SUBJECT: Designation of GIL Remains

DISCUSSION:

1. Letter AGRC/EA dated 23 October 1950, states that IF-4003 was disinterred from an isolated grave at St. Ingbert, Germany. Processing revealed portions of three remains, which were designated Unknowns X-8277, X-8278 and X-8279 USMC Neuville, Belgium.

2. The remains of X-8277 are complete and are being identified as Pvt. Walter Stavicki, 42096611 thru favorable comparison of dental chart and physical characteristics. Pvt. Walter Stavicki died in the hospital at Ingbert and was interred in the local cemetery.

3. The remains of X-8278 are comprised of amputated left fibula, tibia and arm bones. The remains of X-8279 are portions of amputated right tibia and fibula. Both Unknowns are believed by the Field, to be amputations disposed of by the hospital.

4. Investigation in this Office indicates that association of Unknowns X-8278 and X-8279 cannot be made with any known casualties.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the remains of X-8278 and X-8279 be assigned GIL designations.

1. Reference is made to Reports of Burial for Unknowns X-8277, X-8278 and X-8279, USMC Neuville en Condroz, Belgium. The remains of Unknown X-8277 have been identified by this headquarters as Pvt Walter STAVICKI, 42 096 611.

2. It is noted that the three (3) remains mentioned above were recovered from the same isolated grave in St Ingbert, Germany and were received at Central Identification Laboratory as IF-4003. Upon reprocessing IF 4003 portions of three (3) remains were found and designated IF-4003 A, B and C, later redesignated X-8277, X-8278 and X-8279. The remains of X-8277, now identified as Pvt Stavicki, were complete, no portions missing. The remains of X-8278 are amputated left fibula, tibia and arm bones. The remains of X-8279 are portions of amputated right tibia and fibula. Records this headquarters reveal that Pvt Stavicki died in the hospital.

3. It is believed that the remains of X-8278 and X-8279 are amputated remains from the local hospital that were interred in the same isolated grave as the remains now identified as Pvt Stavicki and that X-8278 and X-8279 should be assigned CIL designations.

4. It is requested that your Office review subject cases and advise this headquarters as to action desired.

5. All further action on X-8278 and X-8279 will be suspended pending reply from your Office.
