1. The unidentified body was found floating down stream of the Danube River in the vicinity of Plattling, Germany (Coordinates 700 383, Sheet V-7 Straubing, 1:100,000) by a civilian (Albert Wuncsrn, House No. 35, Stephansposching, Germany) on 1 September 1945.

2. There is no positive information that the body is that of an American soldier, but the civilians contacted could not identify him as anyone in the immediate locality; therefore, turned him over to the American authorities. At present no further information can be obtained to aid in identifying the body.

3. AC of S, G-2, 83d Infantry Division has contacted all units up and down the river in vicinity through XII Corps but has received no information that would lead to identification.

4. Request the above mentioned body be finger printed and accepted for burial.
