REMARKS:

1. A thorough investigation has been conducted in an effort to associate the remains of X-1510 with an individual known to have died in the vicinity of Machtilshausen, Germany, however, the condition of the remains prevented an association by physical or dental records comparison. It is to be further noted that the case papers do not furnish any information that could be used as a clue to identity.


2. In view of the negative results of the investigation mentioned above, it is recommended that this case be declared Unidentifiable.

3. Report of Burial for X-1510 states that subject unknown was buried with the remains of Kelly, Victor T., O-734469, however, Kelly was recovered from the civilian cemetery at Stangenroth, Germany. X-1509 identified as Grover, Richard S. a casualty crew member with Kelly was recovered from Stangenroth, Germany, therefore it is believed that the statement on Report of Burial for X-1510 is erroneous and should pertain to X-1509.

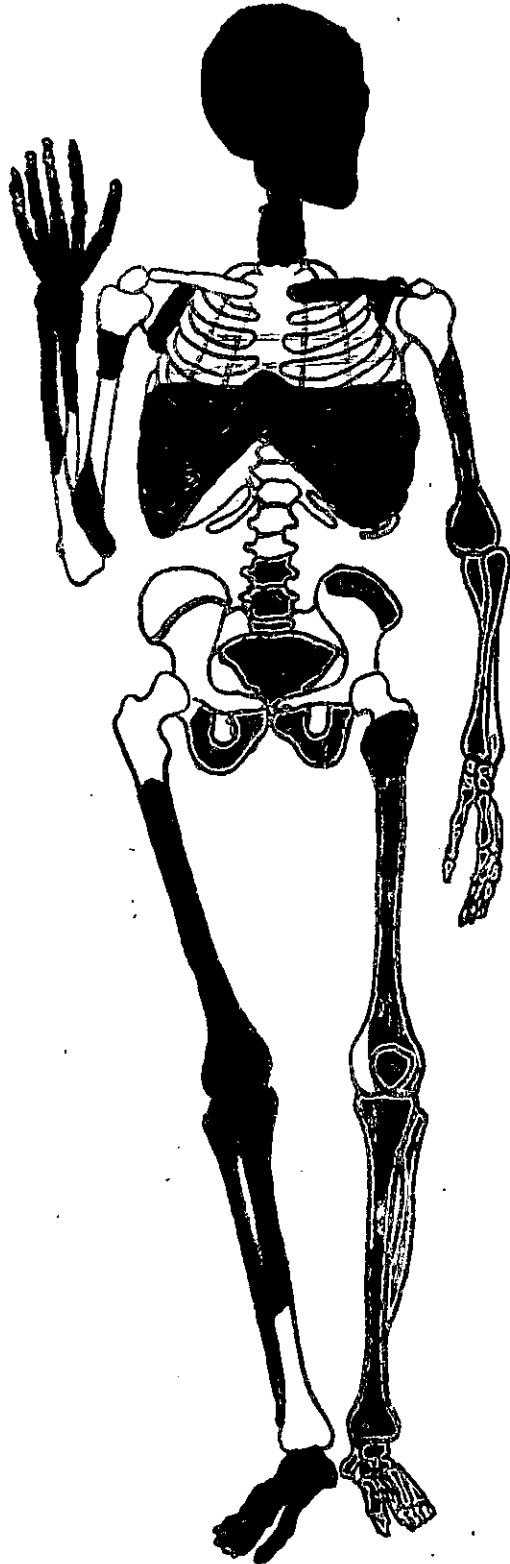

REMARKS:

1. A thorough investigation has been conducted in an effort to associate the remains of X-1510 with an individual known to have died in the vicinity of Magtilshausen, Germany, however, the condition of the remains prevented an association by physical or dental records comparison. It is to be further noted that the case papers do not furnish any information that could be used as a clue to identity.


2. In view of the negative results of the investigation mentioned above, it is recommended that this case be declared Unidentifiable.

3. Report of Burial for X-1510 states that subject unknown was buried with the remains of Kelly, Victor T., O-734469, however, Kelly was recovered from the civilian cemetery at Stangenroth, Germany. 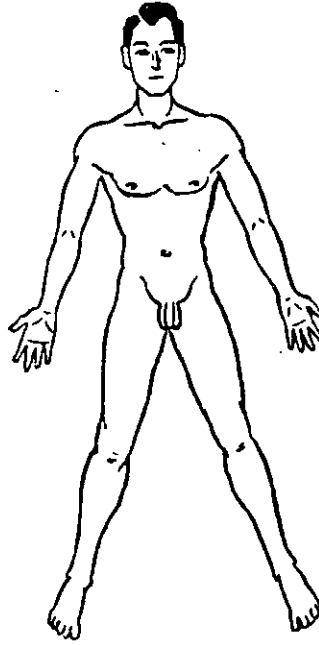

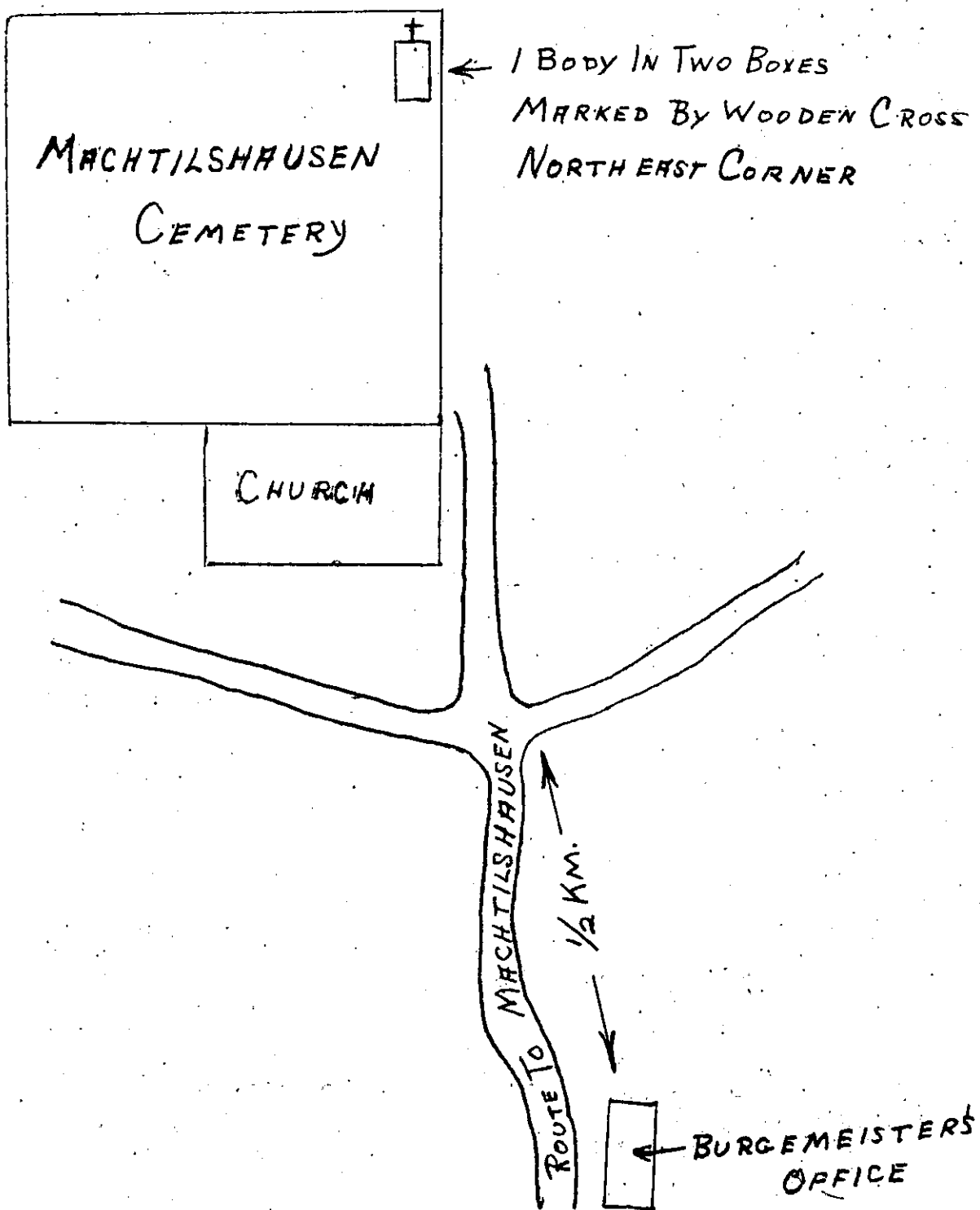

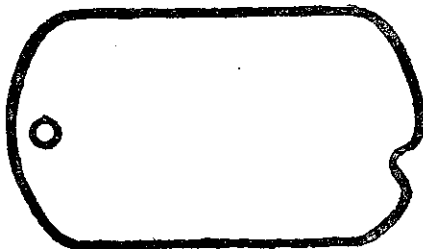
