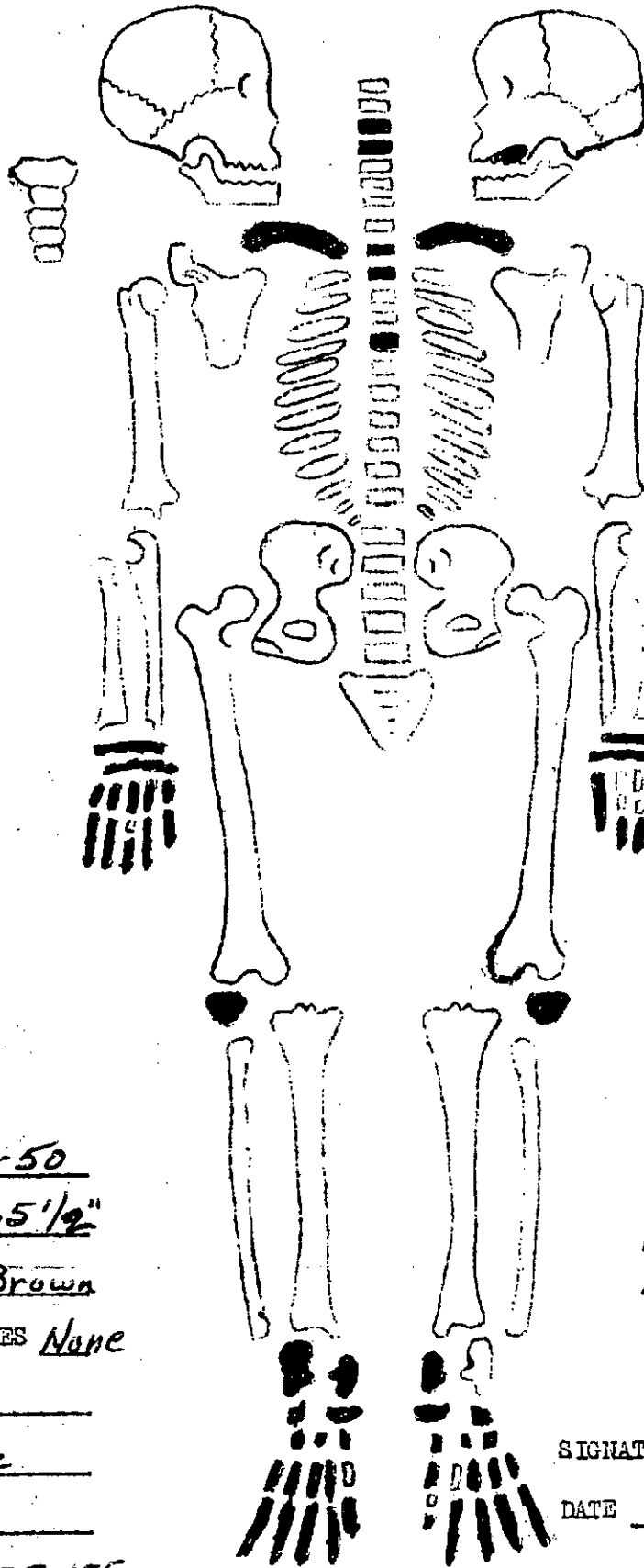

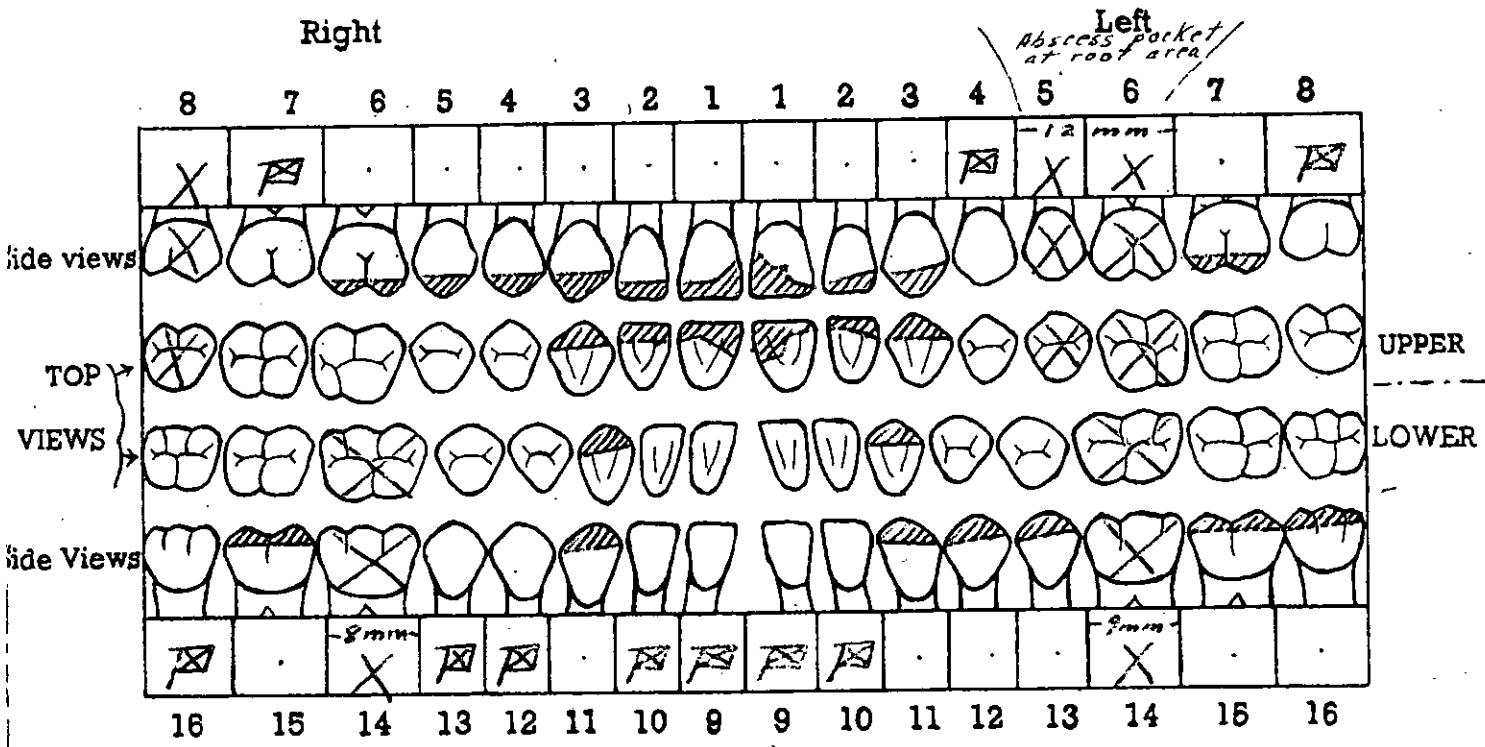

IDENTIFICATION LABORATORY REPORT

REMAINS EXAMINED: X-6346 and X-6347 Neuville.

1. In accordance with DA-QMG-ME message 409426 dated 18 April, the remains designated X-6346 and X-6347 Neuville have been re-examined for possible association with missing casualties Pvt Victor FATTY, 32 732 478, an American Indian and Pvt Andrew S GRZYS, 36 262 997 respectively. Subject casualties were prisoners who died at Stalag IV B at Muhlberg-Elbe, Germany. Pvt FATTY reportedly died as the result of "brain abscess" and Pvt GRZYS reportedly died from "heart failure". Subject remains were recovered from the nearby cemetery at Neuburxdorf where other U.S. deceased prisoners of Stalag IV B were recovered and identified.

2. The results of examination are as follows:

Post-cranial articulation is complete down to the 2d lumbar vertebrae with the exception of the missing 5th cervical vertebra. Similarity of the 4th and 6th cervical vertebrae indicates the vertebral column is for one and the same deceased.

The teeth appear favorable for Pvt FATTY as all teeth were present at time of death. Occlusion is poor as regards the anterior teeth with the mandible protruding 6 mm beyond an edge-to edge bite.

There is a smooth edged aperture (8 mm x 13 mm) opening into the superior border of the frontal air sinus. This healed perforation and the evidence a cranial autopsy had been performed are in agreement with the report that Pvt FATTY died as the result of a "brain abscess".

The facial breadth between the cheek bones is wide in comparison with the parietal width of the skull. These measurements: bi-zygomatic breadth 142 mm
bi-parietal breadth 141 mm

result in a cranio-facial index of 1.01 which, combined with the vertical sides and general "house" form of the skull, compares favorably with characteristics of the American Indian types.

Three (3) photographic views of subject skull are attached hereto showing the "brain abscess" aperture, the cranial autopsy, the malocclusion of the teeth and the racial characteristics.


Post-cranial articulation is incomplete due to the absence of two (2) cervical and three (3) thoracic vertebrae. The similarity of vertebrae which are present and the favorable articulations throughout indicate all portions are for one and the same deceased.

The age and dental characteristics for this casualty are decidedly negative for the given data pertaining to Pvt GRZYS. The teeth are severely abraded in relation to the estimated age of "forty to fifty years". This extent of tooth wear is consistent with observed "slavic" casualties who normally subsist on coarser foods than those found in the normal American diet. There is a large facial pocket in the left maxillary bone in the root area of extracted teeth L 5 and 6 indicating these teeth had been seriously abscessed for a considerable period prior to receiving dental care and extraction. The presence of a very heavy calculus and the generally poor dental condition indicates this is the remains of a non-American casualty.

There are no visible skeletal injuries by which the cause of death could be determined. It is probable that death resulted from a disease contracted prior to or during incarceration at the Stalag camp.

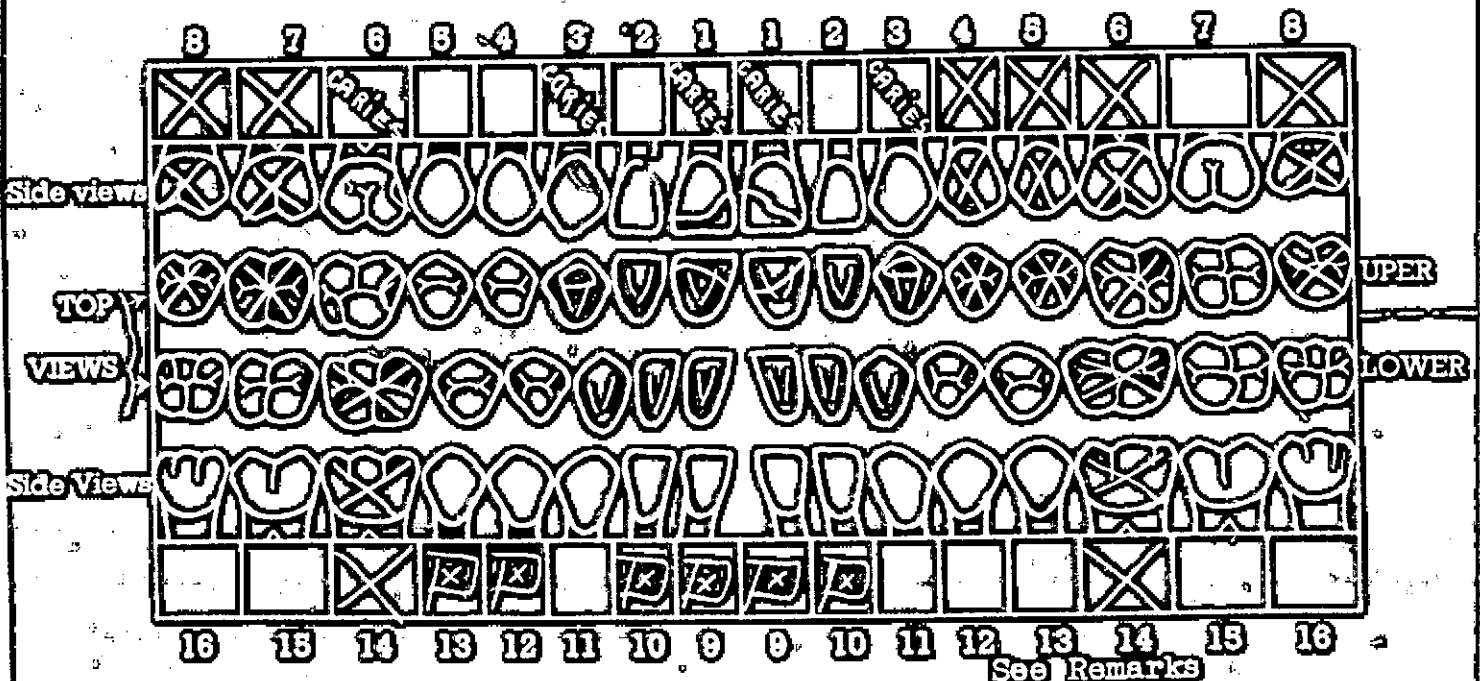



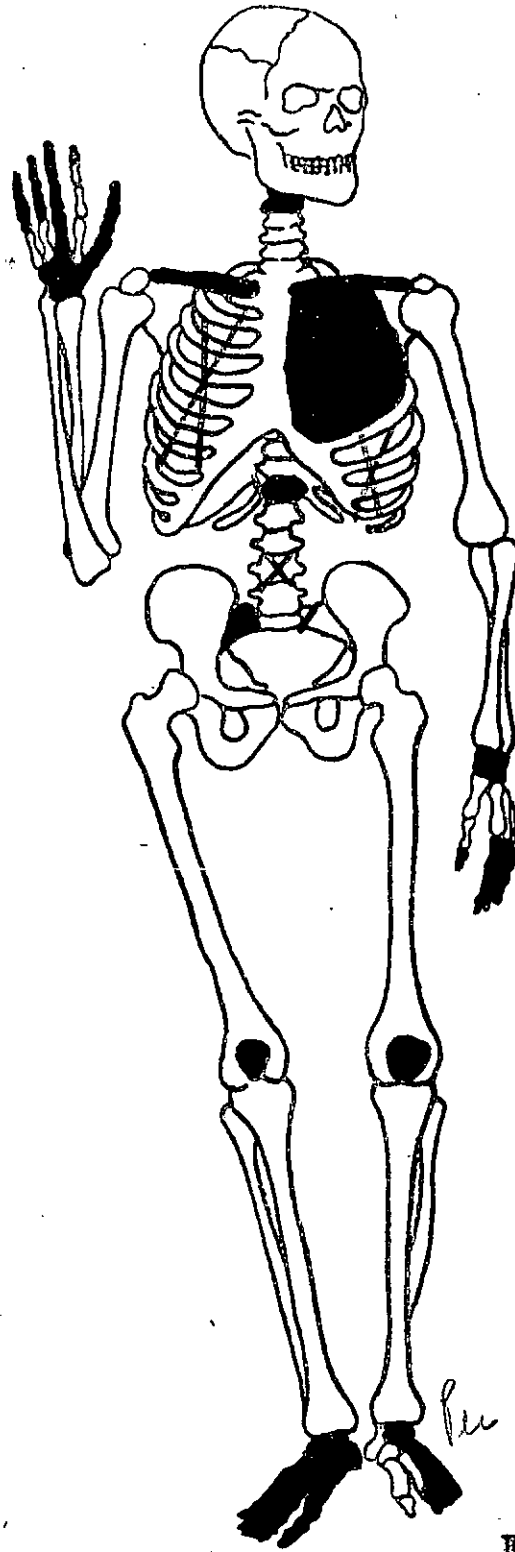

NARRATIVE OF DISINTERMENT

NEUBURXDORF, GERMANY (N 52/B 83; 1/250,000)

7 - 8 th August. Disinterred in the community cemetery (Prisoner-of-War Section) of Neuburxdorf, Sachsen Province. The remains of twenty-eight deceased were disinterred.

The graves were located as shown on the attached sketch. We could not take the graves in order in the disinterring as it would have caused too many cave-ins. It was found that the basic documents listing the deceased by name, Stalag serial number, date of death, and grave number proved to be one hundred percent accurate. Of the total exhumations from the cemetery, sixteen were identified by dog-tags, every name agreeing with the cemetery records as to the number of the grave. Graves number 580, 582, 586, 620, 618 had no bodies in them. The boxes were still there but the German laborers stated that the British Team which had been there before us had disinterred the bodies in those graves. We made sure there were no remains in these graves or in the boxes which were in the graves by a very thorough examination of them all. The tops of the coffins had been smashed in and each of the five showed evidence of having contained bodies. In one, some hair still remained. We raised the coffins and dug under them without finding any trace of the bodies.

Although we had nothing in our records on graves 583 and 590, the cemetery records showed that Americans were buried in both graves. According to the cemetery records, grave 583 had an unknown American and grave 590 an American named Frank Gregory (Note: AGRC Cas. Lists contain no person by that name).

All of the remains were in fair condition with the exception of that in grave 622 (Victor Fatty) which was not buried in a box, and grave 593 (Lawrence Denson) which was under water.

We were quite positive that the British 56th Graves Concentration Unit had three American deceased and possibly two more, which are listed as unknown Americans on the cemetery records. The former mentioned three (3) deceased are as follows:

Graves No. 618 and 620 were also listed as unknown Americans on the cemetery records but have been previously evacuated with the above mentioned bodies.

After the team returned from the field to Berlin we payed a visit to the British 56th Graves Concentration Unit and explained the case of the five bodies which we believed them to have disinterred. They in turn opened their complete Neuburxdorf files for us. These files stated that they had disinterred forty-seven (47) British remains from this cemetery and that all the remains had also been identified. There was nothing in their records to show that they had had anything to do with the graves in question.


After leaving the British 56th Graves Concentration Unit we went to the French Bureau of Displaced Persons, Berlin-Halensee, to find out they had disinterred these remains by mistake. Here we found that the French have had no teams in Neuburxdorf as yet.

Another investigation will be made on this case in an endeavor to find out what became of these remains in question.
