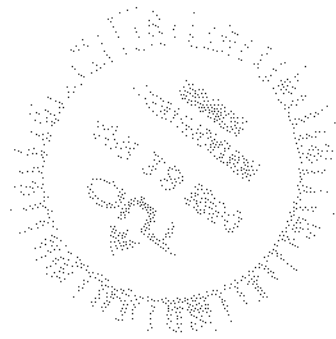

U.S. MILITARY CEMETERY St Avold, France

The remains now designated Unknown X-535 (USMC St Avold) were recovered from the forest in the vicinity of Reipertswiller, France. Tooth chart obtained for X-535 has been compared with dental data available for casualties reported in this area with negative results. Laundry markings "C-5156", "M-7143", "G-5156", "B-5953" and "B" or "R-5187" could not be associated with any casualty reported missing in France. An attempt was made to associate these remains with a casualty by using the address found with remains but this proved negative. In view of the aforementioned factors these remains are being declared UNIDENTIFIABLE.
