3. Case History attached to Unidentifiable Certificate for X-5449 B indicates that extra teeth (Charts 1 and 3) found with S/Sgt. Mueller were replaced with X-5449 B, and that they could not be associated with any crew member of the two aircrafts involved. It is noted that a similarity exists between the fillings in this maxilla and the fillings recorded for S/Sgt. Jesse E. Keller, 38428878, who was recovered from Plot 50, Row 4, Grave 120, and identified by an identification tag found in the chest cavity. Disposition of teeth on Chart #2 found with Sgt Mueller has not been received in this Office.

4. Approval of identifications of Capt. Sandall and Lt. Hurley are suspended pending receipt of the above information from your headquarters.

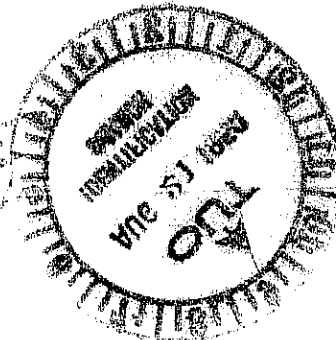
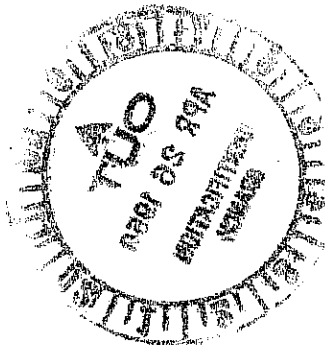

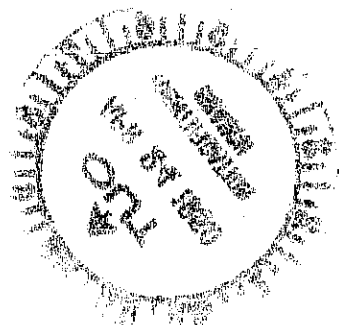
Remains of X-6449 were originally disinterred from Plot 30, Row 4, Grave 120, West Cemetery, Muenchen, Germany and reburied in USMC St. Avold, France, Plot EEEE, Row 10, Grave 117 on 28 June 1946.

Reprocessing of the subject remains by Central Identification Laboratory on 24 September 1947 revealed a mass burial of two (2) deceased which were segregated into Unknowns X-6449 A and X-6449 B. Segregation was determined by bone structure size and texture. Skeletal chart prepared for X-6449 B indicated that the remains were comprised of fragmented portions of lower extremities only. (Identification of X-6449 A, with teeth in agreement with dental data for Captain Sandall, is being established as the remains of Captain John C. Sandall, crew member of a/c 44-40444.)

In compliance with E. O. 2969, the excess teeth found with the identified remains of S/Sgt. Albert Mueller, 36209566, crew member of a/c 44-40444, were removed and placed with case X-6449 B. Subject extra teeth could not be associated with any crew members of the two aircrafts, 44-40444 and 42-102918, involved with the subject reburials from Munich, Germany.

In view of the fact that reprocessing of Unknown X-6449 B revealed no positive identifying media and as the teeth, placed with remains, could not be definitely associated with any other unresolved Air Corps casualty in vicinity of Munich, Germany; it is recommended that the subject Unknown be classified as UNIDENTIFIABLE.

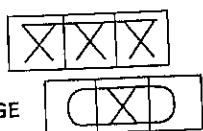

1. Reprocessing in the presence of Doctor GAN, anthropologist, has been accomplished.
2. The teeth, estimated height, estimated age and color of head hair of case of MUELLER substantiated the identification of that case. Excess teeth have been removed and placed with case X - 6449 (B). An excess atlas vertebra found with this case has been consolidated with case X - 6436.
3. Case X - 13035 consisting of only a sacrum has been eliminated by consolidation with case X - 6436 by comparison of age and bone characteristics.
4. Case X - 6449 (A) compares favorably with 371 for SANDALL as to teeth, height, age and weight of bone structure.
