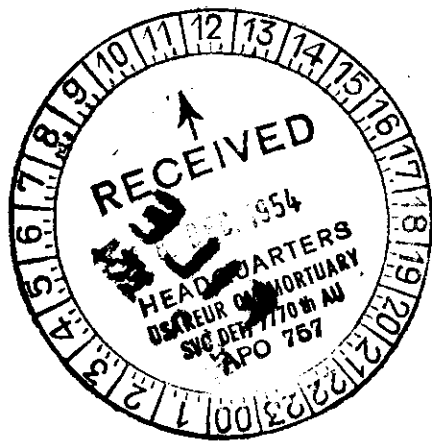

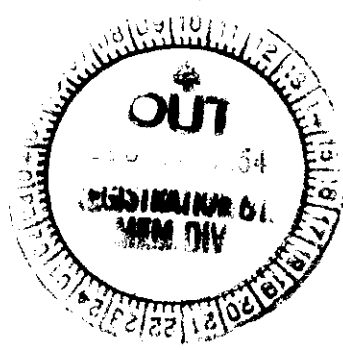

1. The records pertaining to Unknown X -70061 , Plot , Row Grave 63 , USMC Griesheim/Main (Med) Mausoleum have been reviewed in accordance with par 159, SR-830-110-5, DA dated 3 March 1949, and it is the opinion of the Board of Review appointed by par 1, SO 9, Headquarters, USAREUR QM Mortuary Service Detachment, 7770th Army Unit, dated 19 June 1954, that sufficient evidence is not available to establish the identity of the deceased concerned, and it is recommended these remains be classified as unidentifiable.

CASE HISTORY

UNKNOWN X-70061

Griesheim/Main (Med)
Mausoleum Grave 63

The remains designated Unknown X-70061 were recovered from the community cemetery at Isolla del Liri (G 6542) in the province of Frosinone, Italy. The remains were previously believed to be those of a New Zealand casualty however, British authorities could find no evidence to identify the decedent as a British-Commonwealth casualty.

Cemetery records and local statements indicate that remains were delivered to the cemetery by German military personnel on 16 May 1944. They stated the decedent was found wounded on the field of battle at the Cassino front. The decedent apparently received first aid treatment from the enemy as; the facial area was bandaged; Kramer splints were applied to both extremities of one side and remains were wrapped in a German military blanket. Remains were interred in Section 8 Row XII Grave 1047 of the local cemetery and the burial recorded in the cemetery register as "Umbe Karnestes". After the end of hostilities a British Graves Unit examined the remains and declared them to be those of a New Zealand casualty.

The remains are nearly complete. Teeth are intact in the skull and mandible and in excellent state of dental repair. Estimated age is approximately 22 and height is given as 5' 8½" to 5' 10". With the exception of a St Christopher medallion no other effect (nor remnants of clothing or equipment) were recovered.

A thorough review of records available this headquarters, pertaining to unrecovered casualties lost in the general area of Cassino, failed to provide an association with the unknown decedent.

In view of the above it can only be concluded that remains designated Unknown X-70061 be considered Unidentifiable.

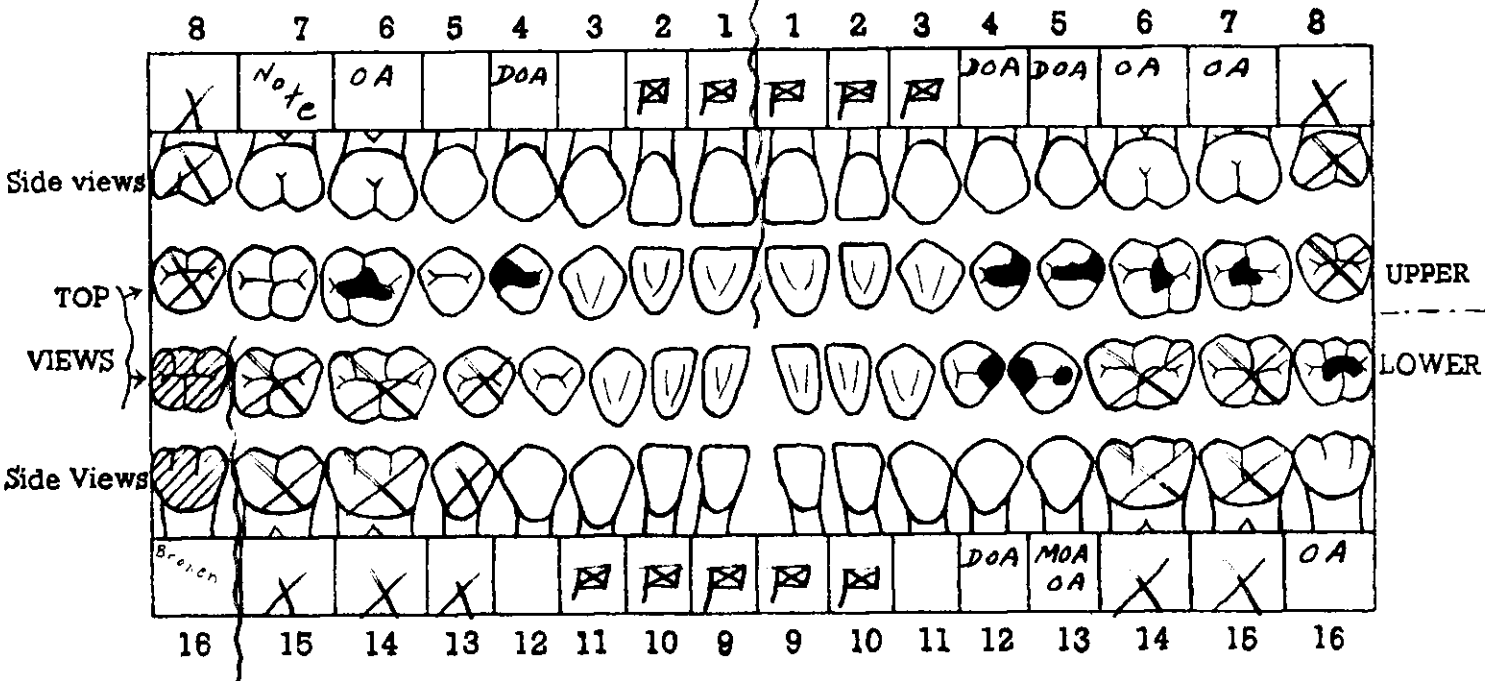

RE: UNKNOWN AMERICAN CASUALTY

I. INTRODUCTION:

On 28 March 1954, while the undersigned was in the Rome, Italy office of the British Imperial War Graves Commission information was received concerning a world war II remains buried at Tschia del Iiri which appeared to be an American casualty.

II. BACKGROUND OF ORIGINAL INFO:

The Imperial War Graves Commission office in Rome had received information that a New Zealand casualty named GEB HARRIS had been buried at the cemetery of Tschia del Iiri (sheet 17/9 6542 Italy 1:200,000) province of Grosinone, Italy since 1944. A representative of the Imperial War Graves Commission had investigated the report and could find no evidence indicating the remains was that of a New Zealander or any other British Commonwealth casualty. A St. Christopher medallion inscribed in English was with the remains and the cemetery register indicated the remains was an "Americano". The cemetery supervisor stated the remains had been brought to the cemetery of German military and buried as "Unbe Karnestes" in 1944. He also stated that after the cessation of hostilities an "English" graves unit had examined the remains and declared it was a New Zealand casualty.

The Imperial War Graves Commission investigator could find no indication that this was a New Zealand casualty and believed it might actually be a US casualty.

III. FINDINGS:

Noting that the St. Christopher medallion was inscribed in English and that the cemetery register indicated the casualty was American a decision was made to examine the remains with special attention being paid to the teeth. The teeth were found to be in a good state of repair and the fillings similar to American type dentistry.

An examination of the cemetery register showed entry # 211 had "Unbe Karneser" written in the name column and "Americano" in the nationality column. Interrogation of the cemetery supervisor revealed that he had made the entry as told to him by the German officer who had transported the remains to the cemetery. It was evident that the officer intended the entry to read "Unbekannter Americano" or "Unknown American" in English. The cemetery supervisor mistook this to be the actual name of the casualty and interpreted it later on as "Unbe Karnestes".

(Narrative of Investigation, dated 8 April 1954, cont'd)

English speaking graves personnel who had removed other US casualties from this cemetery had evidently interpreted the name "Uebe Karnestes" as that of a New Zealander. A pencil notation to that effect had been made next to the word American.

A statement by the cemetery supervisor (see exhibit "L") as related to Doctor A. Quaglia, attending the transfer of subject remains to US custody, indicates that on the 16th of May 1944 a German officer and two soldiers arrived at the cemetery with subject remains which was swathed in bandages. He mentioned the casualty had been found in a field on the Cassino battle front and had died while being treated in a German field hospital.


No additional information could be obtained concerning this casualty so the remains were released to the undersigned for transfer to the identification laboratory for further examination.

IV. CONCLUSION:

The remains were assigned number SN 763 and transported to the Central Identification Laboratory in Wiesbaden, Germany.

V. RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that available data on unrecovered casualties lost near the Cassino battle front during the period just prior to and including 16 May 1944 be compared with the remains SN 763 for possible association and identification.

Statements made by the cemetery supervisor and entries in the cemetery register indicate this is the remains of a US casualty brought there on 16 May 1944 by German medical personnel.

The teeth are intact in the skull and mandible and are in a good state of dental repair. There is complete articulation throughout the remains. A circular St. Christopher medallion inscribed in English was found with the remains. The estimated height based on the Collet table of measurements is indicated as 5'-10". The estimated height as based upon the modified scale used by the undersigned anthropologist is indicated as 5'-8".

4. CAUSE OF DEATH:

The right facial region, right ulna and lower right leg are shattered and it appears that death was caused by small caliber gun shot wounds or flying shrapnel.

Referring to your letter of the 7th April 1954, we are forwarding
to your office the required translation.

" The cemetery's guardian of " Isola del Liri ", Mr. Martini Giovanni
has received on the 16th May 1944 the corpse of an American soldier
which was carried in a military car drove by a maresciallo (non-
commissioned officer) and two german soldiers.
The corpse was wrapped in a german military blanket - the face was
bound with bandages and the limbs of one side too (the guardian
doesn't remember if it was the left or right side).
The limbs were bound together by Kramer's splints. The coppse was
beginning to putrefy and it was established that the death occurred
some day before.
The german " maresciallo " told the guardian that the soldier was
found wounded on the field situated at the Cassino's front. He was
bandaged in a german field-hospital. The identification plate wasn't
found, but the german " maresciallo " told the guardian to write
down on the cemetery's record : unknown.-
The corpse was buried at the 8 section - row XII - grave Nr. 1047.

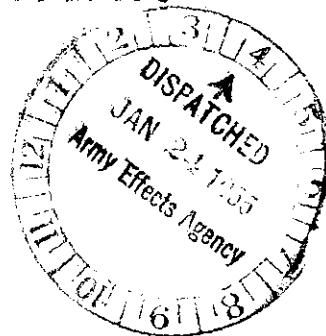
