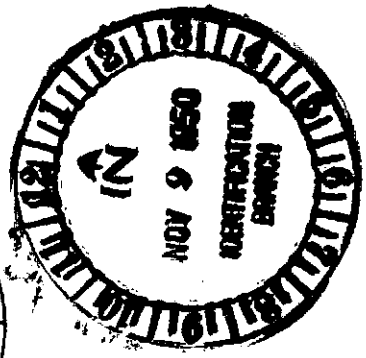



1. Reference is made to CIL Unknown 910 A, B, C, & D, Australia-Ipswich Cemetery, now stored in casket 2006, Hawaiian Distribution Center.
2. Central Identification Laboratory Bone List for CIL 910 A, B, C, & D, indicates that subject CIL portions were removed from Unknown X-4629. The records of this Office do not indicate an X-4629, Ipswich Cemetery.
3. During the QMG team visit to your headquarters in August 1950, Mr. Albee noted that all crew members associated with this CIL had been accounted for.
4. In view of the above, it is requested that all information concerning this CIL, including MACR, be submitted to this Office as soon as practicable.

1. Inclosed herewith a statement of the Anthropologist pertaining to the remains received from AGRS-Philcom as Unknown X-4629, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila.

2. Subject remains represent the result of a search subsequent to the recovery and identification of the crew of a B-24 type aircraft which crashed 30 April 1943 near Bina Village, New Guinea. The crew manifest is as follows:

3. The remains of all the above listed individuals were recovered, identified and subsequently interred in separate graves in Ipswich Cemetery, Australia. At the present time, nine of the crew members have been either repatriated to the United States or permanently interred in the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific, leaving the remains of S/Sgt Wade L. Wagner, 14068165 as the only one available for association with Unknown X-4629. Since no association and consolidation could be made except upon a purely arbitrary basis, X-4629 has been redesignated as

1. Receipt of case papers pertaining to Unknown X-4629, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, is acknowledged.

2. It is advised that of the ten (10) crew members involved in this case, nine have either been repatriated to the United States or permanently interred in the National Memorial Cemetery of the Pacific, thereby eliminating any possibility of association and consolidation. The remains of the tenth crew member were examined but no definite association could be made.

3. As a consequence of the above, and in accordance with established policy, Unknown X-4629 has been redesignated as Central Identification Laboratory Unknown X-910, and will be disposed of in accordance with existing directives.

1. Reference is made to the Report of Interment on file this office for Unknown X-4629, AGRS Mausoleum, Manila (formerly Unknowns X-245, 246, and 247, USAF Cemetery Finschhafen #5, N. G.). At the time of recovery of reference remains, which are only partial, an identification tag bearing the inscription "RICHARD E. FISH, 3982651, O, T-42, P", was found.

2. A review of the records of this office indicates that Pvt. Richard E. Fish, 39826250, was a crew member of a B-24 plane which crashed in the vicinity of Pieunga Village, on the Biaru River. The remains of the following crew members were recovered from USAF Cemetery \* Teak #1, N. G., and were interred in USAF Cemetery Ipswich, Australia, in the graves indicated:

3. In view of the fact that subsequent search resulted in the recovery of only partial remains referred to in paragraph 1 above, which, it is believed, are parts of the remains recovered at an earlier date, and interred in USAF Cemetery Ipswich, Australia, it is recommended that the partial remains now in storage at AGRS Mausoleum, Manila, be shipped to Hawaii for possible consolidation with the remains concentrated from Australia.

Recommend CIL #910A, B, C & D retain a CIL classification and not be considered for the World War II Unknown.
