IDENTIFIED THROUGH:

1. Est. date and place of death for above mentioned decedents are in agreement with manifest of a/c V9169 of which S/Sgt Murray, S/Sgt Sanchez, Pvt Nevins, Pvt Williams and two Unknown individuals were passengers.
2. Decedents referred to above were recovered from the wreckage of a/c V9169.
3. Information contained in report of Wing Commander L. Joel, R.A.F. President of Inquiry, reveals that 14 American ex-P.O.W., died, result of plane crash in the area of Zaventem near Brussels/Evere, Belgium. Nominal rolls submitted by the British list only 12 American casualties.
4. Above mentioned individuals including the two that are Unknown are the last remaining passengers of a/c V9169 to be accounted for.
5. Dental information available at this headquarters for all American deceased known to have been killed in the crash of a/c V9169 is insufficient to substantiate individual identification of above mentioned X-numbers.

U.S. MILITARY CEMETERY Neuville, Belgium

On the 18 May 1945 a British Hudson aircraft V9169 of the Royal Air Force crashed at Zaventem near Brussels/Evere airfield, Belgium.

Above aircraft was returning from Luneberg, Germany, with a crew of 6 British airmen and what was later estimated to be 14 American ex-P.O.W.'s as passengers.

According to a report of Wing Commander L. Joal, RAF President of Inquiry, the aircraft had taken off from Luneberg airfield, where the ex-P.O.W.'s had been taken on board. Twelve ex-P.O.W.'s were instructed to board the aircraft, but one of these is known not to have boarded the plane, and since 20 bodies were found at the crash, it is calculated that 14 ex-P.O.W.'s boarded the plane.

The remains of 11 American passengers were interred in USMC Neuville-en-Candros, by the 3045 CM Graves Registration Company. Remains of 6 RAF crew members and 3 Unknowns were interred in the Communal Cemetery, Evere, Belgium, Plot 10, Row 31, Graves 6-14 inclusive. Upon joint disinterment with the British Graves Registration Service, the 3 Unknowns were exhumed from graves 6,7,8 in Plot 10, Row 31, British Military Cemetery, Brussels/Evere. The above mentioned Unknowns were assigned the following X-numbers (X-6551, X-6560, X-6561 Neuville-en-Candros)

The British authorities definitely identified the 6 RAF casualties interred at the Communal Cemetery, Evere, Belgium.

Of the 14 American passengers aboard recovered from the wreckage of AC V9169, 4 were identified (Pvt Milton, S/Sgt Wood, Pfc Cirelli, S/Sgt Gohl), the remaining 10 remains were assigned the following X-numbers (X-95, X-96, X-97, X-98, X-99, X-100, X-101, X-6551, X-6560, X-6561). Four of the 10 X-numbers were identified: X-95 as Pfc Carnavale, X-96 as Pfc Panagakos, X-97 as Pfc Price, X-101 as Sgt Haerle. The remaining 6 X-numbers were associated with Pvt Williams, Pvt Nevins, S/Sgt Sanchez and S/Sgt Murray who are the last remaining casualties listed as passengers of AC V9169. Every effort to obtain a complete passenger listing of AC V9169 has proved negative.

Dental information available at this headquarters for all American deceased known to have been killed in the crash of AC V9169 is insufficient to substantiate individual identification of S/Sgt Murray, S/Sgt Sanchez, Pvt Nevins, and Pvt Williams.

All crew members and passengers of AC V9169 are now accounted for.

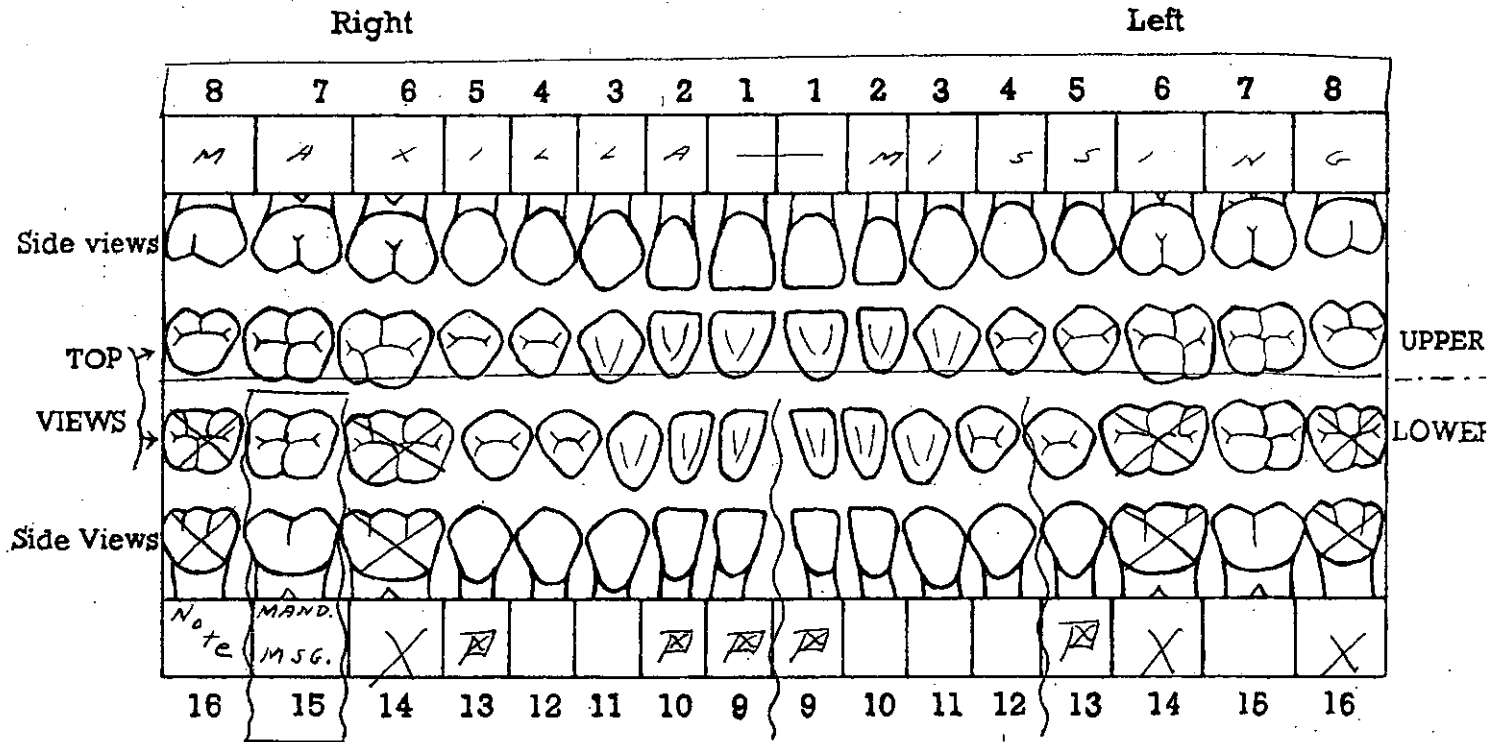

The following remains have been reprocessed this date with an effort to established individual identification of four remains and to effect segregation of two Unknown remains.

1. Individual identification of four individuals was established.
2. Proper segregation of all the remains was effected.

Listed below are the tables of comparison with Forms 371 that were attached with this Reprocessing Order and all other findings.

The teeth that were recovered with this remains are in agreement with 371 Form for SANCHEZ. Mandible articulates with the skull fragments. Vertebral column is continuous and articulates with the occipital condyles of the skull. All other articulations are good. Estimated age was based on the closure of the skull sutures and the epiphysis of all the bones. The skeletal parts graphically represented on chart A-1 are those of one and the same individual.

Teeth were recovered with this remains but no comparison was effected due to the absence of dental data on Forms 371 for NEVINS. The mandible articulates with the skull and the skull with the vertebral column. All other articulations are very good. Lower portion of the trunk is embedded in flesh. Age estimation was based on the epiphysis of all the bones, although, the skull articulates with the vertebral column. Closure of skull sutures are abnormal (retarded stage). The skeletal parts graphically represented on chart A-1 are those of one and the same individual.

No articulation is possible between the skull and the vertebral column (continuous) due to the absence of the occipital condyles. All other articulations are good. Estimated age was based on the closure of the skull sutures and the epiphysis of all the bones. There is evidence of an old healed fracture at the middle portion of the shaft of left humerus. No indication of said fracture was recorded on Form 371 for WILLIAMS. The skeletal parts graphically represented on chart A-1 are those one and the same individual.

The teeth that were recovered with this remains are in agreement with Form 371 for MURRAY. Mandible articulates with the skull and the skull with the vertebral column (continuous). All other articulations are good. Estimated age was based on the epiphysis of all the skeletal parts and the pubic symphysis. Estimated height was based on only one bone measurement. The fact that the right leg with this remains is incomplete it is impossible to verify (broken right leg) recorded on 371 for MURRAY. The skeletal parts graphically represented on chart A-1 are those of one and the same individual.

X-99 (Remains) Approx 22 5'8 7/8" Approx 170 Dk. brown White 10C or D
Teeth were recovered but no comparison is possible as there are only four Forms 371 attached. No articulation is possible between the mandible and the skull due to absence of the head of the mandible, however, the skull articulates with the vertebral column. All other articulations are good. Estimated age was based on the epiphysis of all the bones and the pubic symphysis. The sagittal suture of the skull has begun to close, this indicates that the closure is in an

The remains of eleven (11) American passengers were interred in USMC Neuville-en-Condroz, by the 3045 QM Graves Registration Company. Remains of six (6) RAF crew members and three (3) Unknowns were interred in the Communal Cemetery, Evere, Belgium, Plot 10, Row 31, Graves 6-14 inclusive. Upon joint disinterment with the British Graves Registration Service, the three Unknowns were exhumed from graves 6, 7, 8 in Plot 10, Row 31, British Military Cemetery, Brussels/Evere. The above mentioned Unknowns were assigned the following X-numbers (X-6551, X-6560, X-6561, Neuville-en-Condroz).

The British authorities definitely identified the six RAF casualties interred at the Communal Cemetery, Evere, Belgium.

Of the fourteen American passengers aboard recovered from the wreckage of AC V9169, four were identified (Pvt Milton, S/Sgt Wood, Pfc Cirelli, S/Sgt Gohl), the remaining ten (10) remains were assigned the following X-numbers (X-95, X-96, X-97, X-98, X-99, X-100, X-101, X-6551, X-6560, X-6561). Four of the ten X-numbers were identified: X-95 as Pfc Carnavale, X-96 as Pfc Panagakos, X-97 as Pfc Price, X-101 as Sgt Haerle. The remaining six X-numbers were associated with Pvt Williams, Pvt Nevins, S/Sgt Sanchez and S/Sgt Murray who are the last remaining casualties listed as passengers of AC V9169. Every effort to obtain a complete passenger listing of AC V9169 has proved negative.

Unknown X-99 (this case) was previously included with X-98, X-100, X-6551, X-6560 and X-6561 in a Group Identification as either/or: Pvt Williams, Pvt Nevins, S/Sgt Sanchez, S/Sgt Murray and two Unknowns.

All listed passengers and crew members of aircraft V9169 are thus accounted for.

It has been impossible to determine who the two unlisted passengers may have been. Every effort has been made to make association with which the dental and physical characteristics of X-99 and X-6561 might be compared, with negative results.

Accordingly it is believed that X-99 (this case) and X-6561 must be considered as Unidentifiable.

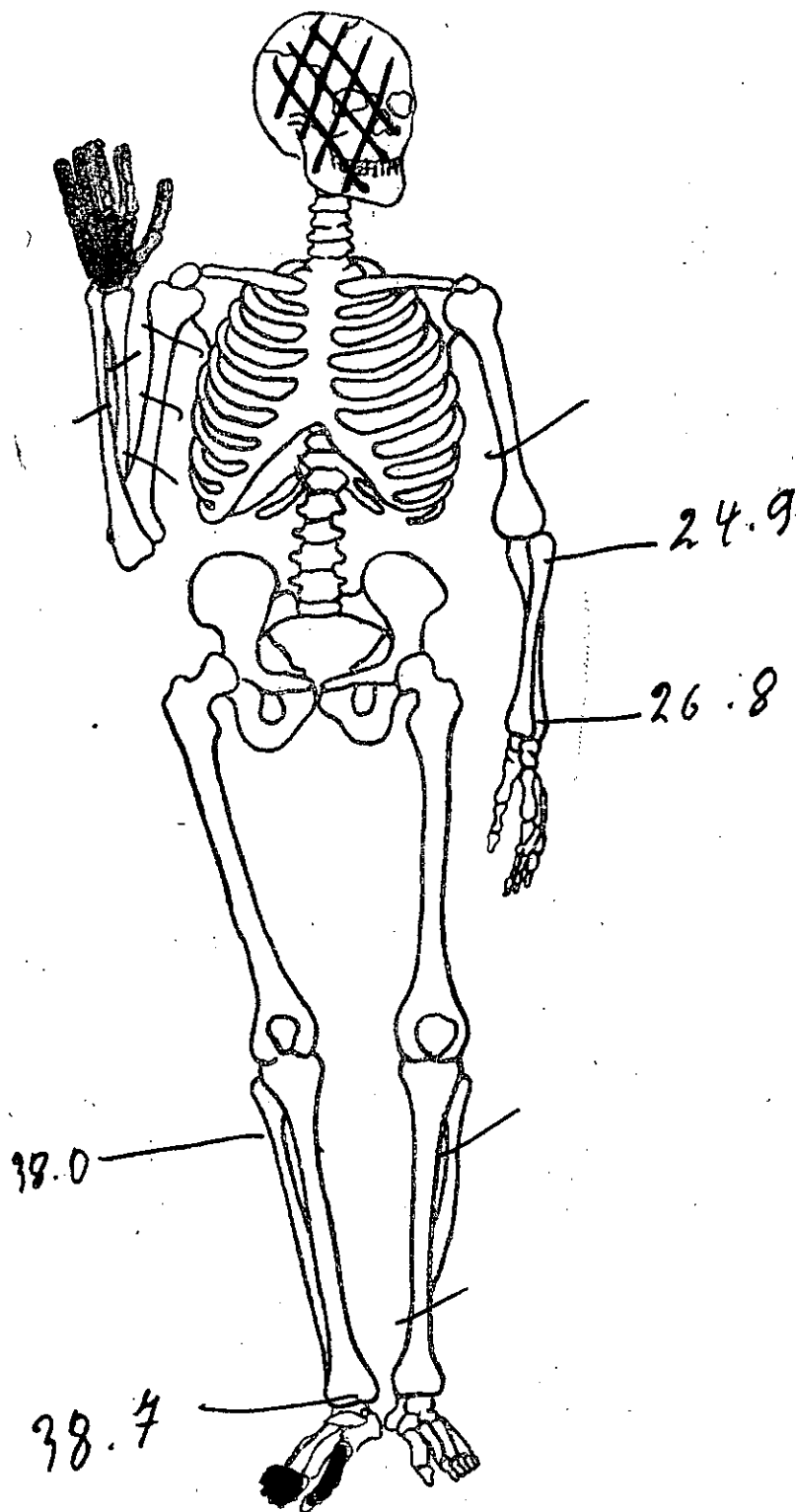

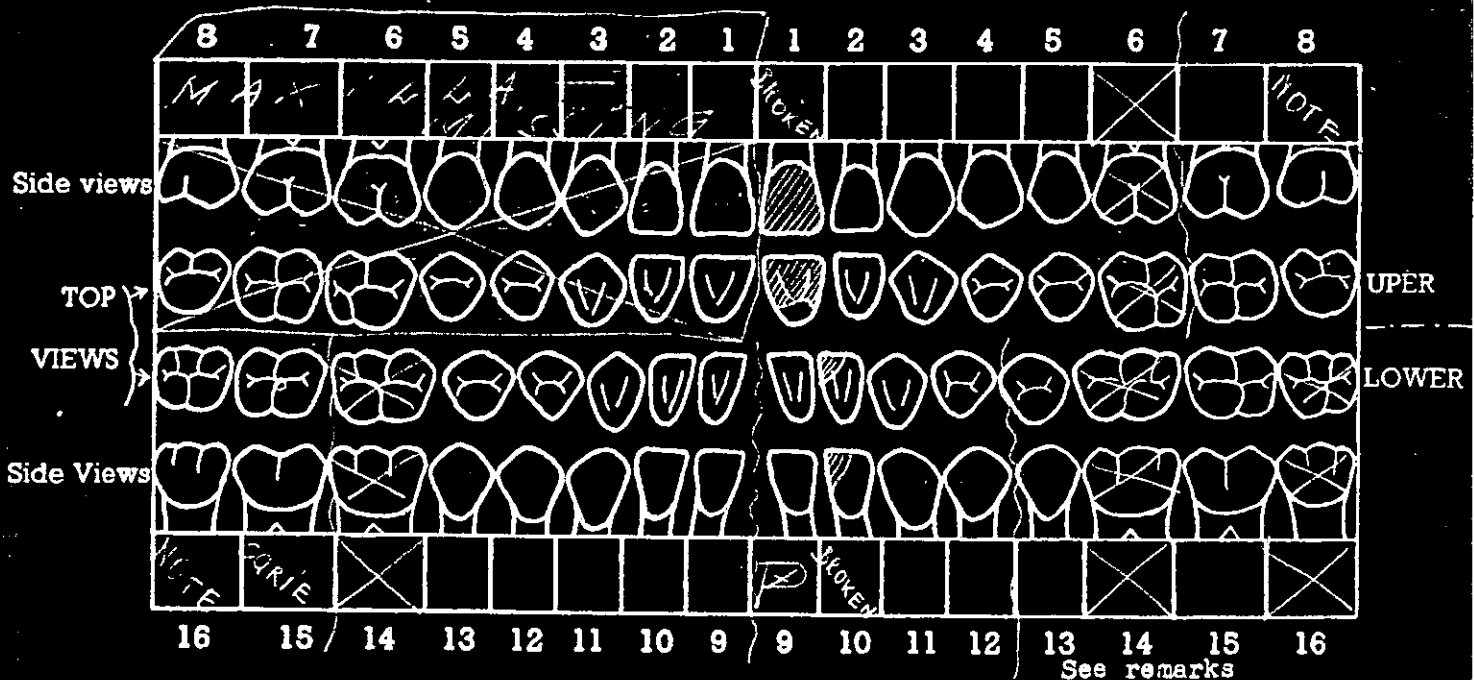
