

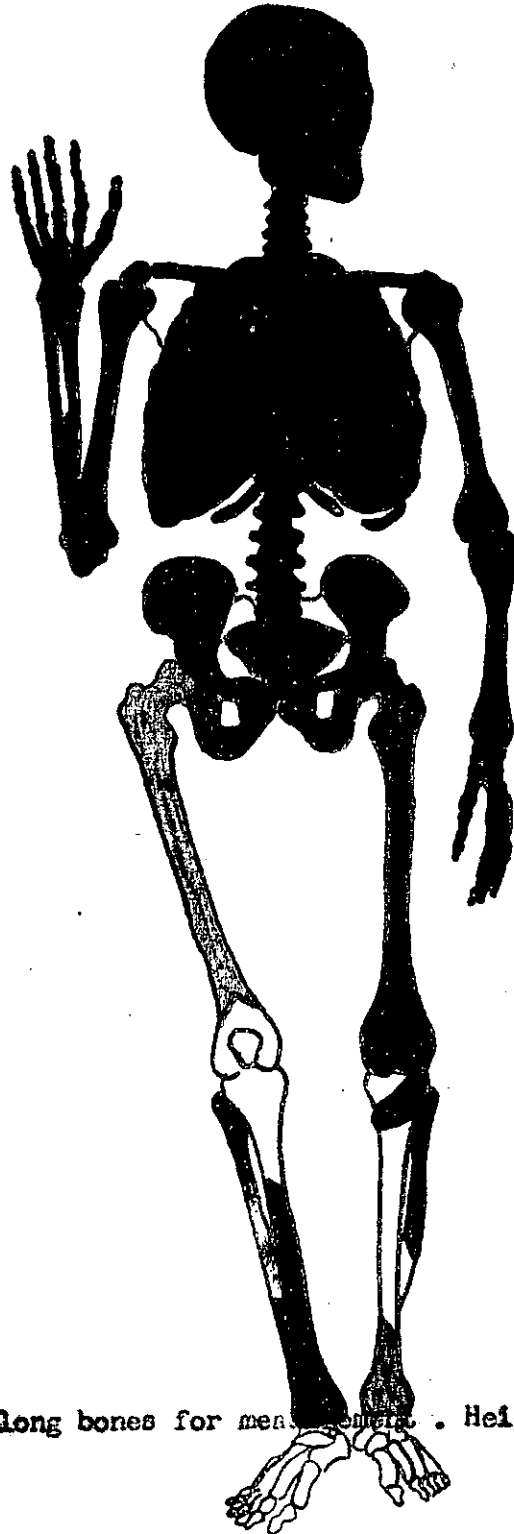

NARRATIVE

On 23 July 1947 I was searching and disinterring in the town of BITBURG, Germany (WL-1354). It had been known that one (1) American soldier was found in the ruins of the town.

I contacted the Burgermeister of BITBURG and he stated that KARL REUTER had found parts presumed to be American in the ruins of his house which he is clearing of rubble, and that the remains are in the Town Cemetery. He instructed me to interview REUTER as he could not give me further information. I did so and REUTER stated that he was clearing some of the rubble of his house last week and found parts of remains believed to be American. He further stated that there are five (5) shoes, parts of two (2) arms, and other small parts of human bodies. The remains are burnt very badly.

He further stated that there were American prisoners in BITBURG during November and December 1944. On 25 December 1944 the American prisoners were working near his house when they were air raided. It is thought that some of the prisoners ran into his house to find a shelter there. His house was hit by a bomb and was almost completely destroyed. It burned after the air raid. He could not furnish any further information.

I then proceeded to the cemetery and obtained the remains. They were in a small box in one of the buildings of the cemetery.

I obtained the following from the box:

Five (5) single shoes containing parts of the remains that were very badly burnt.

Parts of two (2) arms, also burnt badly.

Other small bones and burnt flesh.

It is possible that there are parts of three (3) bodies in the box. I placed the remains in a burial box which I had taken along and departed.

CONCLUSION:

It is presumed that these remains are parts of three (3) American soldiers who were killed during the air raid on BITBURG. Due to the fact that the house burnt after the bombing, the remains were completely destroyed by the fire.

Nach Angaben der Einwohner des Hauses HÜWELER, wurden etwa drei amerikanische Soldaten in der Einfahrt verschüttet. Die HÜWELER's konnten nicht helfen, da sie selbst im Keller stundenlang verschüttet waren. Das zusammengestürzte Haus fing an zu brennen. Die in der Einfahrt verschütteten Leute sind, bis auf kleine Reste, welche ich der Kommission abgeliefert habe, verbrannt.

Das Haus wurde am 25. 12. 44 getroffen. Zu der Zeit waren amerikanische Soldaten zur Aufräumung in BITBURG eingesetzt. Es besteht, nach Aussagen von Leuten, die Möglichkeit, dass die amerikanischen Soldaten während des Bombardements in der Einfahrt Schutz suchen wollten.

S T A T E M E N T

According to the tenants of the HÜWELER house, approximately three (3) American soldiers were killed when the drive way arch of this house collapsed on them. The HÜWELERS could not give any aid after having been trapped in the cellar for several hours. The crashed building caught fire. The men under the rubble are all burnt to death leaving only some remains which I turned over to the American Disinterring Team.

The house was hit on 25 December 1944. American PW's were ordered to work in the town of BITBURG at that time. According to statements of local inhabitants, the American soldiers probably wanted to find shelter under that drive way arch during the air raid.
