The records pertaining to Unknown X-70050, Plot , Row , Grave 52, USMC Griesheim/Main (Med) Maus have been reviewed in accordance with par 159, SR-830-112-5, DA dated 3 March 1949, and it is the opinion of the Board of Review appointed by par 14, SO 213, Headquarters, Northern Area Command, dated 16 November 1953, that sufficient evidence is not available to establish the identity of the deceased concerned, and it is recommended these remains be classified as unidentifiable.

CASE HISTORY

UNKNOWN X-70050

Friesheim/Main (Red) Mausoleum

The remains now designated Unknown X-70050 was recovered from the cemetery at Ronzano, Italy. It is not known where the remains were originally found. Local carabinieri and cemetery authority had neither record nor recollection of where the remains came from or who brought them to the cemetery. Information obtained from the Italian War Graves Commission (who reported the remains to graves registration) suggests the decedent was recovered from Monte Mucchi, approximately 2 miles north-northeast of Ronzano.

A review of former Mediterranean Zone case files for casualties lost in the general area of Ronzano, Italy failed to associate remains with an unresolved decedent. As a result of this review it was found that the following casualties possess characteristics of similarity in one or more aspect:

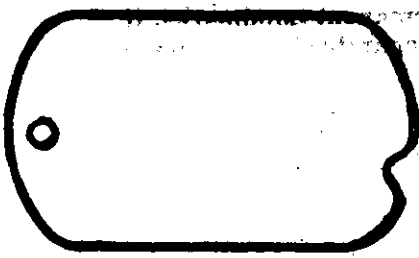

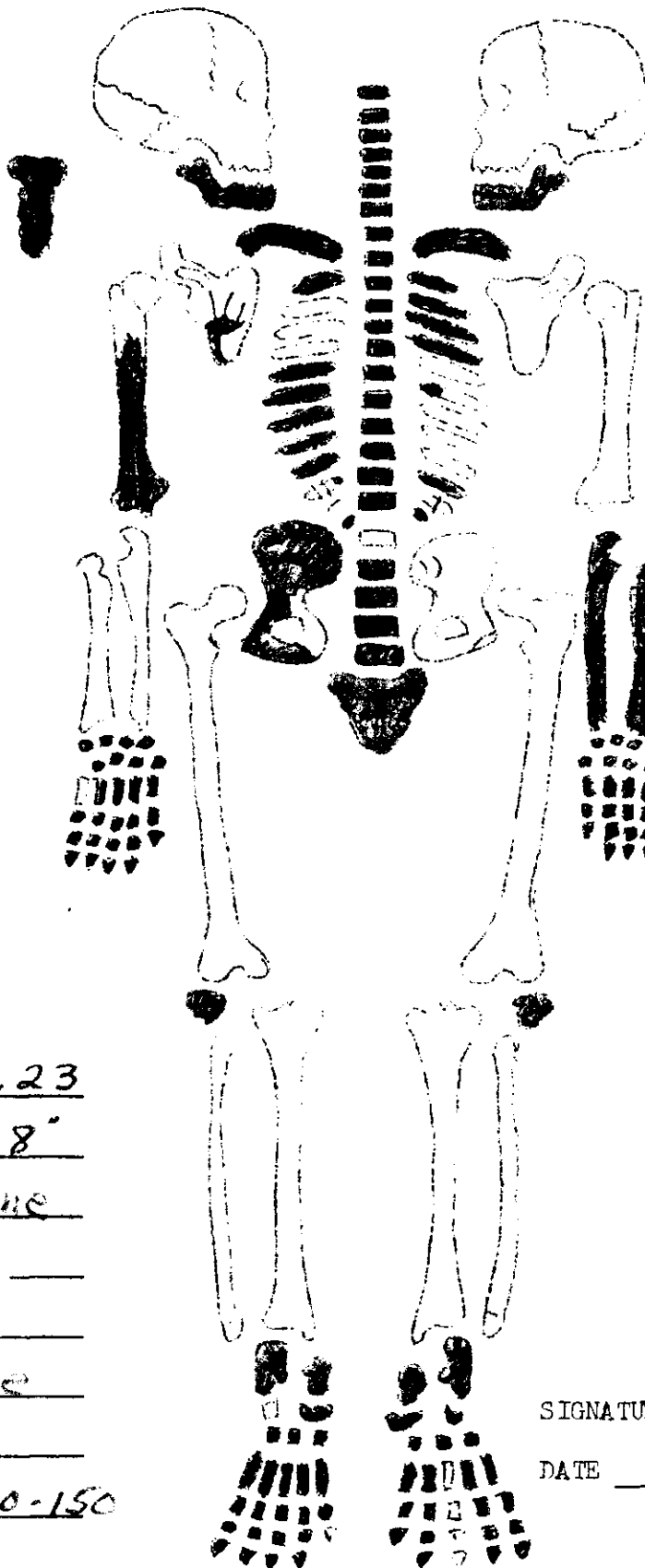

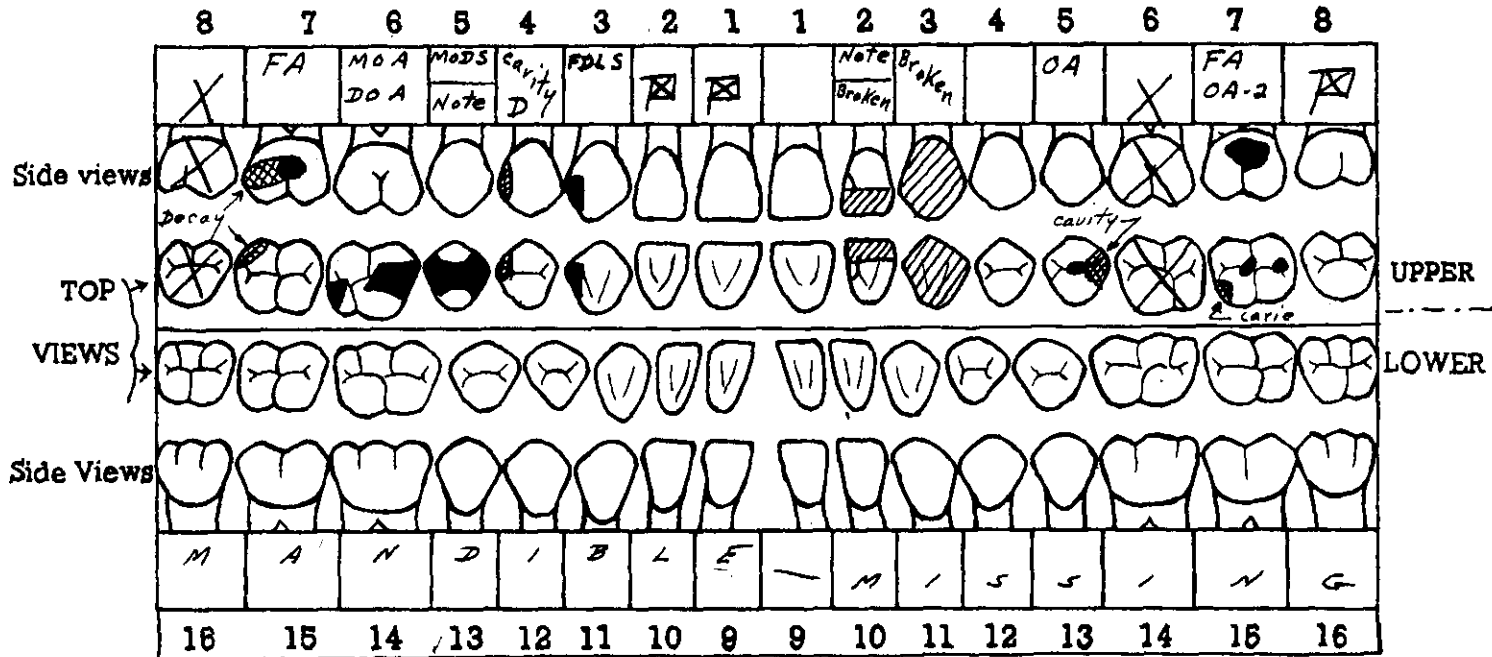

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspid (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. IDENTIFICATION LABORATORY REPORT

1. Search and Recovery Case # 746 pertains to a single remains recently removed from the community cemetery at MONZUNO, Italy. Available information indicates this casualty was recovered from Monteramici which is approximately two and one-half (2 1/2) miles NNE of Monzuno. U.S. "Shoe pacs" were found with this remains and are the only indications that this is a casualty of the U.S. Forces.

2. Pending further research and possible identification this case has been assigned a temporary Unknown "X" Number as follows:

3. Physical characteristics of this remains are as recorded below:

Only the maxillary teeth are present and intact in the undamaged skull. These teeth, however, seem to be in poor repair as compared with the large majority of U.S. casualties. Rather large cavities are present in R 7, R 4, L 5 and L 7. The presence of what appears to be a temporary filling in R 5 indicates that this casualty may have been in the process of having his teeth repaired. The left shoe-pac was size 8 while the right shoe-pac was size 7.

4. CAUSE OF DEATH: The remaining portions of the right humerus and right pelvis are severely shattered as might have been caused by shrapnel or an indirect blast from a mine or grenade.

NARRATIVE OF INVESTIGATION

FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES:

A letter from the Italian War Graves in Rome indicated that a remains had been found near Monzuno, Italy.

FINDINGS:

On visiting Monzuno it was found that the remains were in the cemetery as stated. However, the Carabinieri at Monzuno had no report of the finding of this remains. The cemetery caretaker could not remember who brought the remains to the cemetery. While in Rome, Mr. Jemelik, a German working with the Italian War Graves, was contacted. He reviewed the report from one of the Italians who had worked for him in the past. He thought that the remains had been recovered from Monte Rumici, near Monzuno. A further check at Monzuno proved to be negative. Remains were evacuated to CIL and assigned SR #746.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

It is recommended that an attempt be made to associate the remains found at Monte Rumici with casualties from that area.
