards for Kovacs, and Kopf on file, this headquarters, show burial in a common grave in Nonnenweier Cemetery. No other Americans were buried in the local cemetery.

On 14 June 1946, AGRS disinterred the five (5) remains and reburied them in the USMC St Avold; one as known, and four as Unknowns.

Unknown X-6756 was identified as POPE, Ronald C., by this headquarters, however the identification was disapproved by O.IG since two (2) crewmembers were in an unresolved status, and there remained only one Unknown from Nonnenweier cemetery with which the decedents could be associated.

Simultaneous processing of the remains identified as Pope with the following remains was accomplished 21 December 1950:

X-6645 St Avold  
X-8180 Neuville (Prev CIL # 3467 St Avold)

Reprocessing of the remains identified as Pope revealed that the age (approx 30) compared negatively with age of Pope (22-23). Height (5' 11-1/8") and shoe size (11 D) were in disagreement with height and shoe size of Pope - 5' 9" and 8 1/2 D. Physical characteristics of this deceased also compared negatively with like data for crewmembers in the custody of this headquarters.

In view of the above, it was concluded that the remains previously identified as Pope, excluding the teeth, which compare favorably with dental record of Pope, should be declared Unidentifiable. Accordingly, an L. O. was issued requesting that the teeth be removed and placed with the remains of Unknown X-8180 Neuville. Unknowns X-8180 Neuville and X-6645 St Avold, have been identified as the "Recoverable Remains" of Honsowetz, Joiner and Pope, thus accounting for all crewmembers of A/C # 42-102613.

The remains of T/SGT Ronald G. POPE was reprocessed as directed in E.O. #3173.

On examination it was found that mandibular fragments with teeth in place recovered with these remains agree favorably with POPE. However, there is no articulation between the teeth and the remains. The estimated age of the subject remains is 25-30 years, which is in entire disagreement with the actual age of POPE (22 years).

It is possible that the torso and the mandibular fragments belong to two separate individuals. In view of these facts, the remains cannot be considered as homogeneous.

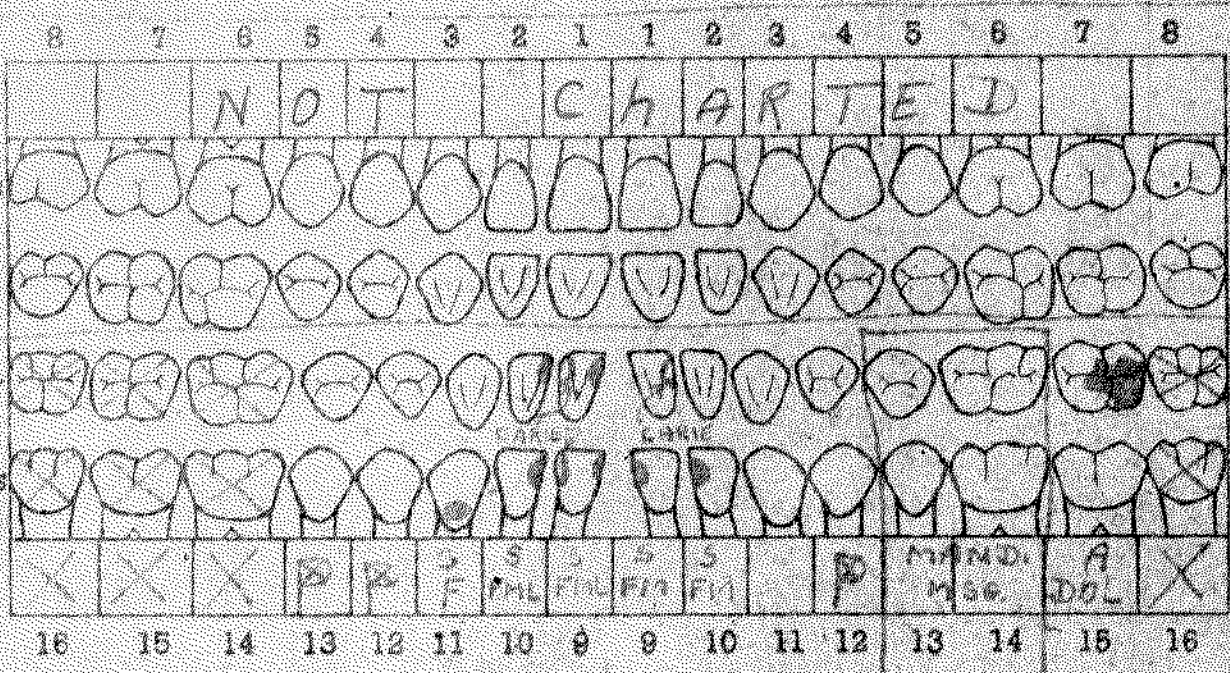

Civilian cemetery records indicate that all of these casualties were interred in a common grave and were the only Americans interred in Nonnenweiler cemetery.

Three casualties, disinterred from same common grave with above Unknowns, have been individually identified.


X-6756 was previously individually identified as T/Sgt POPE by tooth chart comparison, and similarity of height. OQMG did not approve this identification and requested reinvestigation.

Latest processing by an accredited anthropologist confirms the presence of T/Sgt Pope's teeth with X-6756, but indicates that the teeth and the rest of the remains may not belong to the same individual. It is therefore impossible to confirm the individual identification of T/Sgt Pope.

X-8180 and X-8242 were previously identified as either/or Sgt Honsowetz and S/Sgt Joiner.

X-6756 is now being included with X-8180 and X-8242 in a Group Identification of either/or the three casualties T/Sgt POPE, Sgt HONSO WETZ and S/Sgt JOINER, since the condition of the remains precludes individual identifications.

## STATEMENT

Georg Karl  
former secretary

Nonnerweiler, 29 May 1946

Subject: Crash of an American airplane in Nonnerweiler on the  
27th of May 1944.

---

According to the statements in the documents of the town hall which I made concerning the crash of an American airplane, I know the following: A big formation of enemy bombers coming from the West flew over our community. Suddenly a German fighter attacked the formation at a great height west of our community. I observed a plane separate from the others and circle over our town. Suddenly the plane crashed burning on the last house at the entrance of the town (from the direction of Kippenweiler). Eight to ten parachutes were observed at this time. According to the statement of the pilot of a German fighter, the bomber was a "Boeing-Fortress." A short time after the crash a small bomb exploded; a large bomb exploded later. Great damage was done.

Several hundred planes passed over our town during this time. The above mentioned plane belonged to the first or middle bomber formation. Each formation had about 60 planes.

I still remember that August Heitz, Wittenweiler, saved one airman of the crew, who dropped by parachute into the Rhine. That airman and another one were taken prisoner in Wittenweiler and stayed a short time in our town before they were taken by the military authorities of Lahr. (Col. Anders) It is possible that Karl Heinrich Frenk of Nonnenweiler still knows the name of one of the prisoners. The wreckage of the airplane was later removed by a special command of the airdrome of Freiburg. The plane was completely destroyed and burnt.

The policeman Weber now living in Ottenheim joined in the investigations. Weber should know further details.

**S T A T E M E N T**

Nonnerweiler, 25th May 1946

Barber Karl Kern (former undertaker) of  
Nonnerweiler, Mühlenstr. 269, reports:

-----

On the 27th of May 1944, an American airplane crashed in our community. Two men of the crew parachuted, but were found dead. Near the crashed plane, two other Americans were found badly burned. These four soldiers were buried by members of the German armed forces in our cemetery without caskets. The body of another American soldier of this crew was taken out of the Rhine eight days later. I buried this body in the cemetery in the same grave as the other four soldiers. Personal papers and identification tags were probably taken by German soldiers and sent to the army information office of Lahr, where Major Anders was commanding.

I remember that one of the Americans was named Josef Stoll of New York and another was named Louis Kopf of Chicago.

I still remember the names mentioned above. They were indicated to me by Georg Karl, who saw the two identification tags. Louis Kopf drowned in the Rhine. He was a big, tall man, with black hair and dark skin. Kopf was buried singly. I shall be able to identify him exactly. Josef Stoll had his head smashed. He was wearing a seal-ring as well as Kopf.

Stoll, too, was a big and strong man. His body was not burned, but his skull was fractured. The two other bodies, the names of which are not known, were badly burnt. Stoll and the two burnt soldiers were buried on the 28th of May and Kopf on the 7th of June 1944,

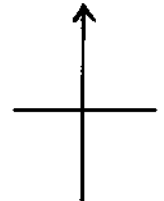
