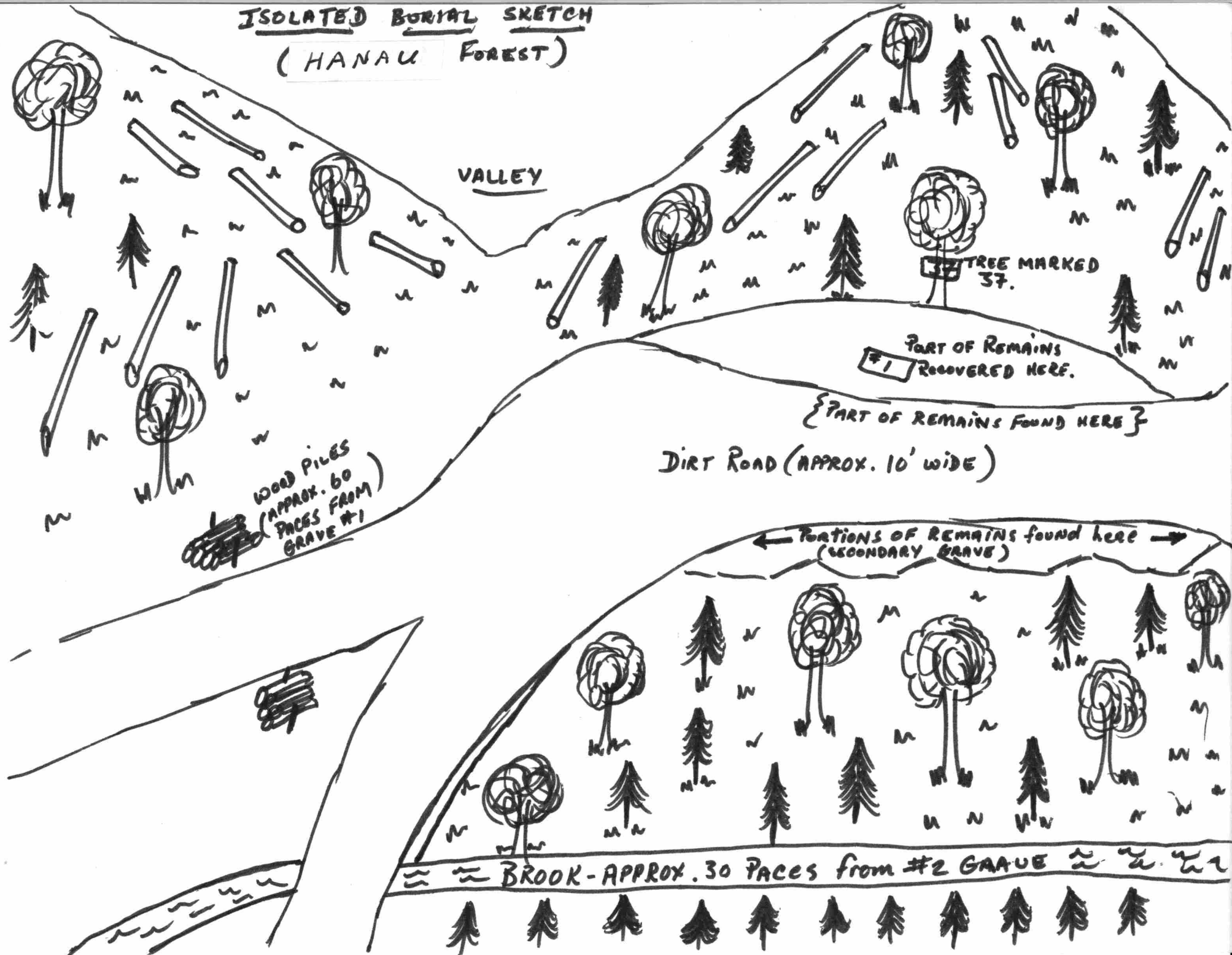

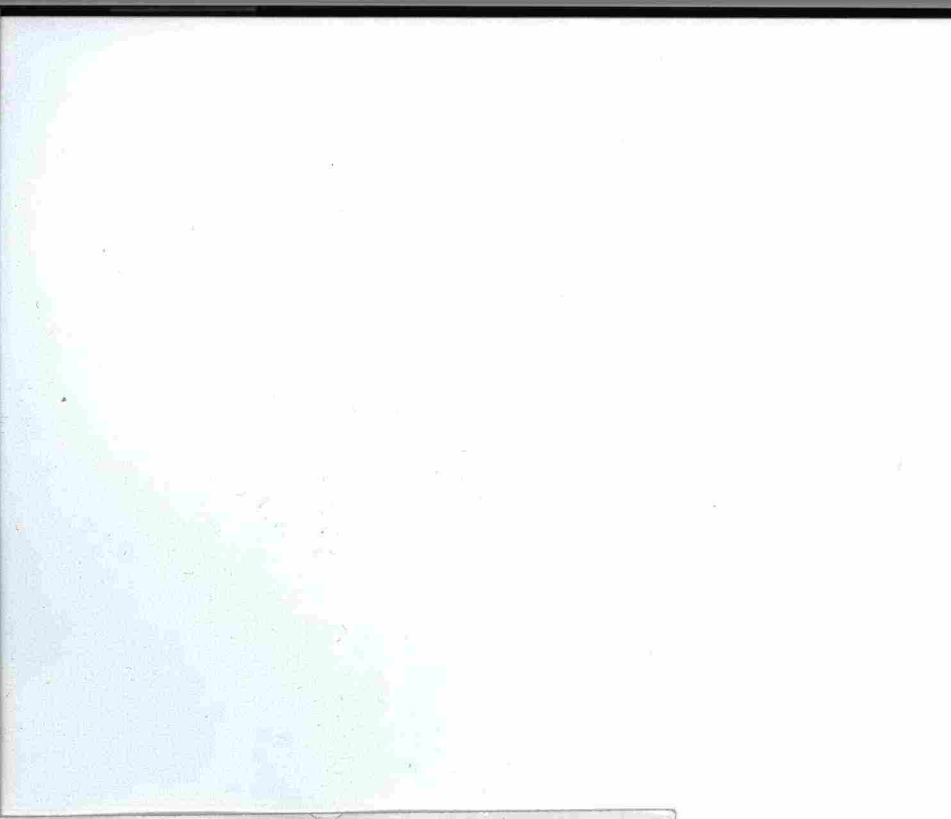


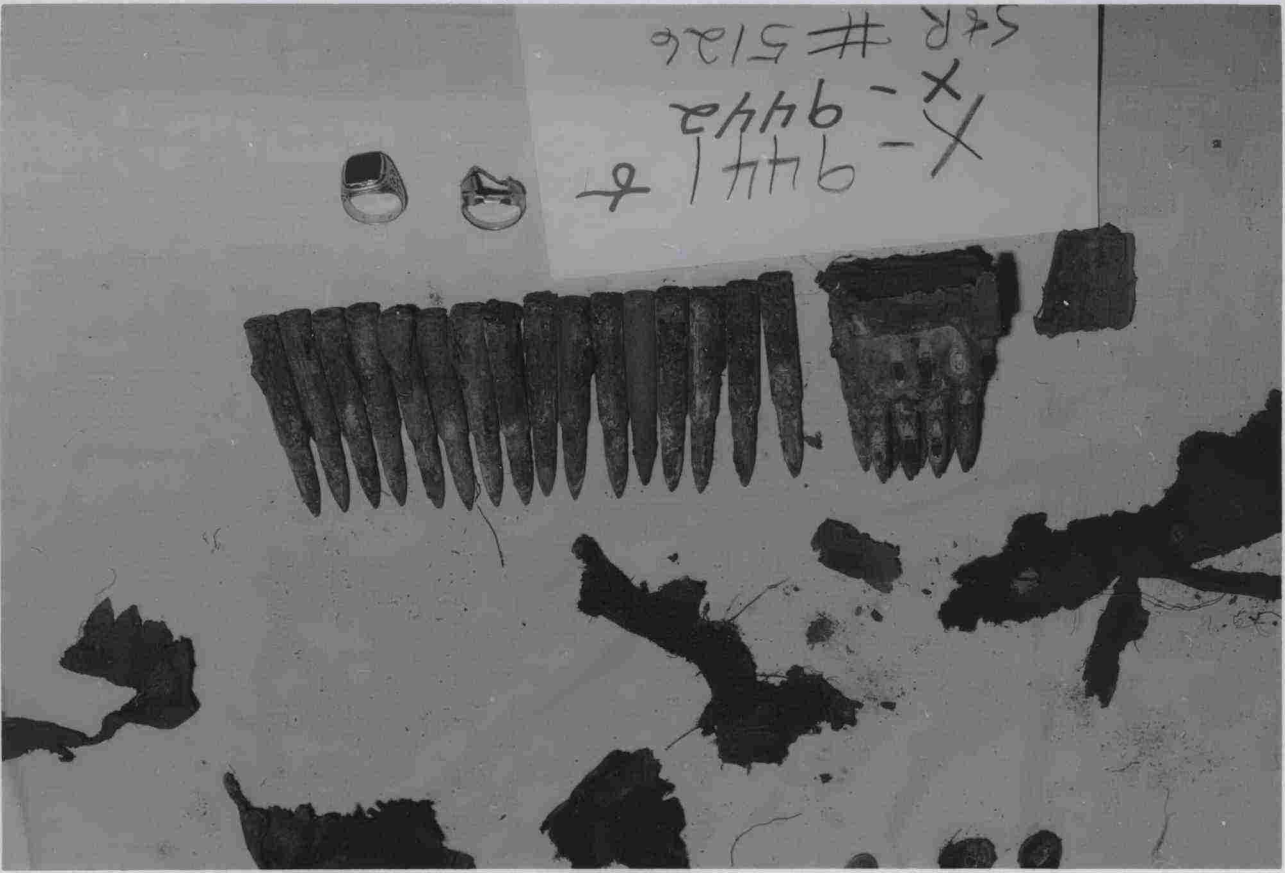
ORIGINAL FRENCH RECOVERY

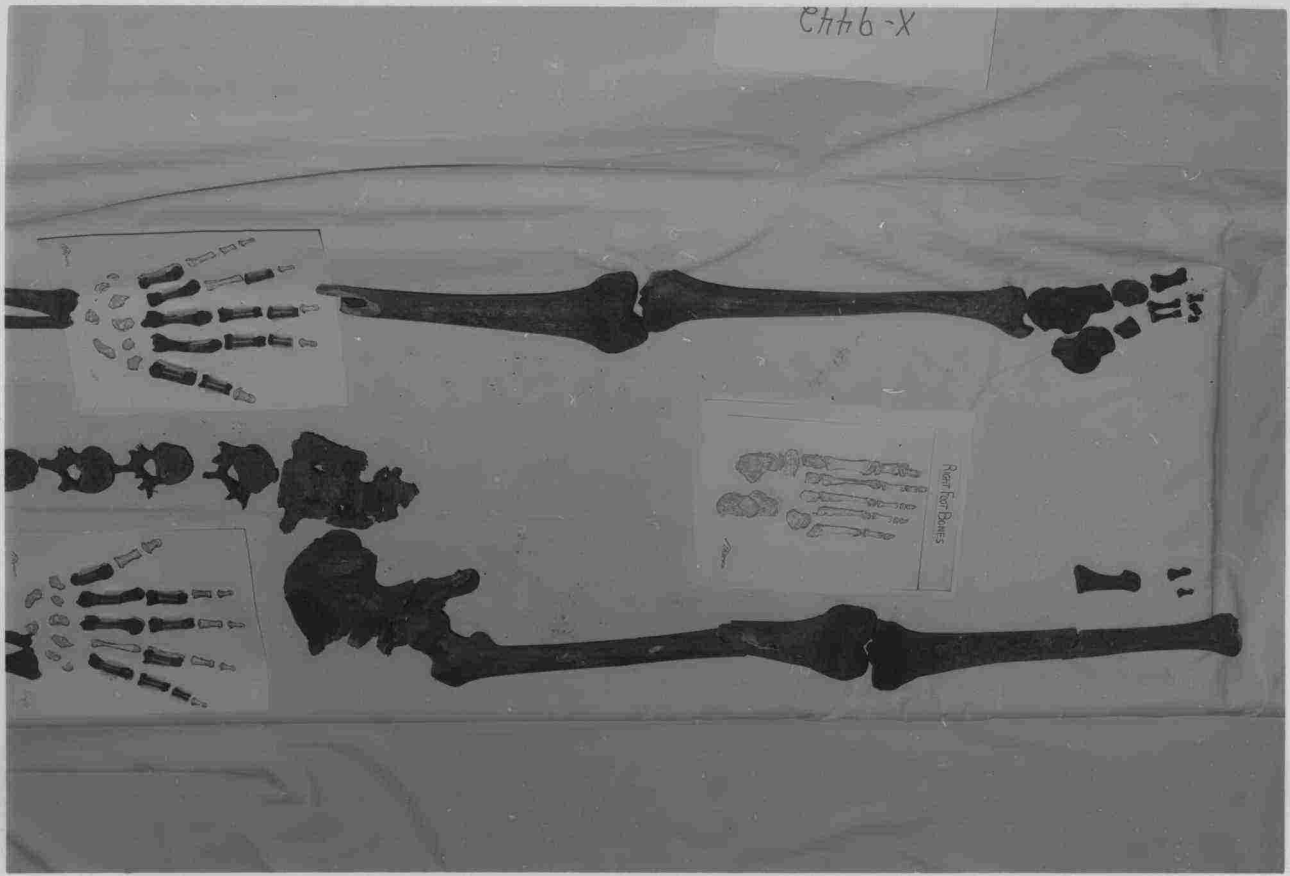

- 9 Jan 1945: VI Corps makes very slow progress against BITCHE salient, but TF HERREN's 276th INF occupies OBERMUEHLTHAL.
- 11 Jan 45 : 276th INF makes limited gains on heights between LICHTENBERG and OBERMUEHLTHAL.
- 18 Jan 45 : In US 7th Army's VI Corps area 45th DIV, on E flank of BITCHE salient, withstands pressure near OBERMUEHLTHAL.
- 15 Mar 45 : On left, 42nd DIV reaches positions commanding BAERENTHAL and cuts BAERENTHAL - MOUTERHOUSE road.
- 16 Mar 45 : In VI Corps area, 42nd DIV penetrates enemy positions near BAERENTHAL.
- 17 Mar 45 : On left, 42nd DIV gains up to 6 miles, clearing BANNSTEIN, STURZELBRONN, BAERENTHAL, PHILIPPSBOURG, DAMBACH, NEUMHOFFEN, and NIEDERSTEINBACH.

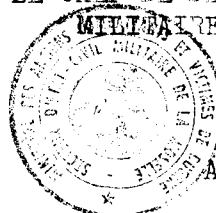

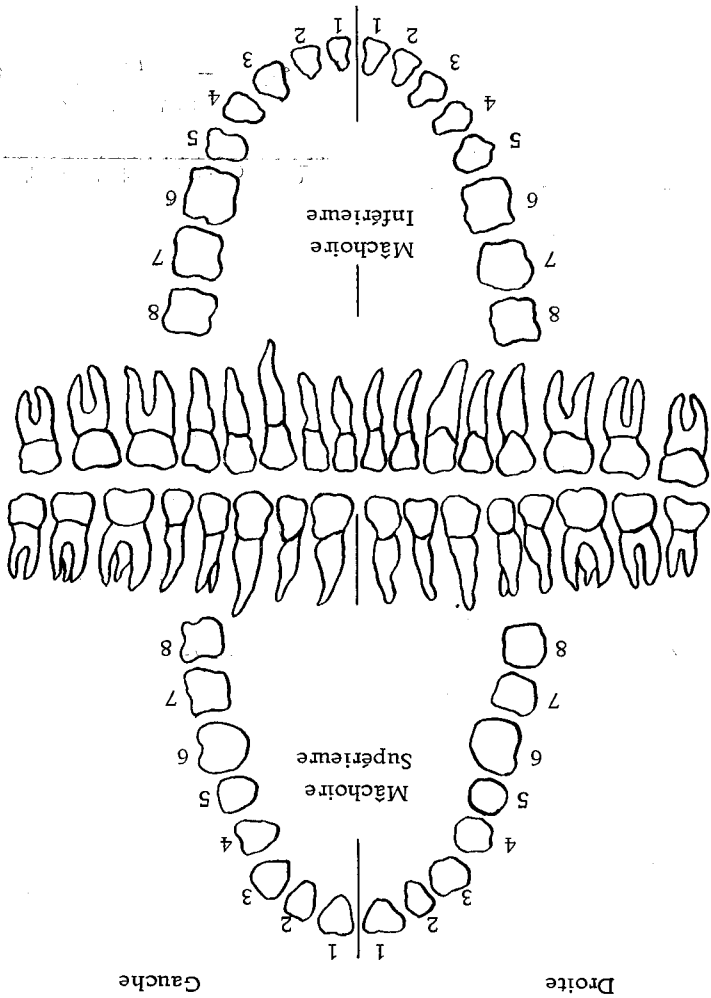

Friday, 6 Jan 78:

Received call from Mr. John Rogers, Frankfurt Memorial Services, referring to a call from Gen. Donaldson. Mr. Rogers informed me that he and a team of 5 men would arrive on Monday, 9 Jan 78, and would remain at least three days.

Call received from Mr. Lyons, ABMC-EO, Asst. Administrative Officer, desiring status. Mr. Lyons was informed that Mr. Rogers and his team would arrive on Monday, 9 Jan 78, and no further info was available at present.

The undersigned informed Mr. Henry of the decision to attempt recovery. Requested that the Mayor of Gaerenthal be informed and permission be granted for team to enter forest and proceed with recovery. Contact was also made with Mr. Pfister in order to simplify finding exact location, and to assist the team.

Monday, 9 Jan 78:

Arrival of Mr. Rogers and team at 1300 hrs on this cemetery. The Superintendent briefs the team on the recovery of remains in our possession. Further briefing on area, personnel involved, and support required. Team departed to hotel.

Tuesday, 10 Jan 78:

At 0800 hrs, team accompanied by Superintendent departed cemetery for Gaerenthal, 69 miles East-South-East of Saint Avold. Upon arrival, the Mayor and Mr. Pfister were contacted, team proceeded to site. After arrangements were concluded, the Superintendent returned to Saint Avold.

At 1700 hrs, Mr. Rogers w/team returned to Lorraine AIC, briefed the Superintendent on the days activities. No further bones had been discovered. However, articles of snow camouflage clothing (plastic), bayonets, etc. were found. Area appears to have many items of World War II interest.

Wednesday, 11 Jan 78:

Team spent all day at site, returned to the cemetery at 1700 hrs. Mr. Rogers was very relieved to report that the rib cage and skulls he found are possibly part of the remains now on hand at the Lorraine Cemetery. Team will return to site tomorrow to complete recovery action.

Thursday, 12 Jan 78:

Recovery of remains completed. Mr. Rogers feels that he now has sufficient human bones on hand to start I.D. process, even though no identification tags were found. With bits and pieces of American equipment found with remains, it may be assumed that they are Americans.

Wednesday, 11 January 1978 (Continued)

It was too late in the day to make a complete and thorough recovery before dark. Plastic was placed over the remains and they were covered over by dirt for recovery the next morning. Arrived back at hotel in St. Avold at 1800 after securing remains portions at the cemetery office.

Thursday, 12 January 1978

Team departed for grave site at 0745 hours arriving at 0925. Forrest Ranger, Mr. Pfister was waiting for us. The secondary gravesite and road were completely excavated and all available skeletal portions were recovered from the original grave site.

Mr. Rogers determined that enough skeletal remains were recovered for two individuals to effect identification. However, no identification media was recovered (e.g. ID Tags, names in clothing or boots, etc.).

Arrived back at hotel at 1800 after securing remains portions at the cemetery office.

Friday, 13 January 1978

Departed cemetery at 1030 with recovered skeletal remains, clothing and boot remnants etc., arriving back at Frankfurt Mortuary at 1400 hours.

1. The following is a resume of facts and actions taken on behalf of the recovery of World War II human remains.

Thursday, 5 Jan 1978:

Mr Henry, representative of the French Ministry of Veterans Affairs, delivered the remains of two soldiers, suspected of being Americans, due to various American made equipment found with the remains. Note attached report "Compte Rendu de Transfert de Corps".

The remains were recovered by the local forest ranger, Mr Pfister, who stated that grading work was being performed on a forest road, 4.5km SSEAST of BACH WILM, Moselle. To further identify the location "Le Pont de l'Ane" (Eselbrucke), parcelle 37, ligne 36. Upon discovery of remains, work was stopped, and several bones, ammunition, and parts of shoe packs were located. Work will not be resumed until our organization has had time to investigate.

Remains were received by the Superintendent of the Lorraine AMC and placed in safe keeping until further action will be decided.

Friday, 6 Jan 78:

Mr Donaldson, notified by the Superintendent of find, replied to the undersigned that further action would be taken by his office, and information would be forthcoming.

10 February 1978

REPORT OF RECOVERY AND PROCESSING OF WW II REMAINS

CIRCUMSTANCES:

On Friday, 6 Jan 78, BG John Donaldson, Officer in Charge of the AMBC, Paris, France, called the undersigned and passed the following information; "A Forest Ranger was watching the widening of a dirt road in the Hanau forest near Biche, France, when he saw what he believed to be human skeletal remains being scattered by the road grader. He immediately ceased all grading, gathered the visible remains and some American type boots and ammunition. The remains and other articles were subsequently turned over to the Superintendent of the Lorraine American Cemetery, St. Avold, France on 5 Jan 78." BG Donaldson requested a recovery team be sent to the site for additional recovery of remains and possibly identification media.

On 9 Jan 78, the Commander of the Mortuary dispatched a team of five GR Specialists and the undersigned to the recovery site. On 10, 11 and 12 January, the team thoroughly excavated and sifted the original grave site, the road and area where dirt was dumped from the original grave. Additional remains representing two individuals from the same grave and more American ammunition and clothing remnants were recovered. No identification media could be located and the team returned to the Frankfurt Mortuary on 13 Jan 78.

Information from BG Donaldson and local residents in close proximity to the grave site indicated that there was heavy fighting during early 1945 and that more than 400 American soldiers are still unaccounted for in that area.

PROCESSING OF REMAINS:


Simultaneous processing of all recovered skeletal portions was conducted. Fragmentary bones were pieced together and then segregation of two individual remains was accomplished utilizing age, height, articulations and other morphological factors.

The segregation, once accomplished, produced two unique individuals from Search and Recovery # 5126 and were then designated:

UNKNOWN REMAINS X-9441
UNKNOWN REMAINS X-9442

CONCLUSION:

Although no identification media was recovered to provide a name association for either remains, it is concluded that they are American casualties of WW II based on the American type footwear, clothing remnants and ammunition recovered with them.

Monday, 9 January 1978

1000 hours, 9 Jan 78, Mr. Rogers and team of five men departed Frankfurt Mortuary for the Lorraine American Cemetery, St. Avoird, France. Arrived at the cemetery at 1400 and was met by Mr. Deguisti, Cemetery Superintendent. Mr. Deguisti briefed the team on the recovery area. As it was too late to depart for the site, Mr. Rogers and the recovery team departed to the Hotel.

Tuesday, 10 January 1978

The team met with Mr. Deguisti, picked up tools from the cemetery and departed at 0830 to the grave site near Baerenthal, France, in the Hanau Forrest.

Arrived Baerenthal at 1000, made contact with Mr. Pfister who took us to the grave site. Mr. Pfister is a Forrest Ranger in that area and was on site when the remains were located. He explained that a road grader was making the road wider and that the dirt was being put on the opposite side in a ditch. At that time, Mr. Pfister saw portions of Human Skeletal remains. He stopped all work and took the remains to Mr. A. Henry, the Representative of the French Ministry of Veterans Affairs.

At 1045 the team began to dig in the area across the road, (Secondary Grave Site), from the ORIGINAL GRAVE SITE (see attached sketch). After digging and thoroughly sifting the area, the team stopped work at 1600 after finding only a few minor skeletal portions. Arrived back at the hotel at 1800 after securing recovered portions at the Cemetery office.

Wednesday, 11 January 1978

Departed St. Avoird 0750 for site, arrived at 0930. Team worked the same area as the day before. Quite a few more portions were found in the area; but no dental structure. The team had thoroughly sifted and searched the secondary grave site by 1500 and then started looking for the original grave site. After a few minutes, a member of the team uncovered arm bones, ribs, vertebrae, skull portions, and dental structure for two individuals.

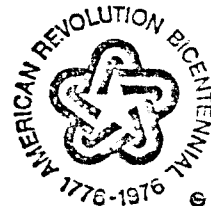





5 In an effort to associate Unknowns X-9441 and X-9442 with unresolved U S casualties of World War II, extensive research of historical records was conducted Combat Chronicle, an Outline of History of US Army Divisions, indicates that elements of the 14th Armored, 63d and 100th Infantry Divisions were committed to combat in the Bitche area during December 1944 and January 1945. The files and/or Physical and Dental Comparison Charts of approximately 400 unresolved casualties who were listed on Nonrecoverable Findings in this area were screened. Comparison of dental and physical data from these files with information furnished in case papers met with negative results. Available records were searched for other unresolved casualties not listed on Nonrecoverable Findings but no association could be made with referenced Unknowns.

CONCLUSION:

Based on the recovery of US type footwear and equipment, it is concluded that these remains are those of US casualties, possibly sustained during the battle of the Hanau Forest; however, the unfavorable dental and/or physical comparisons precludes an association at this time with the casualties listed on Nonrecoverable Findings. Further, the absence of military insignia and identification media may indicate that the two individuals could have been taken prisoner elsewhere and their clothing removed

Army Memorial Affairs Activity, Europe, Frankfurt, Germany, received information on 6 January 1978 from the Officer in Charge of the American Battle Monuments Commission, Paris, France, concerning the discovery of human remains. The skeletal remains were discovered by a Forest Ranger who was watching the widening of a dirt road in the Hanau Forest near Bitche, France. He ceased all grading, gathered the visible remains and some American type boots and ammunition, and turned all items over to the Superintendent of the Lorraine American Cemetery, St. Avold, France.

2. On 9 January 1978, a search and recovery team from the Frankfurt Mortuary was dispatched to the recovery site. The Forest Ranger was present at the site and explained that the road grader was making the road wider and the dirt was being put on the opposite side of the road in a ditch (Tab C - Sketch). The team dug in both locations and recovered additional remains and more American ammunition and clothing remnants. No identification media was found to provide a name association, however, the following items were recovered:

- One (1) gold men's ring (no setting) w/10 KA inscribed in the band
- One (1) left heavy rubber galosh, bottom only (no legible markings)
