A Board of Officers appointed by paragraph 1, Division Order No. 22, dated 25 July 1956, convened at 1000 hours, after consideration of the following factors, approved the identification of Unknowns X-6348A, X-6349A, X-6349B and X-6351 as unidentifiable.

The remains of Unknowns X-6348, X-6348A, X-6348B, X-6349A, X-6349B, X-6350, X-6351 and Evac. #12612 were recovered from hill 139, grid coordinates CT 079084, Map Sheet 6528-II, along with a few bone fragments designated CTU parts, during recovery operations extending over a period from 8 - 17 August 1956.

Identification data of all unresolved casualties lost in this area has been compared with that of these unknowns, resulting in Unknowns X-6348 being associated with Pvt Louis D. Walker, 1306413, USEC, X-6348B with Pvt Joe E. Whitten, 1053722, USMC, X-6349 with Cpl Daniel L. Welch, 1123600, USMC, and X-6350 with Pfc Omar E. Wooldridge, 1244946, USiC, based on a favorable comparison of dental and physical data. Board proceedings recommending the identification of these four casualties and unidentifiability of the other four unknowns are being submitted simultaneously. These four remains could not be conclusively associated with any unresolved casualties because of the similarity of identifying data of many of the unresolved casualties lost in this area and the lack of outstanding identifying data of the unknowns. Evac. #12612, previously determined to be Asiatic Mongoleid, will be returned to the Korean Government and the CIU parts will be disposed of in accordance with applicable regulations.

In view of the above, it is determined that Unknowns X-6348A, X-6349A, X-6349B and X-6351 be declared unidentifiable.

#### S&R 1500/293 TEAM LEADER REPORT

On the morning of 11 Aug 1956 at 0730 hrs I SFC Russell Adams, RA 17-241 363, departed from Base Camp in route to the DMZ with two S&R teams. We arrived at the DMZ and were escorted to the Grave site (S&R 1500/293), by the North Koreans.

The Grave site was located in a small gully on the West slope of hill 139. Grid Coordinates CF 072089 taken from Majon-ni Map, Sheet #65282, 7th Edition AMS, Scale 1:50,000.

The remains had apparently been contained in a bunker which had collepsed and they had been exposed to rainfall. Due to this factor some portions of the remains were scattered varying distances down the slope. After searching the general area and obtaining those portions which had been washed away, we began digging up what remained of the bunker. Several portions were found in addition to fragments of blankets and cloth. All dirt that was extracted from the bunker was sifted in an effort to obtain further portions and Identifying Media. This was done with some success. as we found (1) one ID Tag inscribed WOOLDRIDGE, Oper E., 1244946 USMC and (1) one fing, apparently of Korean Manufacture. A further search of the area revealed a steel helmet, an MI Cartridge Belt, various pieces of clothing and two (2) Combat Boots both for the left foot. Approximately 15 feet down the slope we found more portions of the remains and a sifting of the area uncovered (1) one Combat Boot for the right foot with foot bones intact. Further searching of this area revealed no additional portions or identification media.

Hill 139 had numerous bunkers on it, all of which have collepsed, or had been destroyed.

#### STATEMENT

I, Col BEBBY J. W. LUCAS, RA 19 562 926, make the following statement:

From July 1952 until 9 February 1953 I was attached to the element of the 1st Marine Division, USMC. The units in action against the Chinese were as follows: 1st Regt (Inf), 5th Regt (Inf), 7th Regt (Inf), 11th Regt (FA). The Marines used a rotating system, two regt. on the line with one regt. in reserve. From the reserve the regt. feleived each other in the following order: first month; 1st and 5th on line, 7th in reserve. Second month; 7th and 5th on line, 1st in reserve. Third menth; 7th and 1st on line, 5th in reserve. Fourth month; 5th and 1st on the line and 7th in reserve. Since I do not know what month the marines were killed, it is impossible to say what unit they were in. I left in Feb. 53 and I beleive the 5th Regt was in reserve at that time, therefore the Marines would have been in the 7th or 1st Regt. From the IB tag, SN 1244\_\_\_\_\_, I beleive by the first four digits, that the Marine entered the service in June of July of 52. He was either Regular of Meserve, no draftees were taken after 51. Combat boots were issued to us in July or August of 52, prior to this we were "Boondockers", that is low half-boots.

The above is a true and correct statement to the best of my knowledge and belief.



# GRAVE SITE SKETCH



Because of the slope of the land, the closeness of the bunkers, the evidence that the remains were scattered by shell bursts and the amount of rain that has fallen since 1953, some of the recoveries that were made on 17 Aug 56 might be portions of recoveries that were made on 10 and 11 Aug 56. S&R 1502/293, 17 Aug, clould be part of S&R 1499/293 or 1501/293 or 1505/293, 17 Aug. S&R 1505/293 could be part of 1501/293, approx. 20 ft apart S&R 1505/293 could be one recovery.

S&R 1503/293 could be a part of S&R 1500/293 as the bones were recovered from two gullies caused by running water, one of which started between two bunkers.
