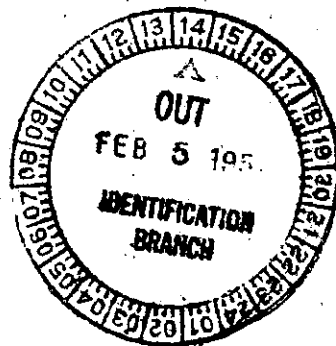

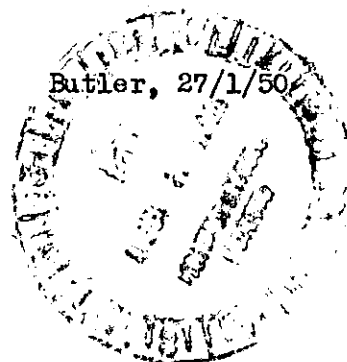

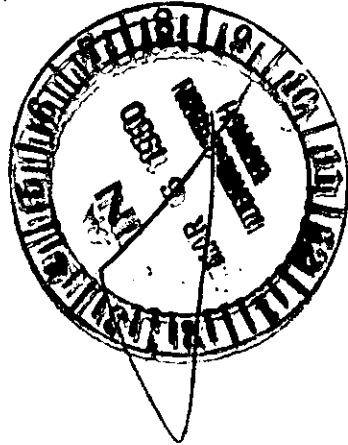

1. The remains of X-7834 were recovered from the civilian cemetery at Hochmutting, Germany, along with numerous other American known and unknown deceased. These remains were segregated from a mass burial of three, that was shipped to USMC St Avold under the evacuation numbers 1F6-(3F9025A) and 1F7-(3F9025B). 1F6-(3F9025A) was redesignated X-7834 and 1F7-(3F9025B) became X-7832. A later reprocessing of the subject deceased revealed a third remains. These remains were designated X-13207 and were later consolidated with the remains of 2nd Lt John R. Julianelle, O-829918. An identification tag bearing the name and ASN of 3/Sgt Herbert D. Walton, 39286723, was found among the mass burial of these remains and is, at present, with the case papers on X-7834. Since six identified crew members of the air-craft of which Sgt Walton was a crew member were recovered from Hochmutting, it is believed that his remains were also interred there; however, the tooth charts for X-7832 and X-7834 compare negatively with the dental data on Sgt Walton and no other unknown deceased from that isolated grave location could be associated. Physical and dental data on unresolved casualties, reported missing within the Germany M-49 area, was checked against like data on X-7832 and X-7834; however, no reasonable comparison, that would possibly lead to the identification of the deceased, could be made.

2. In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that the case on X-7834 be declared UNIDENTIFIABLE.

3. The case on X-7832 is also in the process of being declared un-identifiable.

1. The remains of X-7834 were recovered from the civilian cemetery at Hochmutting, Germany, along with numerous other American known and unknown deceased. These remains were segregated from a mass burial of three, that was shipped to USMC St Avoird under the evacuation numbers 1F6-(3F9025A) and 1F7-(3F9025B). 1F6-(3F9025A) was redesignated X-7834 and 1F7-(3F9025B) became X-7832. A later reprocessing of the subject deceased revealed a third remains. These remains were designated X-13207 and were later consolidated with the remains of 2nd Lt John R. Julianelle, O-829918. An identification tag bearing the name and ASN of S/Sgt Herbert D. Walton, 39286723, was found among the mass burial of these remains and is, at present, with the case papers on X-7834. Since six identified crew members of the air-craft of which Sgt Walton was a crew member were recovered from Hochmutting, it is believed that his remains were also interred there; however, the tooth charts for X-7832 and X-7834 compare negatively with the dental data on Sgt Walton and no other unknown deceased from that isolated grave location could be associated. Physical and dental data on unresolved casualties, reported missing within the Germany M-49 area, was checked against like data on X-7832 and X-7834; however, no reasonable comparison, that would possibly lead to the identification of the deceased, could be made.

1. Reference is made to Corrected Report of Burial for Julianelle, John R., 2nd Lt. O-829918 (Previously X-6270 A) Plot X, Row 1, Grave 7, United States Military Cemetery, St. Avold, France.

2. In view of the fact that ID tags for Herbert D. Walton, a crew member of Julianelle's, were found with X-7832 and X-7834 St. Avold, and since the teeth charted on one of the five tooth charts (Incl 1) submitted for X-7832 and X-7834 agree with dental records for Julianelle, it is requested that an attempt be made to consolidate these teeth with the remains of X-6270 A. Upon completion of your action, it is further requested that new reprocess reports for X-7832 and X-7834 and Corrected tooth chart, showing action taken, be submitted to this Office at the earliest practicable date.

3. Case cited above will be suspended by this Office pending reply from your headquarters.

4. Forwarded herewith is additional dental information for Julianelle, OQMG Form 371 was forwarded your office 13 July 48.

ANTHROPOLOGICAL REPORT

In accordance with instructions contained in E. O. 2766 I have examined the remains specified therein and effected satisfactory segregation as requested.

In addition, the remains specified as X-13207 have been consolidated with the remains of Julianelle. Case X-13207 consisted of one right clavicle, 3 fragments of sternum, the 5th thoracic vertebra and a portion of the left ischium.

In the case of Julianelle the remains as now constituted exhibit a satisfactory homogeneity with positive articulation between the cranium and the post-cranial skeleton through the axis and the atlas. The right half of a mandible and 3 fragments of maxilla containing teeth which correspond with those charted for Julianelle, were transferred from case X-7834. Positive articulation of the right condyle of the mandible with the glenoid cavity, and of the maxilla fragments with the facial bones established the identity of these remains.

A description of the condition of the remains in case X-7834 will be found on the processing reports which are attached.

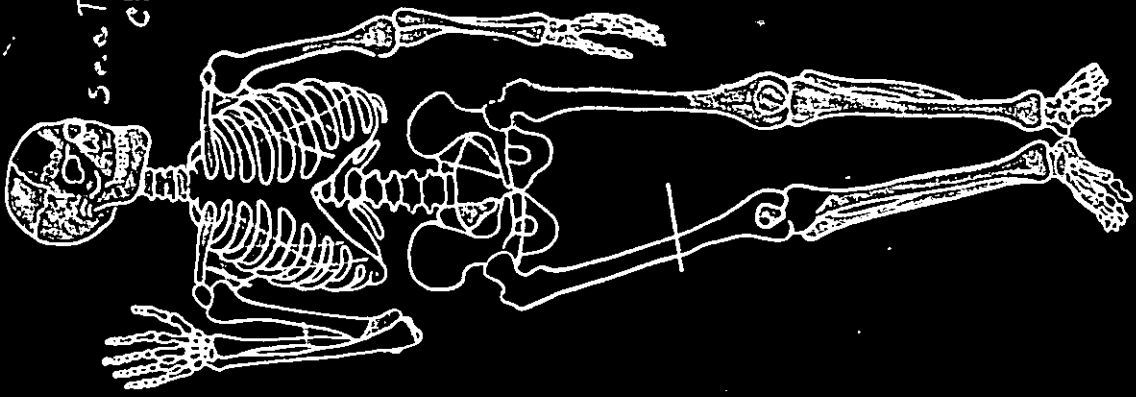

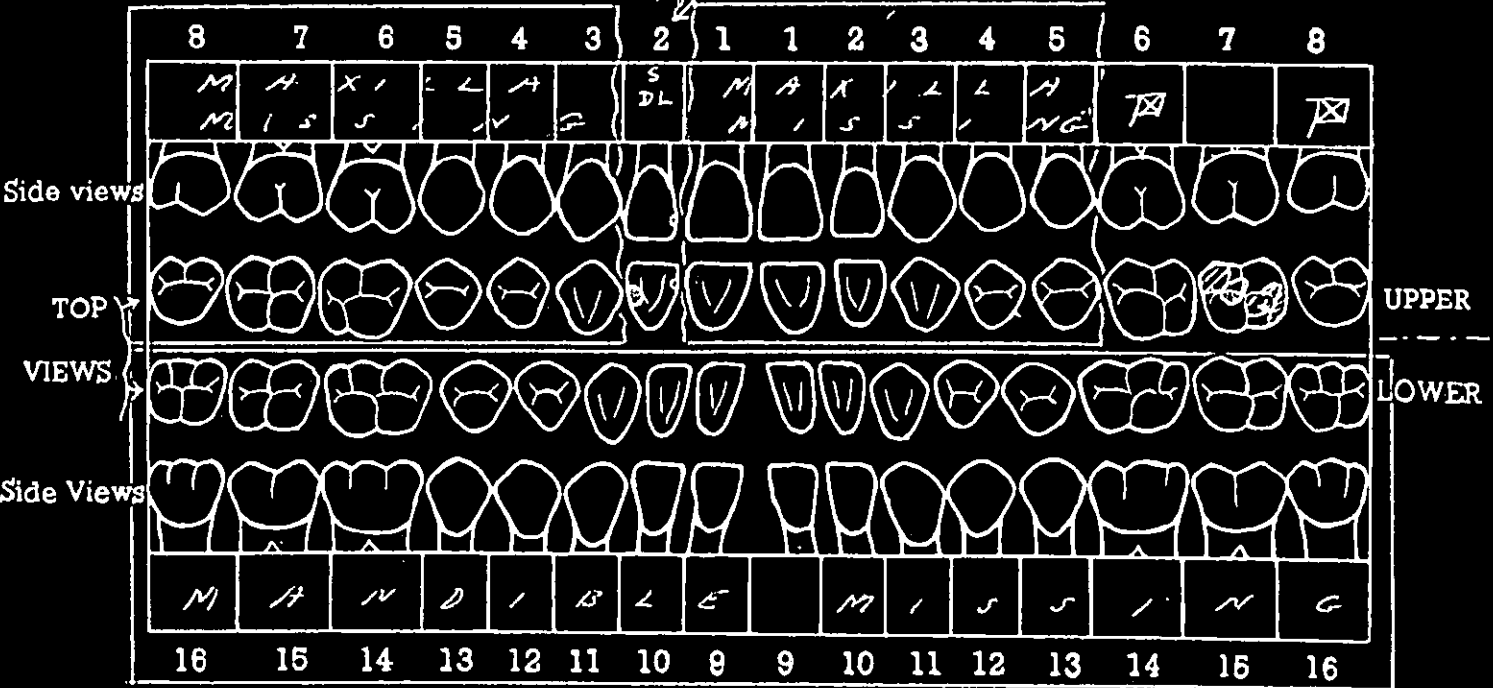

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 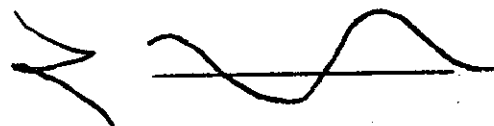

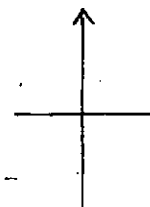
