CASE HISTORY.

X-5660, USMC, Neuville, was recovered from civilian cemetery of Weibersbrunn, Germany, in July 1947 and transferred to USMC, Neuville, for reburial.

The branch of military service is believed to have been the Army Air Forces since a parachute was found on body at time of discovery in a German forest. No other identity factors were present.

X-5660, Neuville, has a tooth chart. Color of hair is known and height is estimated.

Tooth chart for remains has been compared with available dental records for all unresolved casualties in the map sheet reported as place of death, and in the adjacent map sheet north (150 and 151), with negative results. Effort to associate subject remains with unresolved casualty or casualties by all other means have proven negative.

X-5660, Neuville, is declared UNIDENTIFIABLE.

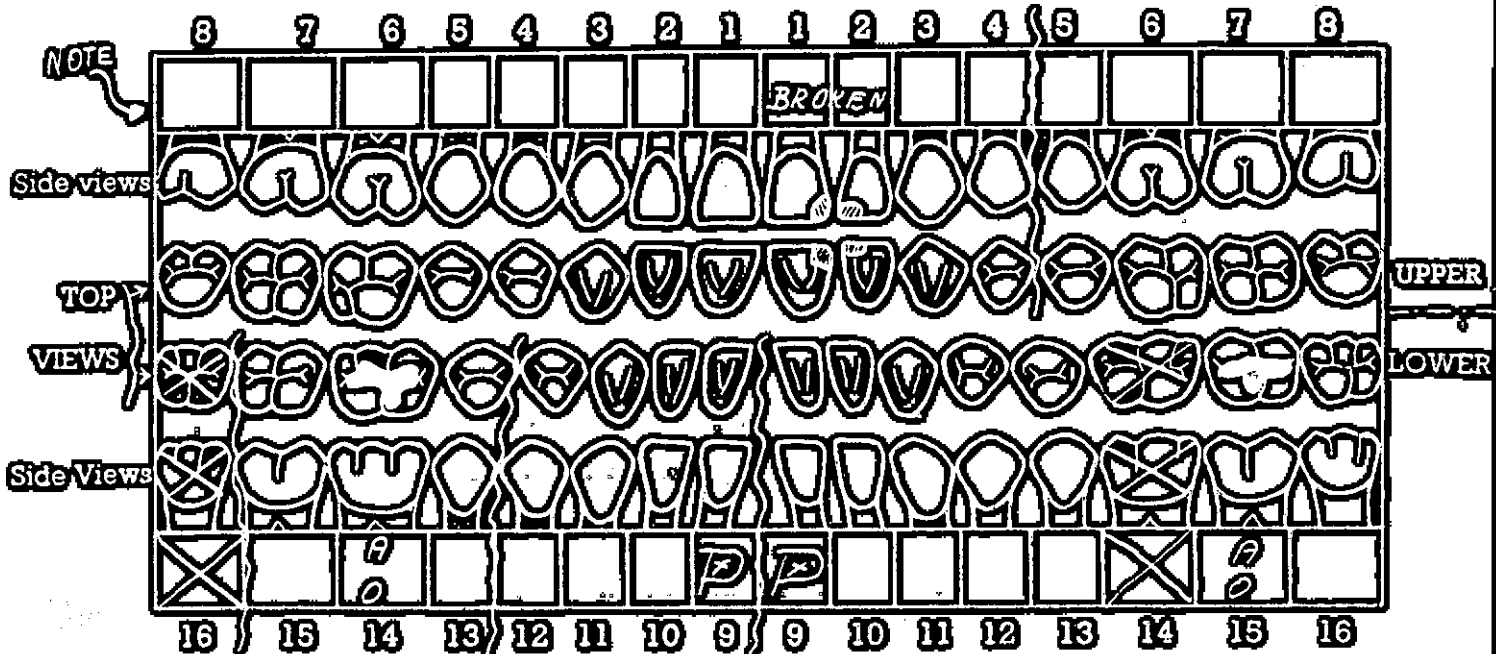

SEE REMARKS

This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicusps (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. On 12 June 1947 the body of an unknown American flyer was disinterred from the civilian cemetery at Weibersbrunn, Germany (L-50/N 1749), at 2000 hours from plot 3 - row 5- grave 12.

No information that could lead to the identification of the body was available at the time of disinterment.

A statement was given by Agnes Roth, German civilian, who found the deceased shortly after death in the forest of Weibersbrunn on a tree stump. His parachute was opened and spread over the body. According to the attached statement of Agnes Roth the soldier was about 22 to 23 years of age, had dark brown or black hair and was tall and broad shouldered. He wore an AAF flying suit. The burial was on 22 August 1943.

The remains had been discovered in August 1943. Judging from the condition of the body it appears that the soldier had a good burial. He was dressed in his uniform and placed in a German wooden casket. There were flowers on the grave.

The body was disinterred in accordance with existing regulations and evacuated to the CIP. at Margraten / Holland.

In August 1943 entdeckte ich, Agnes Roth, die sterblichen Überreste eines amerikanischen Soldaten im Walde von Weibersbrunn.

Der Tote lag auf einem Baumstumpf, mit dem Gesicht zur Erde gekehrt. Sein Fallschirm war über dem Körper weit ausgebreitet. Die Äste der umstehenden Bäume waren abgebrochen. Das Blut strömte noch aus den Ohren des Soldaten. Keine weiteren ausserlichen Verletzungen konnten an dem Körper festgestellt werden. Eine Erkennungsmarke war an dem Toten nicht zu finden.

STATEMENT

In August 1943, I, Agnes Roth, found the remains of a deceased American soldier in the forest of Weibersbrunn.

The body was lying on a tree stump with his face down. He was covered by his parachute which was spread out over him. The branches of the surrounding trees were broken. Blood poured out of the ears of the deceased. No other external injuries could be seen on the body. No ID. tags were on the remains.

I immediately announced my discovery. The burial was on 22 August 1943.

No means that could lead to the identification of the body could be discovered. The deceased was in the age of about 22 to 23 years. He had dark brown or black hair, was tall and broad shouldered and wore an airforce flying suit.
