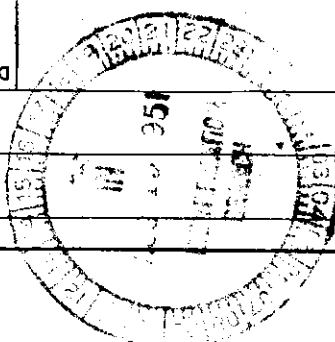

1. This office is conducting an investigation to determine the identity of a deceased member of our Armed Forces.

2. The deceased was wearing a field jacket which was lost by Milton WINTERBERG, ASN. 33 580 172, while he was attending school at O'Reilly General Hospital during the summer of 1943. A mackinaw found on the remains was marked "Joseph K. E----h, 38 690 012". It is considered possible that the soldier whose name was on the mackinaw might have been at your hospital at the same time as Milton Winterberg.
