1. Remains of Unknown American X-271 were found on the surface of the earth in the vicinity of Seravazza, Mt. Canala, Italy, Grid Coord U 197.1-07, Sheet 10/, Map of Italy, reference 1/100,000, and interred in the U.S. Military Cemetery, Castelfiorentino, Italy, 2 July 1946.
2. The listings of Unrecovered Casualties for this area have been processed to eliminate all casualties from Units which were not in the vicinity of Seravazza, Italy.
3. Records on file, this headquarters, and review of casualty listings indicate that casualties were sustained by the 92nd Infantry Division in both October 1944 and April 1945. These specified dates were based on recovered identified casualties, in the same area, and same time. It is assumed that date of death of Unknown American X-271 could have been either October 1944, or April 1945.
4. Subject remains were found on the surface of the earth within a mined area. Also found were remnants of OD clothing and one webbelt (size 34) although no laundry markings could be determined.
5. Physical characteristics of Unknown American X-271 are as follows
 - a. Height 5' 10".
 - b. Weight 185 lbs
 - c. Black curly hair, apparently that of a colored soldier
 - d. Age approximately 24 years

1. On about 15 November 1945 Identification Tags were removed from a body found on a mountain just across the river NW of Seravezza, Italy by an Italian boy. On about 25 November 1945 the Identification Tags were given the undersigned by a Signora Di Corso in Seravezza and the mountain previously mentioned pointed out as the location of the body ~~from~~ from which they were taken.
2. Upon the undersigned's return to Leghorn about 26 November 1945 the tags were turned over to Graves Registration Service at Leghorn in a sealed envelope through message center. This action was taken after a telephone call to the Graves Registration Service telling that section where the tags came from and asking what disposition should be made of the tags.
3. The name on the tags to the best of my knowledge is Linuel Lewis. The serial Number etc., is not remembered.

1. Submitted herewith is a field report of investigation by this office covering UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-271, remains were found on the surface of the earth in the vicinity of Seravezza, Italy on Mt. Canala. Coordinates (97.1-97.1) Sheet 104 Map reference 1/100,000.

2. FACTS:

A. The investigation team led by T/5 Tadashi Ishida went to the above mentioned coordinates with the aid of an Italian civilian, who had seen the remains on several occasions while working on Mt. Canala clearing mine fields.

B. The remains of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-271 were found within forty (40) feet of BELIEVED TO BE, WHITE HAMPTON C. on the surface of the earth in skeleton form.

C. The area was covered with mines and passage was very difficult and dangerous.

3. FINDINGS:

A. After a thorough investigation of the area the only remains that were recovered by our team were as follows:

LEFT SECTION

One Clavicle
Six Ribs
One Ilium
One Femur
One Tibia and Fibula

RIGHT SECTION

One Scapula
Six Ribs
One Humerus
One Ilium
One Femur
One Tibia and Fibula

Sternum
Sacrum

B. Remnants of O.D. clothing were also found such as trousers wool O.D. (cuff part only), bottom part of O.D. Shirt and one web belt size 34. No markings could be found on these remnants.

C. The physical characteristics of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-271 are estimated at; height 5'10", weight 185 lbs. and was about 24 years of age.

D. Black curly hair was found. Hair was that of a colored soldier.

E. A tooth chart was impossible as Head, Mandible and Maxilla were missing.

F. Fingerprints were also impossible to obtain as remains were in skeleton form.

4. COMMENTS:

A. Area completely checked by our investigation team and also the local inhabitants were thoroughly questioned but no clues could be obtained as to the identity of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-271.


B. We have checked our Ground Force Casualty Reports for possible information but our files reveal nothing.

5. RECOMMENDATIONS:

A. It is recommended that any information in connection with "BELIEVED TO BE" WHITE HAMPTON C. 3688219 might coincide with UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-271 as the remains of both soldiers were found within forty feet of each other.

6. CONCLUSIONS:

The remains of UNKNOWN AMERICAN SOLDIER X-271 are now interred in Plot 2-J, Row 92, Grave 4840 at the UNITED STATES MILITARY CEMETERY at CASTELFIORENTINO, ITALY and QMC FORM #1 GRS will be forwarded to your headquarters.
