



Team # 3, 95th QM Bn.(M) reached Halle on the night of 28th August 1946 and proceeded to the Gertrauden Civilian Cemetery, Halle, Germany (M 52 D 92 1/250,000) on the morning of the 29th August. Ten single graves were located which were marked by crosses with U.S.A., last name of American, and date of death. Disinterring opetations were started immediately.

The report of investigation stated that two other graves, 4/1227 and 4/1229 were American although marked by crosses as English. These were also disinterred. Between these two graves was one of the ten American graves, 4/1228, which was marked as Weinstein.

4/1227 contained one American flyer, marked as Gregori. 4/1228 contained one American flyer, marked as Weinstein. 4/1229 contained one American flyer, marked as Unknown, but who had the identification tag of Bernhard Weinstein.



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

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
