Records of AGO indicate that Pfc. Troy B. Lusby was killed in action 25 October 1944 in the South West Pacific.

On 25 October 1944 an LCS with Pfc. Lusby a member of a combat patrol of 12 embarked at Tacloban, Leyte Province, P.I., on a mission to proceed northermost edge of Leyte then south to Leyte along a trail paralleling the strait.

Lt. Col. William L. Kerr, Adjutant General, HQ 1st Cav. Division states: "-----Our craft was heading north up San Juanico Strait at an approximate distance of 4 to 5 miles north of Tacloban-----An enemy plane circling to our rear dived on us and hit the craft squarely amidship with a bomb-----Pfc. Lusby and a medical aid man, as best I can remember at the time the bomb struck, were standing in the passenger well, at very nearly the exact point of impact of the bomb.-----Pfc. Lusby was never seen after the bomb struck-----In my opinion, under the circumstances there is not the remotest possibility that Pfc. Lusby could have survived this incident.

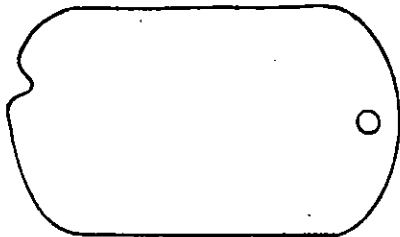

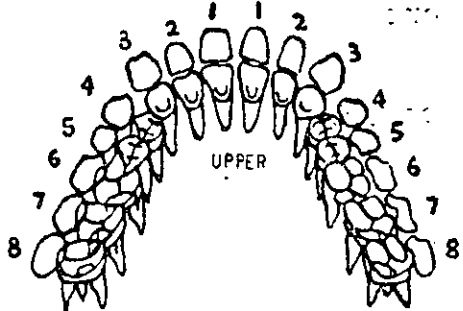
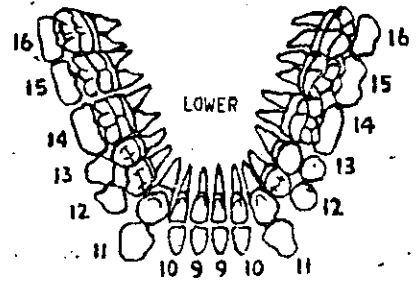


DIAGRAM REPRESENTS THE MOUTH WIDE OPEN

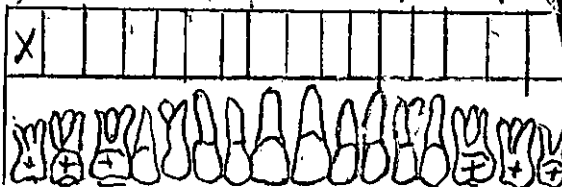

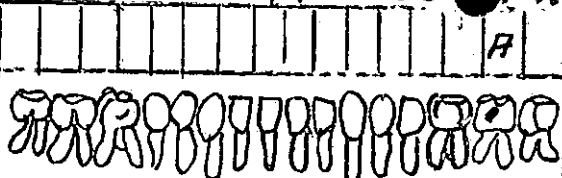
