1. The remains now designated Unknown X-6730-A, USMC St Avold, were segregated from the remains identified as Sgt Harold J. WATTS, 16 038 750, previously recovered from a common grave at Furth, Germany, containing the remains of Capt Robert J. MOLLOY, O 797 044, Sgt Joseph DRAVECKY, 13 003 267, and T/Sgt Joseph T. FACILLA, 32 429 506, all crew members of A/C #42-97526, which crashed near Furth, Germany, 25 February 1944. The aforementioned decedents are the only casualties of A/C #42-97526 and their identity approved by radio, your Office, DA 22065, dated 2 March 1951. Cemetery records at Furth, Germany, indicate that only crew members of A/C #42-97526 were interred in the cemetery.

2. The remains of X-6730-A could not be consolidated with the casualties of A/C #42-97526, nor can they be associated with any other American casualty.

3. In view of the foregoing, it is requested that this headquarters be granted permission to assign a CIL designation to X-6730-A, St Avold.

4. All action on subject case is suspended pending reply from your Office.

1. Paragraph 3 of letter dated 7 March 1951, File GROP 200 2, Subject: Identification of World War II Deceased, from Headquarters, 7887 GRD, Operations Detachment, Liege, requested permission to assign CIL designation to X-6730-A, St. Avold, France.
2. Remains of four deceased Americans were recovered from a common grave in the Civilian Cemetery, Furth, Germany, evacuated to the USMC St. Avold, France, and designated Unknowns X-6372, X-6495, X-6567, X-6730-A and X-6730-B. Unknowns X-6372 and X-6567 were identified in the field as two of the four deceased members of the crew of aircraft B-17C-42-97526 and accepted by COMBAT.
3. Unknowns X-6495, X-6730-A, X-6730-B, and the remains of the two previously identified deceased were reprocessed simultaneously by an anthropologist, 24 Oct 50. Identity of the two previously identified deceased was verified. Unknowns X-6495 and X-6730-B were identified as the two remaining casualties of subject aircraft and approved by this Office.
4. The remains of Unknown X-6730-A were segregated from the remains of one of the identified deceased but could not be consolidated with the remaining three casualties of the aircraft or associated with any other American casualty.
5. CIL designation of X-6730-A, St. Avold, has been approved by this Office.

1. Reference is made to Unknowns X-6495 and X-6730A and B, St. Avold, reprocessed 8 December 1949 under Exhumation Order #2848.
2. Report of anthropologist and narrative of technician indicate identification of X-6495 and X-6730 A as Sgts. Joseph Dravecky 13003267 and Harold J. Watts 16038750, respectively, the two unresolved casualties of A/C 42-97526.
3. A review of data for X-6495 appears to confirm identification as Sgt. Dravecky, although articulation between the skull and vertebral column is impossible because of missing vertebrae. In the case of X-6730 A, however, the fragmentary nature of the remains, the lack of articulating points and dental features seem to preclude individual identification as Sgt. Watts.
4. Enemy records disclose the interment of the casualties of A/C 42-97526 in Furth Cemetery. In view of the fact that Unknowns X-6730 A and B, X-6495 and two identified crew members of this craft were recovered from a common grave in Furth Cemetery, which was marked with the names of the casualties of this plane, it is requested that these cases be reinvestigated and, if warranted, that Field Board Findings be submitted to this Office at the earliest practicable date.



In compliance with Examination Order 3388 and Letter GMMT 293 dated 27 June 1950, the remains listed thereon were reprocessed and the following results are submitted:

Proper segregation was effected and portions of Unknown X-6730 A were consolidated within the group. GIL #3923 consisted of a right radius and the proximal 1/4 of a right humerus. The right radius was consolidated with Unknown 6730 B. (See skeletal chart)

1. Paragraph 3 of letter dated 7 March 1951, File GROF 200.2, Subject: Identification of World War II Deceased, from Headquarters, 7887 GRD, Operations Detachment, Liege, requested permission to assign CIL designation to X-6730-A, St. Avold, France.

2. Remains of four deceased Americans were recovered from a common grave in the Civilian Cemetery, Furth, Germany, evacuated to the USMC St. Avold, France, and designated Unknowns X-6372, X-6495, X-6567, X-6730-A and X-6730-B. Unknowns X-6372 and X-6567 were identified in the Field as two of the four deceased members of the crew of aircraft B-17G-42-97526 and accepted by OQMG.

3. Unknowns X-6495, X-6730-A, X-6730-B, and the remains of the two previously identified deceased were reprocessed simultaneously by an anthropologist, 24 Oct 50. Identity of the two previously identified deceased was verified. Unknowns X-6495 and X-6730-B were identified as the two remaining casualties of subject aircraft and approved by this Office.

4. The remains of Unknown X-6730-A were segregated from the remains of one of the identified deceased but could not be consolidated with the remaining three casualties of the aircraft or associated with any other American casualty.

5. CIL designation of X-6730-A, St. Avold, has been approved by this Office.

1. Investigations conducted at Furth, Germany resulted in the recovery of five remains. To date two of these cases have been identified as crew members of A/C # 42-97526. The MACR for the subject air-craft indicates a total of four casualties, thus leaving two of the crew members, Sgts WATTIS and DRAVECKY, in an unresolved casualty status.

2. Simultaneous reprocessing of the five remains was ordered, in an effort to determine whether one of the unknowns could be consolidated; however, this action proved negative. Unknowns X-6730 A and X-6495 were associated, by the Anthropologist who assisted in the reprocessing, with Sgts WATTIS and DRAVECKY respectively; nevertheless, it is the opinion of this office that the evidence contained in the cases on Unknowns X-6730 A and X-6495 does not permit identification.

3. All efforts to associate another air-craft with the Furth area, to clarify the presence of the fifth remains, have been unsuccessful.

4. In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that the cases on Unknowns X-6730 A & B and X-6495 be declared UNIDENTIFIABLE.

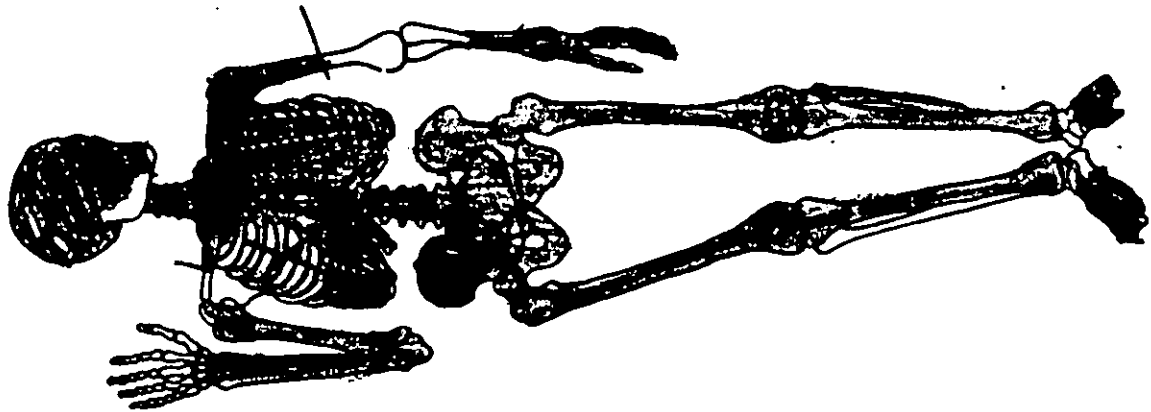

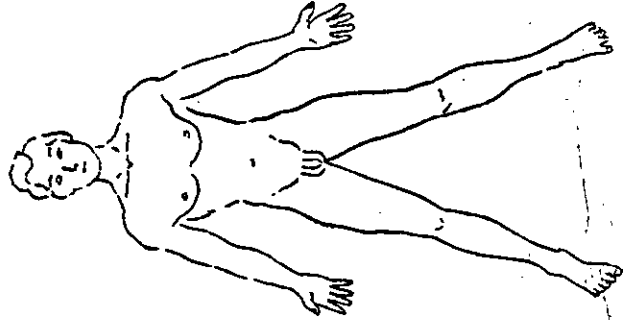

NARRATIVE OF SEGREGATION

CONCERNING CASE X-6730 A B & C.

Upon reprocessing case X-6730, E.O. 788, parts of three remains were found. Case X-6730 was segregated into case X-6730 A, B and C. Segregation was possible because of difference in size and structure of the bones. The temporary wooden cross had "X-6730" stencilled three times.

The teeth were common among the remains (See tooth chart) Clothing was common among the remains. Two skull found were common among the remains. The teeth, clothing and skull were reburied with case A. One skull measured 20 1/8". Only part of the other skull was found, no measurement was possible.

Report of Burial found, no GRS Tags.

No evidence of old or healed fractures or amputations found,
