

1. The following findings are the results of investigation conducted by this Headquarters as requested in basic communication:

a. Only the remains of T/Sgt. Charles N. Witham were positively identified during recovery and initial interment based on the decedent's identification card. According to Mr. Josue R. De Jose, T/Sgt. Witham died as a result of a fall as his parachute failed to open. Mr. De Jose further stated that the body of T/Sgt. Witham was buried in an individual grave while those of 1st Lt. William R. Hunter and the two others (2nd Lt. Robert D. Dawkins and T/Sgt. Merle E. Wilson) were buried in a common grave. Our letter of inquiry dated 9 March 1950, and the reply thereto by Mr. De Jose are enclosed herewith for your further reference.

b. An examination of the identification tags now with the remains in question reveals that they are not original tags but cemetery tags only. However, it could not be definitely ascertained where they were prepared.

c. Further efforts to locate the 8th Indorsement, dated 22 February 1945, referred to in paragraph 3c of basic letter, have been exerted with negative results.

d. A review of available records indicates that the remains now stored T/Sgt. Wilson are actually the same as those recovered as Unknown X-17, USAF Cemetery Bacolod No. 1. Copies of original ROI and Reports of Reinterment pertaining to these remains are also herewith enclosed.

e. The remains now stored as T/Sgt. Wilson were reprocessed by the Anthropologist. The reprocessing data for these remains definitely do not compare favorably with data on OCMG Form 371 for T/Sgt. Wilson. The only favorable factor present is the agreement in age. Age shown on Form 371 is 33 years and attached new OMC Form 1044 indicates age ranging from 30 to 40 years.

2. In view of the above findings, your concurrence is therefore requested in either of the two courses of action mentioned in our

Our letter of inquiry dated 9 March 1950, and the reply thereto by Mr. De Jose are enclosed herewith for your further reference.

b. An examination of the identification tags now with the remains in question reveals that they are not original tags but cemetery tags only. However, it could not be definitely ascertained where they were prepared.

c. Further efforts to locate the 8th Indorsement, dated 22 February 1945, referred to in paragraph 3c of basic letter, have been exerted with negative results.

d. A review of available records indicates that the remains now stored T/Sgt. Wilson are actually the same as those recovered as Unknown X-17, USAN Cemetery Basecol No. 1. Copies of original ROI and Reports of Reinterment pertaining to these remains are also herewith enclosed.

e. The remains now stored as T/Sgt. Wilson were reprocessed by the Anthropologist. The reprocessing data for these remains definitely do not compare favorably with data on OASG Form 371 for T/Sgt. Wilson. The only favorable factor present is the agreement in age. Age shown on Form 371 is 33 years and attached new OASG Form 1044 indicates age ranging from 30 to 40 years.

2. In view of the above findings, your concurrence is therefore requested in either of the two (2) courses of action mentioned in our
