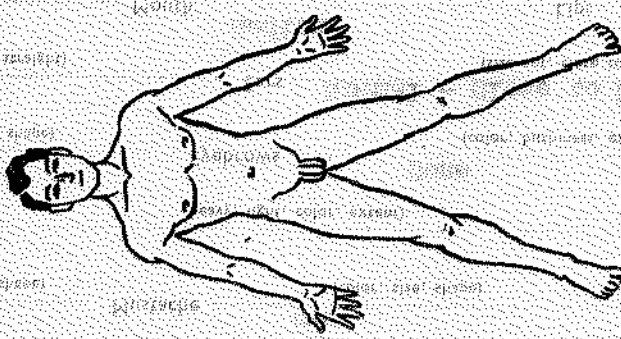

When I picked up these two bodies in the Main river, they had absolutely no clothing on excepting a pair of shorts on one body, a wrist watch on the other.

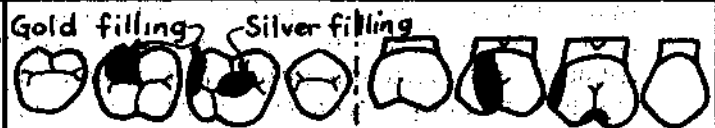

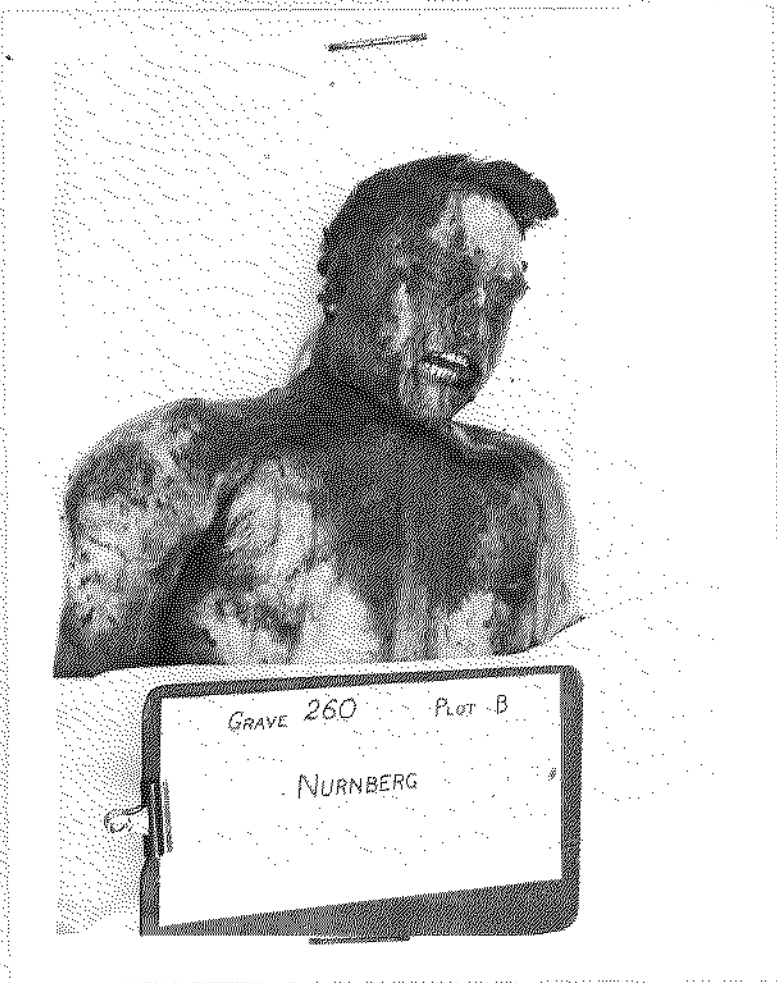

26-11-0 1. The load list attached to the Report of Burial of Unknown X-7, U. S. Military Cemetery at Nurnberg, Germany, shows that Oscar Deloney, 32892560, buried in Plot B, Row 6, Grave 138, was evacuated from the Main River at Rothenfels, Germany at the same time as Unknown X-7. It is possible that both of the deceased soldiers were assigned to the same organization.

2. A report should be made to this headquarters of the extent of decomposition of the remains of Deloney and Unknown X-7. Could the date of death of both Deloney and Unknown X-7 possibly be the same rather than a month apart as reported? If the extent of decomposition cannot be determined by the personnel who had evacuated and prepared the remains for burial, the bodies should be disinterred.

3. "Place of Death" on the Report of Burial of Deloney should be corrected with an asterisk and a statement to the effect that the body was picked up from the Main River at Rothenfels, Germany but that it may have floated down to that point from up-stream. Letter of correction indicating change as to place of death should be forwarded to this headquarters in sufficient copies to accompany each copy of the Report of Burial.

1. Attention is invited to the attached Report of Burial of Unknown X-7, U. S. Military Cemetery No. 1, Nurnberg, Germany. The remains of Unknown X-7 and Oscar Deloney, 32892560, were both recovered from the Main River at Rothenfels, Germany.

2. It is requested that action be taken to determine if Unknown X-7 can be identified as a former member of your command. He wore a wedding ring on which was inscribed "G.F. 22-12-39". Another outstanding characteristic was a gold tooth, number 1 upper left.

3. If, after all clues have been carefully examined, it should be determined that Unknown X-7 was not a former member of your command, it is requested that the place and date that Oscar Deloney was last seen be furnished with all information which will indicate whether or not any other persons, whether soldiers or civilians, Americans, Allies, or enemy could have been drowned in the same area at about the same time.

STATEMENT

We, the undersigned, definitely recall seeing the remains of UNKNOWN X-7 and OSCAR DELONEY, 32892560 brought to the cemetery and laid on the stripping platform side by side. The remains were later separated, X-7 going to the morgue and OSCAR DELONEY being buried. Both remains were in the same state of decomposition, the flesh being very soft and jelly-like.

The discrepancy in dates of death given on the Emergency Medical Tags for these two remains was caused by the fact that the two remains became separated and remains in the condition of these two makes an accurate estimate of death nearly impossible.

It is highly possible that both parties may have met death at approximately the same time.

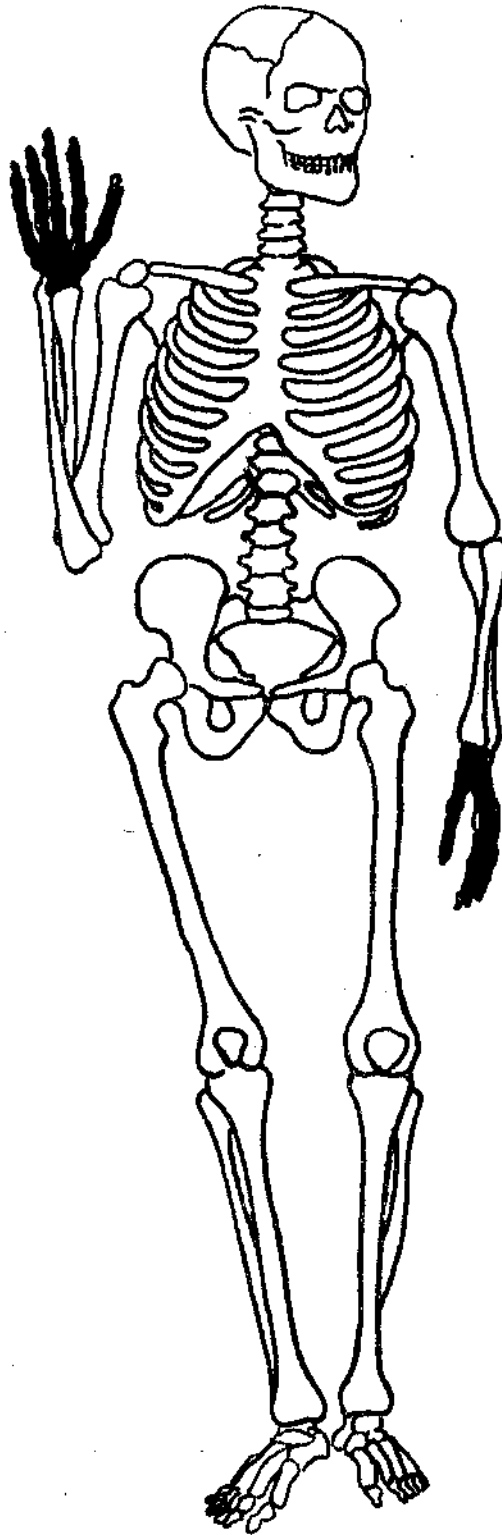
