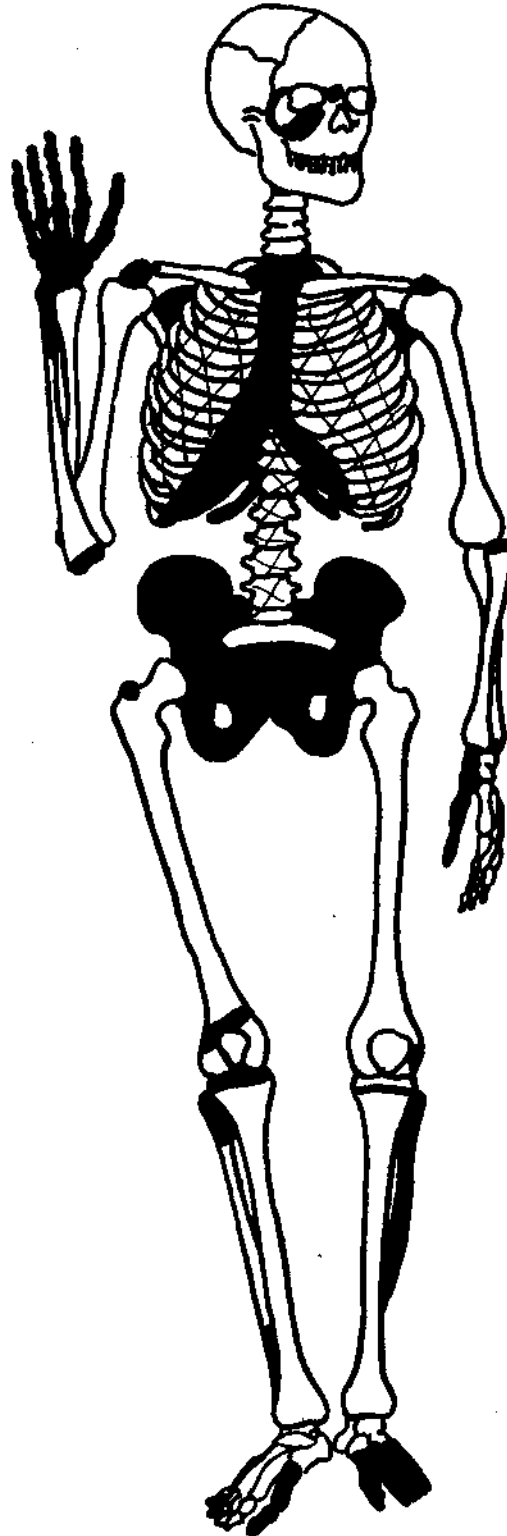


REMARKS:

Sub: Statement of Ramon Parollon Concerning two Philippine Scouts.

I, Ramon Parollon, Municipal police of Tankulan, Baluko, Bukidnon, P.I., voluntarily gave all informations and verification concerning the two Philippine scouts who died during the Japanese landing in Mindanao. As a reserved of the Philippine Army and was also inducted into the USAFFE I was stationed in Dalirig during the year 1942 August of that year. While I was patrolling in this locality, I happened to passed the bamboo tree where I saw three bodies one American and two Filipinos both were members of the Philippine Scouts. I was about five paces from the dead and that I could recognize them clearly. The American has a light brown hair and the body was upside down. The head towards the north and khaki uniform. The two Filipino Scouts was just in the opposite side. These men died May 9, 1942 under the Japanese three days after I was sent on patrol. I didn't touch the bodies because they were already in bad condition. I should have reported this to the Americans who came here first but I thought they don't look for the Philippine Scouts not until T/Sgt. Tangente who explain me the real meaning of all US Army personnel including the Philippine Scouts. So after he has explained to me everything clearly I directed him and his team to the exact location where these men was recovered at 1100 September 19, 1947.



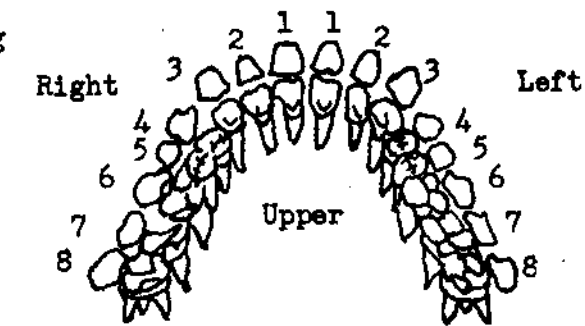
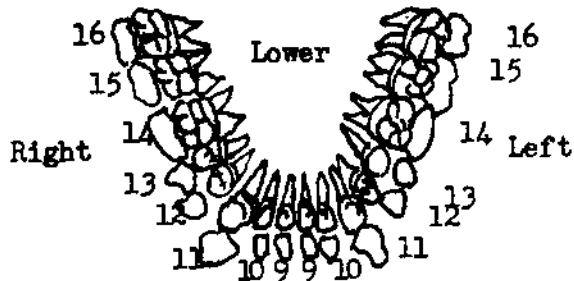


Diagram represents the mouth wide open



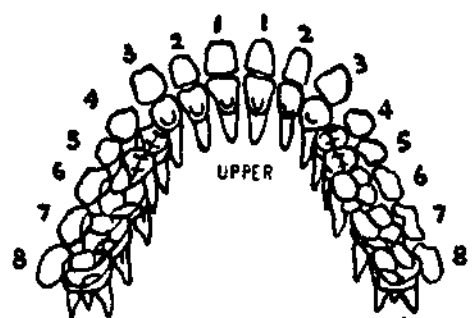
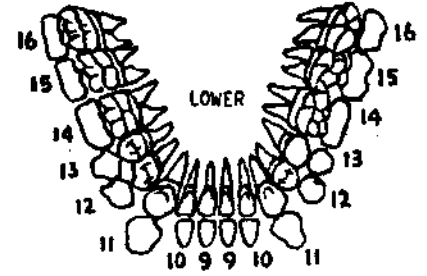


DIAGRAM REPRESENTS THE MOUTH WIDE OPEN
