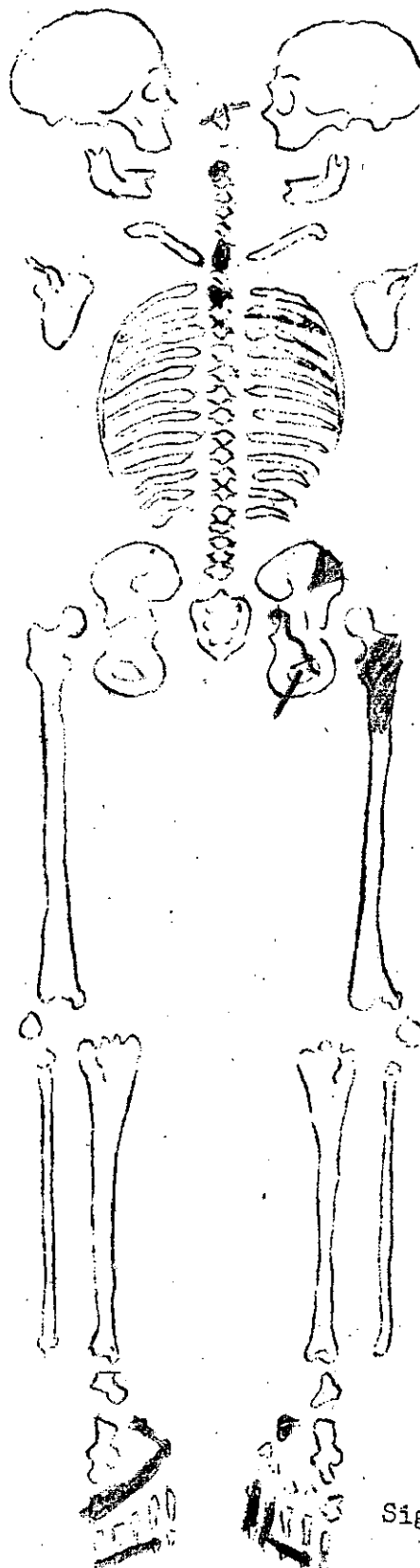



This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. Teeth articulate with skull, skull articulates with vertebral column. Teeth are not contradictory for Brothers. Remains is homogeneous. There is evidence of a mastoid operation on left side. It will be noted that this operation occurred many years prior to death, very possible in his childhood. During this operation the Doctor chiseled away the major portion of the mastoid process. Estimated shoe size: 10 1/2 B or C.

Teeth articulate with skull, no articulation between skull and vertebral column due to missing atlas. Teeth do not compare with Form 371 for Stevens. Remains is homogeneous. The third cervical vertebra found in excess. This vertebra has been removed and assigned CII # 4714. Age estimation was based on epiphyseal lines of the bones, closure of skull sutures were (abnormal) (sagittal and lambdoidal sutures have begun to close, but coronal suture is still open).

Evidence of a greenstick fracture, distal 1/3 of right radius.

The information on the Form 371 for Stevens - Bruce B. does not compare in any way with the anthropological findings of Unknown X-5437. Therefore it is believed that this remains is not that of Sgt Bruce B. Stevens.
