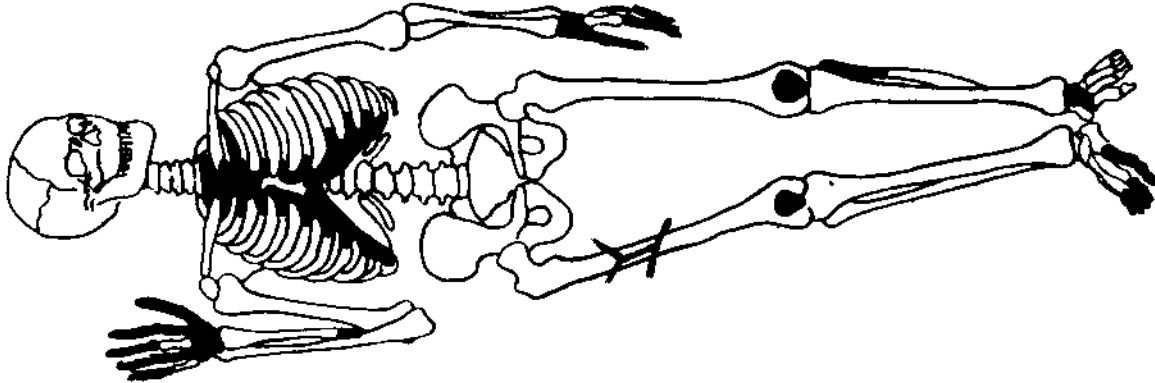


21. REMARKS AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The forehead is rather high with little slope. The brow-ridge glabella is prominent and the nose is skewed to the left. The nasal floor is much lower and larger on the left than on the right, and there is marked left facial asymmetry. The palate is "U" shaped and shallow. The face is short and rectangular in shape. The lower border of the face is fairly long and the chin is shallow, forming a rounded eminence.

STATEMENT OF RACIAL CHARACTERISTICS

Unknown X-75, Guadalcanal, Army, Navy, and Marine Cemetery, P-B, R-62, G-4.

The remains were reexamined to determine the race. Evidence of a racial mixture was found as follows:

1. The excellent condition and pattern of the teeth which are present as well as the retroverted tibial heads are suggestive of the Negroid race. However the lower nasal margins are sharp, a condition practically never seen in a Negroid's skull.
2. The skull sutures being somewhat less tortuous than is usually seen in White skulls, suggest either the Negroid or Mongoloid race.
3. The face is wide across the Malar region and the naso-labial sulci are moderately shallow suggesting the Mongoloid race.
4. The brow ridges, the forehead and the radio-humeral index are strongly suggestive of the White race.
