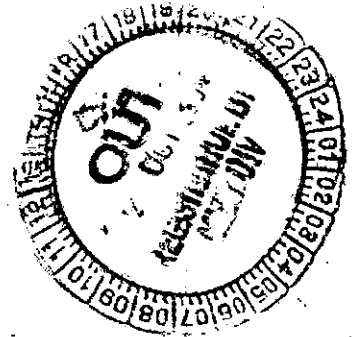
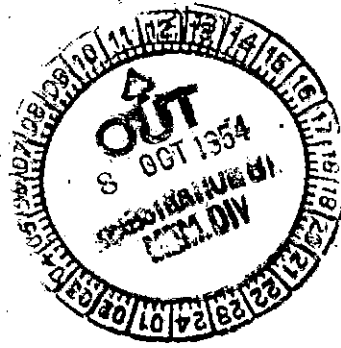

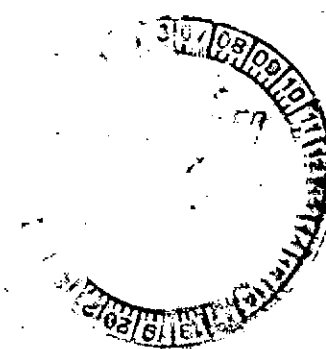

1. Reference is made to Unknown X-20 Inchon.
2. Investigation in this headquarters reveals that Unknown X-20 Inchon, may be associated with Pfc Edward E Smedley, USMC 666313, MIA 20 September 1950 or Pfc Robert D Miller, RA 17 277 735, MIA 23 September 1950; however, neither association is sufficiently conclusive as to be considered the basis for an identification.
3. It is requested that an exhaustive search be made of all Department of the Army and Marine casualty files in an attempt to obtain additional dental information for the above two casualties and that this headquarters be advised of the results.

Identifying factors were:

Report of Interment indicates that Unknown X-20 Inchon was recovered at "2668 King 3 Korea". Search of Map Sheet 6626-IV reveals that grid coordinates 2668 are approximately 5 miles northeast of Seoul, Korea. "King 3" is Marine target area at these coordinates. Search and Recovery Report was not prepared.

Operational records do not reveal any units operating in the vicinity where X-20 Inchon was recovered, prior to date of burial. Inasmuch as X-20 was recovered very near Route 33, the main route of POW's going north out of Seoul, it is believed that subject remains may be those of a deceased Prisoner of War.

Laboratory processing revealed this skeletal remains to be almost complete; race is Caucasoid; estimated age 18 to 20 years and height 5'-7 3/4" to 5'-8" (Trotter). Color of hair is brown. HBT jacket and trousers and one wool sock found on remains bore no identifying marking.

Comparison of Unknown X-20 Inchon was made with all applicable unresolved casualties without effecting an association. This was due primarily to the lack of any distinctive identifying factor upon which to base a conclusive association.

Area clearance certificates have been received for all of Map Sheets 6526, 6527, 6626 and 6627.

In view of the absence of essential identifying factors, thereby precluding the possibility of associating this remains with an unresolved casualty, Unknown X-20 Inchon is determined to be UNIDENTIFIABLE.



REMARKS

Board Findings recommending that Unknown X-20 Inchon be declared unidentifiable have been received.

Search and Recovery Reports were not prepared when the remains of X-20 were recovered, however Report of Interment, dated 3 October 1950, indicated that the remains were buried on 30 October 1950, in UNMC Inchon, Korea. Estimated date of death was 1 September 1950. The remains were recovered at "2668 King 3 Korea." According to case papers, "King 3" is Marine target area for grid coordinates 2668, MS 6626-IV, approximately 5 miles NE of Seoul.

Unknown X-20 was screened against all unresolved casualties in and south of the Demilitarized Zone during the Unknown Screening Project, Identification Section, without effecting an identification.

Area clearance certificate for Map Sheet 6626 has been received in this Office.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that Unknown X-20 UNMC Inchon be approved as Unidentifiable.

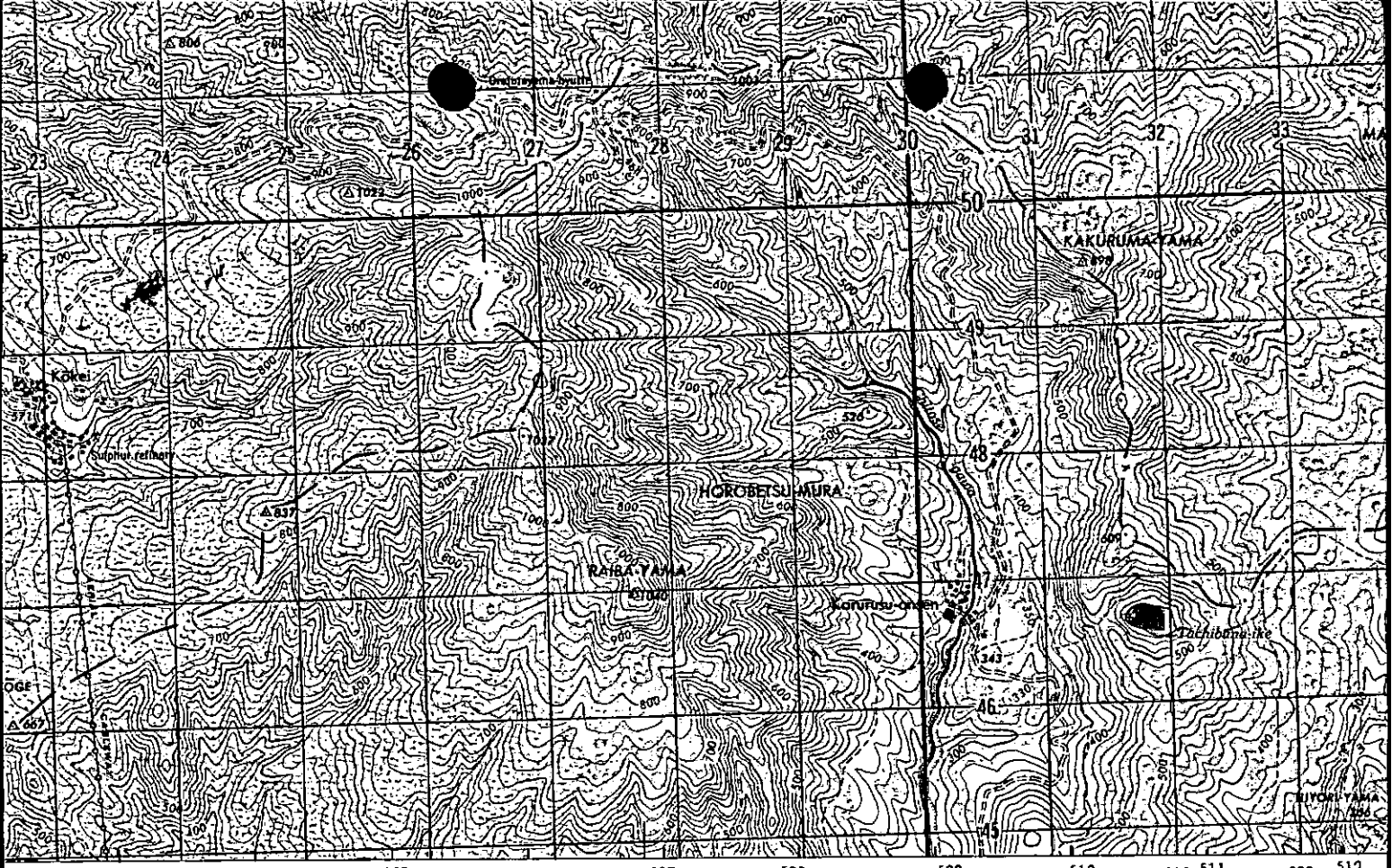

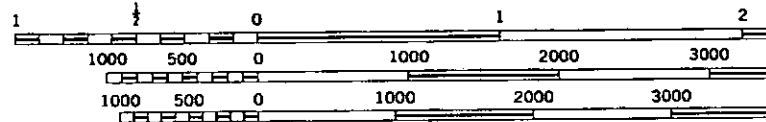

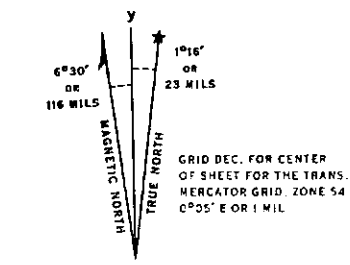

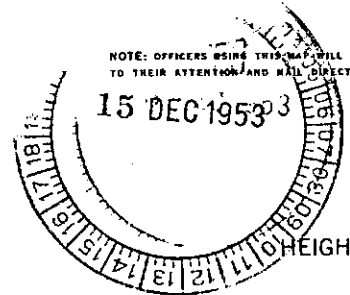


APPROXIMATE MEAN DECLINATION 1945 FOR CENTER OF SHEET
