This service has taken off about 10 bodies, either Americans, or Germans.

This service told me they will come again to take the bodies I still knew, but never they came back.

In the course, I have found an other grave, which ~~seems~~ seems to be an American one, easily known by a heap of uniforms.

I have found this grave in September 1945.

I can't say who has done the burial, and if the dog-tag is always on the body.

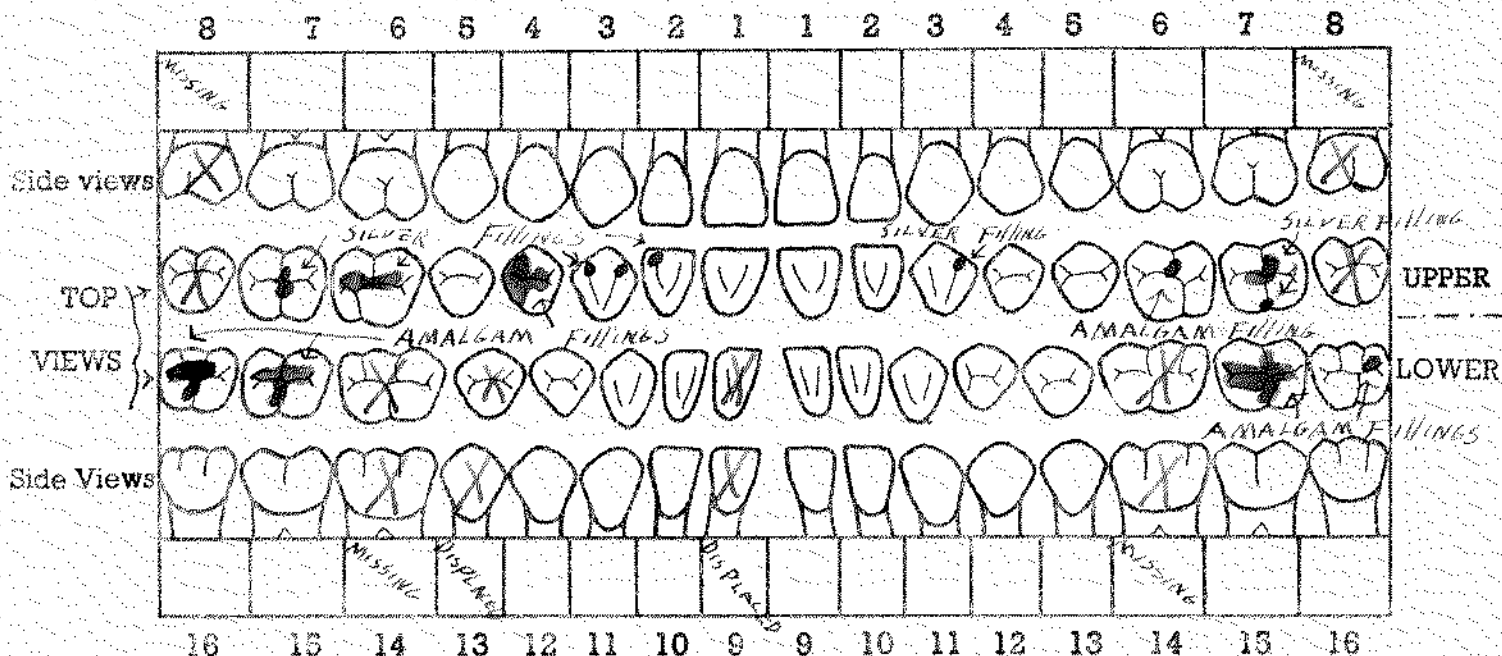



This dental chart is very important and should be filled in with great care. There are 32 teeth to be accounted for, as shown by the numbers on the chart. Beginning at the middle line in both upper and lower jaws, the teeth are arranged symmetrically on either side and classed as incisors (cutting teeth), cuspids or canines (tearing teeth), bicuspids (chewing teeth), and molars (principal chewing teeth). An examination should be made and findings charted to cover the following basic conditions: Lost teeth, crowned teeth, bridge work, fillings, caries (cavities of decay), dentures (plates), and any deformity of jaws found. 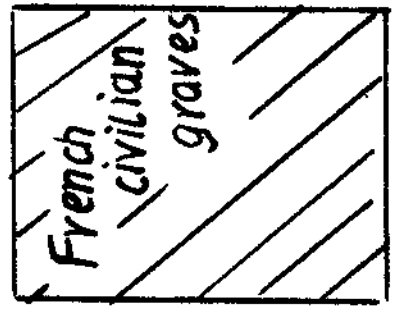
